Read Psalm 8

When I consider your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars, which you have set in place, what is mankind that you are mindful of them, human beings that you care for them? Psalm 8:3-4

Mary Oliver is one of my favorite poets. Her poems capture nature and spirituality easily and beautifully. Oliver is not afraid to ask a question and leave the readers to ponder the answer for themselves. Her asking questions without trying to find a correct answer is probably why I like her poems so much. It is similar in my faith. I have faith questions for which there are no definitive answers. I like to ponder them and it is definitely okay with me not to have an answer. Since modernity, a time when we became "*Enlightened*," many of us seem to think we have to have an answer scientifically proven or we can't believe it. We have taken away for many people the ability to believe in God because they cannot prove God's existence scientifically. How sad. At the right time, God's time, we will understand, but for now: we ponder and we see evidence of a wonderful Creator who has left his/her mark all around and in us.

Our church congregation has been looking at spiritual gifts that we have been given by God. All of us are blessed with at least one gift. Each gift(s) is necessary to function smoothly or efficiently as the body of Christ. When someone withholds their gift(s), it either makes implementing a plan doomed or makes another person cover for the missing gift. If the person covering is not gifted in that area, it often takes more energy (since it is not a natural gift) and may cause burnout if it occurs too many times or for too long a duration. I pray you will ponder what your gift(s) is and how you will use it among our FCC body so another does not have to cover for you. Mary Oliver, who died January 17, 2019, asks a great question in the last line of *The Summer Day*. As members of FCC, how will you use your spiritual gifts as we build up each other and strive for God's kin-dom here on earth? What is your dream for our church? How can we assist one another in this precious life we have been given?

Who made the world? Who made the swan, and the black bear? Who made the grasshopper? This grasshopper, I meanthe one who has flung herself out of the grass, the one who is eating sugar out of my hand, who is moving her jaws back and forth instead of up and downwho is gazing around with her enormous and complicated eyes. Now she lifts her pale forearms and thoroughly washes her face. Now she snaps her wings open, and floats away. I don't know exactly what a prayer is. I do know how to pay attention, how to fall down into the grass, how to kneel down in the grass, how to be idle and blessed, how to stroll through the fields, which is what I have been doing all day. Tell me, what else should I have done? Doesn't everything die at last, and too soon? Tell me, what is it you plan to do with your one wild and precious life? —Mary Oliver

During two days, the tribe members tell the offender the good things he or she has accomplished. The purpose of the ritual is to restore the person and to affirm that he or she is essentially a good person....

Thought for the Day: Surrounding people with love can bring healing and restore community."

I couldn't find confirmation of this practice but, "So what?"; I see this story as a model for what **could be reality** for **our** "tribe"- Christians.

- What would my life look like if I consistently committed to transforming my heart to align with Jesus' heart?
- If I consistently looked for ways to uplift others, replacing criticism and judgment with encouragement and gratitude?
- If this actually became <u>our</u> tribal practice, how different would life in our churches, homes, workplaces, and communities be?

Jesus gives many guidelines for actually changing my behavior and transforming my relationships, includining these: *Therefore, as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience. Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you. And over all these virtues put on love, which binds them all together in perfect unity.* **Colossians 3:12-14 (NIV)**

Our church has been so blessed over the years with amazing generous endowments and bequests from our members who have passed on. Recently, we have received two major gifts one from Leonard & Helen Dickinson and another from Judith Gerrish. Even those smaller gifts, bequeathed to us with love, have made a big difference in our ability to enhance our missions and ministries and spread God's love even further into the world.

Some of these gifts have been left as *endowments*, providing income to the church over the years while leaving the original gift amount invested to earn more income. Others have been made as *outright gifts*, allowing the church to determine how and when these monies may be best used. Either way, they are all a blessing to help us carry on with God's work.

So, have you ever thought of what you might be able to do to follow in the footsteps of those generous saints who have gone before?

Sometimes a very simple step you can take is to *include the church in your will*—either by leaving a dollar amount or a percentage of your estate. Similarly, naming the church as a beneficiary-or partial *beneficiary in a life insurance policy* that you no longer need to protect your family can help to continue your generosity to the church beyond your life time.

There are other more complex ways of bequeathing money to the church that will also provide income to you while you are still living, as well as provide some beneficial tax treatments. Some of these include: *Gift annuities, Pooled Income Funds*, and *Charitable Remainder Trusts*. These various instruments can be set up through your denomination, either the United Church of Christ or the United Methodist Church.

Any of these gifts to the church may be designated in a way that they will benefit a specific ministry of your choice, such as missions, buildings, or scholarships, or any other ministry you choose. They may also be given with no restrictions which will help with the general operations and ministries as the church needs. Either way, your gift will continue your generosity into the future to help *FCC*, our church, grow in its work for Christ.

Missions Moment

This month we would like to highlight the Community Survival Center. You may have seen them visiting us at one of our craft fairs. We have been supporting the Survival Center for year. During the colder months there is a greater need for donations. You can drop off any nonperishable items, or clothing in the narthex.

"The Community Survival Center is a 34 year old nonprofit agency that helps families struggling to provide the basics: food, clothing and household items. Our emergency food pantry serves Ludlow, Wilbraham, and Hampden as well as the 16 Acres, Pine Point, and Indian Orchard neighborhoods in Springfield.

"The Bridge of Hope Thrift Shop is open to the public and sells quality clothing and accessories, most at just \$4 per item. Shirts and blouses are \$3 per item. Also, our Clothing and Household Goods Program offers sales at just \$4/bag (with a limit of one bag of children's clothing) or \$6/bag for the larger bag, and is also open to the general public. All proceeds help to fund our pantry.

"We are supported by donations from our neighbors: individuals, churches, businesses, schools and various groups and organizations within the above mentioned communities. And we are extremely grateful to be able to support the center primarily with their help."

This would be very helpful in supporting our ministries this year and into the future, as well as providing an amazing blessing in your own life.
