Campaign Kick-off for 2006 ISKF Nationals in Anchorage, Alaska

On Saturday, July 2nd, ISKF Alaska members met at the Anchorage Boys and Girls Club for a special training, followed by the unveiling of the official poster for the 2006 National tournament in Alaska.

The poster design contains an image of Master Nakayama in a stance from the kata Sochin, next to the big

dipper constellation. Master Nakayama's image is of special significance on the poster because he visited Alaska in 1985. Many Alaskan senior students remember training with this legendary individual who was so important to the early development and dissemination of Shotokan karate as we know it today in the U.S. and the world. Master Nakayama's calligraphy is also well known for its strength and beauty, and while he was in Alaska he presented to ISKF Alaska the calligraphy MU which is also a part of our Alaska Nationals poster. We are also proud of other Alaska karateka achievements at camp: **Susan Jones** was awarded 4th dan and joins Lynette Nakazawa, Kevin Hagensieker, and Diana Stevens as yondans of the Alaska region; **Janet Hagensieker** passed her judges examination, with her practical exam being as a judge at the International Goodwill Tournament that takes place after Master Camp training; **Craig Lewis** was accepted into the ISKF Instructor Training Program and began his course training at Master Camp—Craig is one of the youngest karate-ka to be accepted into the program and received special permission from Master Okazaki to enroll.
