Read aloud with your reader

A sample of children polled in *The 2016 Western Australian Study in Children's Book Reading* reveals that many children interviewed up to approximately 11 years old, were disappointed that their parents no longer read to them. Their reasons included enjoyment of the time spent together as well as feeling that by listening, they were able to extend their own vocabulary and improve pronunciation. Students noted improvements in spelling and others gained greater confidence in their reading skills overall because they were able to practice at home.

What are some benefits of reading to and with your kids?

- **Build vocabulary**. Kids encounter more words than are used in everyday conversation.
- Improve comprehension. Check for understanding as you move through the reading.
- Wonderful for bonding. Hearing stories from a loved one can inspire a lifelong love of reading.

Just 20 minutes set aside a few times a week with your child is a great way to introduce "together" reading.

Next, Simon will give a command.


- If Simon Says "Simon Says" before telling you what to do, then you must do it.

 "Simon Says." (If you accidentally do it, then you are out until the next game.)


 After everyone is out, pick a new
