#### President's Message

Happy New Year! I hope you had a great holiday and received everything you wanted to help you quilt! As I start the New Year, I have come up with some new resolutions to help me be a better person:

Weight training. A bolt of new quilter's cotton weighs about six pounds. Use it to do curls. Add more bolts for extra weight. Place them on the floor and do a jerk and press over your head. (Remember to lift with your legs not your back!)

**Cardio.** Walk up and down every aisle in the quilt shop looking for that perfect focus fabric. Once you find it, repeat 2-3 times as you look for complementary fabrics and blenders.

**Bonus:** Combine weight training and cardio by carrying fabric bolts as you go! When you get home, move your ironing board into a different room from your sewing machine. Going back and forth will double the number of steps you did in the quilt store!

**Diet.** Remove any and all **clocks** from your quilting area. Start quilting. You will lose all track of time and as a result will miss those pesky meals that make you gain weight in the first place!

**Bonus:** You will also forget to cook dinner, so your family will lose weight, too!

**Reduce clutter.** Pull out those UFOs (more weight training!) and complete them. As a special reward for cleaning up your space: for every two projects that you complete, you can buy fabric for two more projects!

#### **Disappearing Pinwheel Class Details**

We will be making **eight** different Disappearing Pinwheel Blocks during the workshop. The blocks would make a cute sampler or table runner if you use similar fabrics. Feel free to make extra blocks if time permits to make a larger quilt. You will get more completed if the pinwheels are made in advance. Bring to class **eight 12-inch pinwheels or 32 6<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>-inch HST** to make one each of the pinwheels.

#### Supplies:

Basic sewing supplies to include your sewing machine and extension cord. 12-inch square ruler with a 45-degree angle, cutting mat (rotating or 2 mats) Rotary cutter with sharp blade. A 12-inch design board would be helpful
