

I hope this letter finds you well and in good spirits. It is easy to get the winter "blahs" and add Covid to the mix - the winter blues become even more "blue". I am one who tries to see the good in every situation. One who see the glass as "half-full" or tries to find the silver lining in every situation. Hope is on the horizon! We are able to return to in person worship on Sunday mornings. Vaccines are starting to roll out and have a high success rate. Most of our members have been able to stay healthy and even those who have contracted Covid were able to make a full recovery. There is yet more work to be done and we are not out of the woods yet, but hope is on the horizon. I want you to know that you are constantly in my prayers and I appreciate the prayer requests that have been sent my way. Prayer works! If I did not believe in the power of prayer than I would be in a different line of work. I am thankful that God has brought us through safely thus far and will continue to see us through to the end.

This month we celebrate Ash Wednesday and the beginning of Lent. There will be no Agape Meal this year, instead there will be a service of Compline with the institution of ashes. Compline is an evening prayer service with Scripture readings and songs. The ancient office of Compline derives its name from a Latin word meaning 'completion' (completorium). It is above all a service of quietness and reflection before rest at the end of the day. It is most effective when the ending is indeed an ending, without additions, conversation or noise. If there is an address, or business to be done, it should come first. If the service is in church, those present depart in silence; if at home, they go quietly to bed. This is a regular prayer service in Episcopal Churches and different monastic orders who pray the hours pray 7 times a day: dawn, early morning, morning, mid-day, mid-afternoon, vespers or evening, and Compline. Through the seminary I have participated in many Compline prayer services and think this would be a meaningful time of reflection and prayer for Ash Wednesday.

Make plans to join us on Wednesday, February 17th at 7pm at Asbury UMC. This service of Compline will take place in the fellowship hall. Also, there will also be a Lenten study on Adam Hamilton's book, "Final Words From the Cross." This study was started last year but then was put on hold because of Covid. In order to make the study accessible to as many people as possible it will be done via Zoom. Joyce Sherman will be leading the study and you can participate from the comfort of your living room. If you are interested please contact Ona to register and this study will start on Sunday, February 21st. The nice thing about Zoom is that if you are unable to make one of the sessions, it will be available for viewing on the church's Youtube channel.

Make plans to join us for Sunday worship and these other two opportunities. May God continue to watch over us and keep us safe from any harmful thing that would try to come against us.

# Alone With Him by Pastor Jeremy Walloch

Sometimes it is nice to be alone— to get away from noise and expectations, to hear the refrigerator run, to put your feet up on the furniture, and to exhale.

Other times being alone feels lonely, especially when unable to gather with others.

In scripture God makes it clear that we are actually never alone:

- "For the Lord your God is a merciful God. He will not leave you." (Deuteronomy 4:31)
- "The Lord your God who goes with you. He will not leave you or forsake you." (Deuteronomy 31:6)
- "The Lord Your God is with you wherever you go." (Joshua 1:9)
- "Fear not, for I am with you." (Isaiah 41:10)
- "I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Matthew 28:20)
- "I will not leave you as orphans; I will come to you." (John 14:18)

Simply put, even when we look alone, even when we seem alone, and even when we feel alone, we are not actually alone.

Amidst this pandemic, when disappointment, despair, and loneliness are at an all-time high, we need to remember that even when family and friends are far, God is near.

So instead of leaving the news on just to hear someone else's voice, or playing music to fill the otherwise-silent air, what if instead we actually talked to the other Person in the room?


