



Simon is a bunny who is often found wearing his Super Rabbit costume. But will it be enough to give him the extra boost of confidence he needs to face his first day of (pre) school? Simon comes across as a cheeky and lovable youngster, a real character! The repetition and the comic-like layout in places will ensure that young readers soon feel confident enough to 'read' the book themselves. And there's no stopping them after that! (Age 2–4)

NADINE BRUN-COSME illustrated by AURÉLIE GUILLEREY DADDY LONG LEGS


TWO HOOTS 2018 (PBK) 32PP £6.99 ISBN 9781509842728

This delightful book wonderfully addresses the commonly felt anxiety of pre-schoolers at drop-off time. This book is perfect for story time read-aloud, particularly for anxious pre-schoolers who finds it hard to say goodbye. (Age 2–4)



This child-friendly look at a day in the life of a preschooler is one that newcomers and seasoned pros alike will be happy to share. (Age 2-4)


A Friend for Henry



A great book to show children that sometimes the smallest, most unassuming things are the most magical and that each of us has something to offer. (Age 4–7)



Wanda the Witch finds her voice in this delightfully illustrated picturebook. Wanda can't find her words, but when another shy witch joins her class, she and Lou find they don't need many words to strike up a friendship. When the talent show goes wrong, Wanda discovers she can use her voice when she needs it most. An engaging story about feeling shy and learning how to use your voice, illustrated in a textured, crayon style that is sure to appeal to young children. (Age 4–7)



MO WILLEMS THE PIGEON HAS TO GO TO SCHOOL!







MARIE-LOUISE FITZPATRICK THE NEW KID

Ellie is the new girl in town and even though the other kids have asked her out to play, they laugh at her and make her feel excluded. But Ellie's got a big imagination and it isn't long before the other children are following her lead. Great for any child moving schools or worried about making friends and not fitting in, with an equally important message for other children about empathy and the power they have to make newcomers feel welcome. (Age 5–8)






MATT HAIG illustrated by CHRIS MOULD THE TRUTH PIXIE GOES TO SCHOOL

Ada struggles with many problems at home, not to mention starting at a new school and the rollercoaster of self-acceptance. Bold gothic illustrations grace the pages, while spirited rhymes peak and trough at a frenetic pace. The Truth Pixie arms children with a workable philosophy on life. It's not happy ever after – it's sometimes happy and sometimes hard and that's OK. (Age 5–8)

FRANCESCA SANNA ME AND MY FEAR FLYING EYE BOOKS 2018 (HBK) 40PP £12.99 ISBN 9781911171539

A young girl has travelled to a new country with her little secret friend, Fear. But since they've arrived, Fear isn't so little anymore. She starts a new school and Fear tells her to be alone and afraid. But then she meets a boy who also has a secret friend. When they share their fears, the world doesn't seem like such a scary place; everyone has a secret fear. This heartwarming, hopeful story with its bold, vibrant illustrations relays a message of friendship and courage. (Age 5-8)




