The Elusive Miss

One of the most frustrating things in the motoring world is a persistent fault which defies detection in spite of all the time and effort spent to rectify the problem. Such an issue arose on completion of an engine rebuilt as part of the recommissioning of my 1968 Mazda 1500ss which had been in storage for 39 years.

The anticipation of hearing the sweet sound of a newly rebuilt engine for the first time turned to dismay and disappointment when it would only run spasmodically in a very

erratic manner. There followed a thorough assessment of all the likely suspects, from fuel systems to all the ignition components, most of which had been renewed in the process of the rebuild. Even such an unlikely item as a new coil was exchanged for another without appreciable improvement. A brake-through of sorts came when the condenser was replaced with another of a different capacity. This allowed the car to be driven however, the elusive miss was still evident during throttle movement and underload.

Time to get a specialist's opinion so off to my friendly automotive technician who has the latest hitech equipment. The oscilloscope showed that there was an unusual pattern in the ignition system but the individual components tested normally. More head scratching and home with the elusive miss still on board. The only thing left was to re-examine all the various parts of the ignition system in the vague hope of finding something which may have a bearing on the problem. Starting with the new spark plugs, the new high-tension leads to the new distributor cap. To remove the leads from the cap it was necessary to peel back the rubber boot which the leads passed through before entering the cap. The protective cover also contained the low-tension wire which carried current from the coil to the distributor points. The first thing I noticed was the wire was wrapped around one of the high-tension leads inside the cover. Could this be the reason for the intermittent misfire? Removing the wire from the rubber boot and running it directly to the distributor immediately solved the problem. Yeehaw!

It would appear that the close proximity of the ignition wire to the high-tension lead was enough to cause a spike to interrupt the flow of current to the points which in turn sent erratic signals to the coil resulting in the elusive miss. While this is an unlikely scenario for others it is worth keeping in mind in case you are unlucky enough to be confronted with a similar problem. Primary and secondary ignition wiring should be kept well apart.
