BANNS:

A marriage in church normally takes place after the 'reading of banns'. Banns must be read within three months of the wedding, on three consecutive Sundays, in the parish or parishes where the bride and groom are resident. If they are being married outside of these parishes, in the church where they are regular worshippers, on the 'electoral roll' (as church members), or have a qualifying connection they must have their banns read there too. This is a legal requirement. A priest cannot conduct a marriage service, until he has received certificates from the relevant churches, to show that the banns have been read. If one or other of you has a foreign passport, then a Common license is generally required in place of banns. We always pray for couples, when their banns are read. We would be delighted to see you on these days, and indeed I would encourage you to come on other occasions too as part of your spiritual preparation.

Many couples plan their weddings well in advance of their wedding, and often move before their wedding. It is therefore very important for you to let me know in writing any change of address. It is also likely you will need to arrange to have your Banns called local to your new address. If you fail to inform of a change of address, this can invalidate your marriage.

QUALIFYING CONNECTIONS:

You can marry in a Church of England church if you can show: -

- 1. That one of you:
- a) has at any time lived in the parish for a period of at least 6 months, or
- b) was baptised in the parish concerned, or
- c) was prepared in the parish for confirmation, or
- d) has at any time attended normal church services in the parish church for a period of at least 6 months, or
- 2. That one of your parents, at any time after you were born:
- a) has lived in the parish for a period of at least 6 months, or
- b) has regularly attended normal church services in the parish church for a period of at least 6 months, or
- 3. That one of your parents or grandparents:

was married in the parish.

In all cases involving church services – i.e. going to normal church services, baptism, confirmation or marriage – this applies only to Church of England services.

FLOWERS

Even if couples are using 'outside' florists the couple should discuss their plans and wishes with the flower coordinators.

There are times of the year when there are restrictions as to what can arranged in the way of flowers. Particularly for weddings in the seasons of Lent (6 weeks before Easter) and Advent (4weeks before Christmas), where normally we don't have flowers in church. Please speak to the Rector about this.

PHOTOGRAPHS

Photographs may only be taken without flash. Photographers need to be sensitive, and aware of the intrusion excessive number of photos during the ceremony can cause. The congregation are requested not to take photographs.

VIDEOS

To video your wedding you will need: A general Video licence. This is necessary if the music you have chosen is in copyright, and applies both for your service and at your reception. A licence can be obtained from www.wvrl.co.uk,
