

Jesus said to his disciples: "You are the salt of the earth. But if salt loses its taste, with what can it be seasoned? It is no longer good for anything but to be thrown out and trampled underfoot. You are the light of the world. A city set on a mountain cannot be hidden. Nor do they light a lamp and then put it under a bushel basket; it is set on a lampstand, where it gives light to all in the house. Just so, your light must shine before

others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your heavenly Father "



### **Reflection Ouestions:**

- 1. Do salt, light, and a city set on a mountain have anything in common? Do they exist for themselves? What is Jesus saying to us with these metaphors? Did he ask us to be light and salt, or did he tell us we are light and salt? What do you think Jesus wants us to do that might be like these elements? Could they relate to social iustice?
- 2. What determines the degree of saltiness or brightness? How would a person become more a person for others? Pope Francis says "If we live the faith in our daily life, then our work too becomes a chance to spread the joy of being a Christian." How does this relate to this Gospel?



Help us share our bread with the hungry, shelter the homeless, the oppressed, and clothe the naked. Let us do what salt does. Let us shine like the light. Teach us to give, a little at first, then all we have.
