A New Monthly Column with Quilting Tips!

Quilt — where are you: (a column of suggestions for quilters at any stage of life)

Gala Damato suggested that since I talked so long at the February Day meeting and didn't get to ask people their ideas on how to cope with age-related limitations, a substitute might be a recurring section of the Newsletter with tips from everyone. We will try it, and I would love to have input from lots of people. If you have something to share, please send your tips to me, **Kitty Tully**, at kittully@hotmail.com, or phone me at **757-851-8726**. I will appreciate your help.

Gala suggests: Join a Bee and/or go to Courthouse Way Recreation Center on Thursdays where tables are set up on which to sandwich quilts (she doesn't like to crawl around on the floor anymore to do that job).

My suggestions are: Make sure your lighting is good; do what you love; change your blade often; try cutting while sitting down using a small table set up at its lowest level. The one I love sells at Walmart for \$20 and is also useful for pressing until you get to really large sections; and, try going to retreats. You get large periods of quilting time, social time and no one asking you to make dinner.

Gretchen Martin suggests: Use bright fabrics because you can see the colors better; use fabric with busy patterns because it hides errors; batch work; spray starch on scraps and use a slotted ruler to cut squares; and, throw out leftovers.

For young or inexperienced quilters: Take advantage of local workshops to get to know Guild members, and also to pick up pointers on how to quilt. Isobel's quilt classes from Newport News Parks and Recreation would be another source to learn your skills and also meet other quilters.

Here's the final set of instructions showing how the blocks are to be put together! Completed quilt top is due at the March 2020 PPQG Quilt meeting. Remember, you only need to have the top completed, it doesn't have to be quilted and or have a binding.

I want to thank everyone that has hung in there and made it this point. Congratulations, I hope you enjoy your quilt as much as I will enjoy mine.



9. Layer and baste the backing, batting and quilt top.

10. Quilt as desired. Bind the quilt with the 2½-inch focal fabric strips.

PPQG Service Projects

Each year PPQG members participate in small service projects. Our current projects include:

For CHKD

- Comfort quilts for babies in CHKD NICU that get to go home but don't have a good prognosis. You can use bright, happy fabrics and a good size is 30 x 36.
- Bereavement quilts in soft, muted colors approximately 26 x 26 in size.
- Fabric hearts for babies in NICU can be made with cotton or flannel.
- Throw size quilts for teens with cancer made with cheerful, fun fabric. A good size is 40 x 60 but can be smaller or larger.

For Riverside Hospital

- Baby quilts for families with a need at Riverside. A good size is 30 x 36.
- Fabric hearts for babies in NICU at Riverside can be made of cotton or flannel.
- Throw size quilts for Riverside Hospice "No One Dies Alone" program. A good size is 40 x 60 but can be smaller. Most patients are elderly. The quilts will be given to family or friends following the passing of the patient along with journal notes made by volunteers.

Turn in completed projects at the Guild meetings. Joan Kelly will collect at the Day Chapter meetings. Candy Byrd will collect at the Night Chapter meetings.

PPQG Day Chapter Minutes Feb. 14, 2020

The Day Chapter meeting was called to order at 10 a.m. by our Day Coordinator, Rita Crawford. We opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance. We had 85 members present and one guest (Theresa Hawkins).

Minutes - Carol Richardson made a motion to accept the January minutes as published; Pat McGough seconded, and the motion carried.

Treasurer's Report - Jeanne Surber made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report for audit; Debbie Moore seconded; motion carried.

Announcements

President's Report - Jeanne Surber called for a vote to accept previously presented, 2020 Budget. The budget was approved with only one opposition vote. Jeanne announced that Candy Byrd had agreed to take over the Service Projects for the Night Chapter and Joan Kelly agreed to help with the Day Chapter. Jeanne said that we were still in need of a Day Program Chairman and Carol Richardson volunteered to serve. Jeanne reminded us that the Nominating Committee will be seeking candidates to serve for the upcoming year and to please consider any position if they approached you. Try not to respond with an automatic no, but really consider serving our Guild. Carol Hoegerman said that everyone was invited to St. Luke's United Methodist Church on Ella Taylor Road in Yorktown for a quilting get together on Feb.19, from 1:30-4:00 p.m.

Library - Lisa Hartman gave a report on the library and the number of old books currently in stock. She asked if we could sell some of the current stock and purchase new books to restock. A motion was made by Terry Hansen and seconded by Debi Cross. Motion carried.

Symposium - Linda Odell announced that some of the classes for the Symposium were filling up and that final registration would be March 13. Try to get your registrations in soon to ensure that you get the class you want. Price for the day is \$70. This includes, one all day class or two half-day classes; lunch, snacks, door prizes, welcoming packets, a lecture by our National speaker, Michelle May and access to the five vendors that will be set up for the day. The Symposium only happens every four years so sign up NOW. We are accepting credit cards for your convenience. Rita Crawford reported for the Prize Committee and stated that they have a good supply of gift and auction items and are still accepting donations. At this time, they have plenty of empty tissue boxes. Candy Byrd, Publicity, said that she has given out flyers as far north as Chester and would be going to the southside this week. Carol Richardson said we still have plenty of room in classes and take advantage of the variety.

Newsletter - Linda Blotter will be accepting items for the newsletter up to the 20th of the month, so get your information to her if you want it included in the next month's Newsletter.

Membership - Debbie Moore said that currently membership is lower than last year at 171 members. A suggestion was made that maybe we should contact members who have not renewed and encourage them to return. Debbie said that she would reach out to those past members.

Raffle Quilt - The 2020 Raffle Quilt is on display. Tickets are for sale for six for \$5, twelve for \$10, an 24 for \$20. Get your tickets now. You can keep the tickets for yourself or take a pack to sell. A suggestion was made that if each member bought \$10 worth, we would have a great start in raising funds for the Guild.

UFO - Nancy Shroust and Lois Bates announced that UFO No. 5 is due in March and UFO No. 3 will be due in May.

Challenge Quilts - Rhonda Gianturco asked that all members who wanted to show their Challenge Quilt at the Mid Atlantic Quilt Show should turn them into her today or set up a time to meet her so she can pick them up.

Mystery Quilt - The last clue for the Mystery Quilt will be sent out this week.

2020 Challenge Quilt - Gala Damato reminded everyone that the topic for this year's Challenge Quilt is "Fresh and Fruity" table topper or wall hanging, not to exceed 24 inches in width. Fabric colors that must be used in the project are Coral and Jade. Cost to enter is \$2.

Service Quilts - Gala announced that she and Joan Kelly would be delivering 11 baby quilts, one "No One Dies Alone Quilt," and 54 hearts to Riverside this week. We are continuing to do the same service projects that we did last year for CHKD and Riverside. A list of the different projects is on our website with size and suggestions. We do bereavement quilts, quilts for teenage chemo patients, hearts for NICU, baby quilts, and Riverside chemo patients.

Air Force Pillowcases - Carol Richardson was contacted concerning donations of pillowcases for the graduating cadets at the Air Force Academy. A total of 900 are due and she is hoping that are Guild would help and has set a goal of 150. There will be a workshop following the meeting to get us started.

VCQ- Bonnie Timm, representative from the VCQ introduced herself and ask that we check them out at vcq.org.

2021 Raffle Quilt - Debi Cross announced that a group of members have gotten together to do the 2021 Raffle Quilt and they were asking members if they would like to donate quilt squares to be included. They are accepting squares in a minimum size of three-inches and maximum size of six-inches. At least 1,000 squares are needed and they are trying to not have any repeats.

Local Workshops - On March 13, Linda Dagenhart will be teaching a workshop (Jelly Roll Jam) following the Day meeting. Cost of the workshop is \$12. Cathy Fowler said that there would be a workshop May 8 on EQ8. There is currently a sale on the EQ8 of 25 percent off through Feb. 16.

Block of the Month - Marilyn Rivera and Pat McGough presented the Block of the Month due in March (Sticks and Stones). The tulip blocks for February were won by Gina Vivian. **Monthly Mini** - Amy Masich and Kathy DeCarlo presented this month's monthly minis. Kitty Tully donated a design board and an adjustable work table. Kim Beatty donated a scissors holder and Carol Hagerman donated an embroidered wall hanging. Donna Albrecht won the design board and scissors holder. The table was won by Bonnie Timm. Nancy Shroul won the wall hanging.

Honor Quilts - Trina Murray reported that Quilts were presented to the partner and daughter of the fallen Newport News Police Officer Katie Thyne. Quilt kits are available for members to work on and there are also quilts that need to be long -armed.

Program - The program today was presented by Kitty Tully. She showed some vintage quilts, starting with a quilt that was given to her when she was one years old by her grandmother. She showed a quilt, "Art of the Ellipse" from 1970 and gifted this quilt to fellow Guild Member Rita Lopes, who was more than excited that she was able to own it. Most of the quilts that she presented were her entries in the Guild challenges over the years. She loves going to retreats and enjoys the people she meets. It was a very interesting and entertaining presentation. **Door Prizes** were won by Patsy Bowman, Sue Cundiff, Mona Hendrickson, Sara Ware, Pat McGough, Kitty Tully and Monica Brogan. **Birthdays** were announced and fat quarters selected.
