

I hope this letter finds you well. April brings with it hopes of spring as we are nearing the end of Lent and getting closer to Easter Sunday. Growing up, Easter meant a new outfit so I would look my best as we gathered as a family in church and then to Grandma's house. Since both sets of Grandparents lived in the same area we would have lunch at one set and dinner at the other. Double the ham, deviled eggs, chocolate eggs and jelly beans. There is a hope and anticipation that comes with the approach of Easter.

This year we find ourselves in a different state. Inflation is at an all-time high, the war between Russia and Ukraine, uncertainty about the economy, and record high gas prices. We are planning a trip to Carlsbad Caverns National Park to see Melinda's brother who is a park ranger at the park. With the uncertainty of gas prices that trip may be put on hold. All of us are left with two options: whine and complain about it or embrace these difficult times and trust that God will get us through. I chose the latter.

With all that has happened in my life this last month I had an idea come up during one of my devotional times. If I was to write a book about my life it would be titled, "My Path is not Paved." This title comes out of times of personal reflection on how I came to be here in Northwood and Lake Mills. How God led me to go to seminary at UDTS but things have not happened in the way I expected them to. The journey for Melinda and myself to leave Idaho and move to Iowa. Looking back on all of these and even further back to when I was in high school I realized that God does have a plan for my life, but that path is not one that is paved.

There is a noticeable difference driving around lowa on the nice paved county or state road versus a gravel road. Paved roads are clearly marked, the surfaces are smooth, signs inform you of how far you have journeyed or the distance to your next destination. On a gravel road, it is hard to tell what part to drive on and most of the time people just drive down the middle. The road is dusty, usually rough, and can feel like you are out in the middle of nowhere. I found myself taking a gravel road because of construction or detours and entered an area that was unfamiliar and thought, "where in the world am I?" My path has been a gravel road, a steep mountain trail, and an overgrown path in a forest where the way was unclear. Anyone else able to relate?

Yet in the midst of darkness and uncertainty, Jesus says "I am the Light of the world." God's word is a lamp unto our feet and a light unto our paths. The path may not be easy but God is with us for the duration of the journey. Conversely, the road to Hell is "paved" with good intentions – so, I guess we are on the right path.






