# EPISCOPUS ARUNDELLIENSIS ET BRICHTELMESTUNENSIS DECREE AUTHORISING THE GRANT OF A PLENARY INDULGENCE ON THE OCCASION OF THE RE-DEDICATION OF ENGLAND TO THE MOST BLESSED VIRGIN MARY ON 29<sup>TH</sup> MARCH 2020

In accordance with Canon 995 S 1 of the Code of Canon Law, I grant a Plenary Indulgence to all Catholics within the Diocese of Arundel and Brighton who, beside the exclusion of all attachment to sin, even venial sin, on the Twenty-ninth Day of March in the Year of Our Lord Two-thousand and Twenty use the prescribed prayers for the Re-Dedication of England to the Most Blessed Virgin Mary, and who within a week prior to, or a week following this Act of ReDedication make their sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion, and pray for the Holy Father's intentions, reciting the Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory be. (Indulgentiarum Doctrina, Norm 10) The Act of Re-Dedication should take place publicly, within the celebration of the Holy Eucharist, but in keeping with Canon Law, it may also take place privately; and, for those who reside in places where they cannot go to confession or Eucharistic communion at all, or can do so only with great hardship, they may gain a plenary indulgence without actual confession and communion, provided they have inner contrition and the resolution to go to these sacraments as soon as possible. (hldu/gentiarum Doctrina, Norm 1 1)
