I hope you have coped with all the things that have been happening this week.

Our garden is still a lake, but that's nothing compared to those affected by floods in Manchester, West Yorkshire, Maghull and other places. Our daughter, Kate, was offered the chance to be evacuated from her home in Northenden but decided to sit tight and hope for the best.

I saw some of the Inauguration of President Biden and found his words very appropriate. He called people to: "open our souls instead of hardening our hearts...Some days you need a

hand. There are other days when we're called to lend a hand. That's how it has to be, that's what we do for one another....I promise this, as the Bible says, 'Weeping may endure for a night, joy cometh in the morning'. We will get through this together".

I was also moved by the words of Rev Sylvester Beaman who prayed at the end of the ceremony: "Discovering our humanity, we will seek the good in and for all our neighbours. We will love the unlovable.... seek rehabilitation beyond correction, we will extend opportunity to those locked out of opportunity. We will make friends of our enemies. People, your people, shall no longer raise up weapons against one another, we will rather use our resources for the national good and become a beacon of life and goodwill to the world. And neither shall we learn hatred anymore."


Dan Holmes Concert


