Your Newsletter

You may have noticed that the last few issues of the newsletter have been a little light on articles. As editor, it is my job to put together the articles that members submit to me. I'm not the writer, though I do from time to time write something.

Perhaps our members don't know what they can submit. So, let me tell you what I'm looking for. I accept anything that is quilt related, be it announcements of other quilt shows to a funny quilt story or maybe you're a blogger and love to write quilting tidbits on your trials and tribulations of quilting. It doesn't have to be a long narration but needs to be quilt related.

Maybe you have quilts showing somewhere. It would be nice to let the guild know your hard work is in the public eye. It doesn't matter if it's a big quilt show or a small local show or even just a showing in a small display. It would still be great to let everyone know your quilt is out there.

Do you have a special technique or shortcut that would interest our members? I know we've had a few guild meetings that have touched on this subject, but it would be cool if someone could pass along their own tried and true shortcuts.

Here's an example, when I need half square triangles, I cut out 2 squares of fabric, say seven inches square. I sew all around the edges of the squares with a quarter inch seam. Once that's done, I cut on the diagonal in both directions and presto, I have 4 1/2" half square triangles. Now granted you'd be working against the grain, when sewing them in your quilt, but if you sew carefully it really does save some time and you're not having to measure and pencil in the sewing lines on your fabric.

Cut out different size squares to find out which sizes yield what size half square triangles. For instance, when I did it, ten inch squares gave me 6 1/2" half square triangles, nine inch gave me 6", eight inch gave me 5 3/8", and seven inch gave me 4 1/2". One of the best things about doing them this way is that once you figure out the square measurements, you don't have to size the squares down after you cut them out. Just gently press them open and you're done. Now I didn't make up this shortcut. I just had to figure out the square measurements. The shortcut was on the Missouri Quilt you-tube website.

I sometimes wish I was a blogger and could

fill the empty space in the newsletter with lots of smart and sassy prose, but I find it difficult to write about my quilting so I know how you might feel. But, you can do it. How about me starting off. Well, let's see.... I sew almost every day. I don't have a fancy studio, but sew on my dining room table. I use a drafting table as my workspace. It's in the middle of my living room, literally in the middle of the room, but I can work on any side of the table which comes in handy when cutting fabric. My husband is very understanding of my addiction and doesn't complain about my taking up what little space we have in our house for my quilting needs. I do try to stay neat though so there are no threads and snippets of fabric all over the house. I'm organized for the most part. I finish what I start so no unfinished tops. I have a lot of tops. I usually sew for several hours, until my back starts acting up. Then, I do a crazy thing...I lay down on my coffee table. Can you imagine an old lady like me lying down on a coffee table? It sounds strange, but it works like a charm.

Here's a thought...how about writing something about your bee? There are a number of bees in our guild. I know some bees are full, but does your bee take on new members? The newsletter is a great way of letting the membership know that you have a bee and there's room for new members. Or maybe your bee does something special. We would all like to hear about it.

I know we've had a number of new members over this past year and I'd like to encourage you to submit something as well. Maybe you've got a question about quilting. Do you need advice? I can get you the answers you need, I just need your questions. We've got a lot of experts out there that I can confer with to get you your answers. It may be you've got something to say about your own quilting habits. As a new or even old member it would be great to hear from you.

As I've said, I'm not a writer nor am I a blogger. I rely on people to submit material for the newsletter. By my opening up a bit, I hope it helps some of you out there feel a little less scared and maybe get you to submit something. The new year is coming fast, so I hope we can start it out with more of you submitting material. It's your newsletter. Let's make it a great one!

Update on Natasha House

PPQG members have continued to support NATASHA House in York County in 2014. We have delivered 1 bunk bed quilt, 3 kids quilts and 3 pillow cases. We will be making another delivery in Dec. In 2013, we donated personalized pillow cases and personal quilts for all the children living in the house. We also provided 5 queen sized quilts and 7 bunk bed quilts to stay in the rooms in the house. One queen sized quilt made by the Sewing Sisters bee was sold at a silent auction in March. The following are still needed:

- 2 Bunk Bed Quilts approx. size- 48" x 80"
- Throw sized quilts for the Mothers living in the house.
- Various sizes of kid quilts for the children that move into the house in the future.

The families rotate every 6 to 24 months. So, if you would like to make a quilt for one of the children, we will take them for the families that will come to live at the Natasha House in the future. We also want to thank all the PPQG members that donated sewing machines, fabric, and sewing supplies for Melina Cienski's Girl Scout Gold Award project. For the past 6 months,

she has been holding regular sewing classes at NATASHA House. Several Mothers, and children as well, have learned to sew and made fleece scarves, baked potato bags and gift card wallets. Thanks for sharing your supplies. They have loved learning to sew.

Since opening in September 2010, NATASHA House has housed 57 residents and 93 children. 82% of them remain in housing. Forty percent of the residents have been from York County or Poquoson. For more information on ways to help, visit their website, www.natashahouse.org.
