Best Hidden Gems in Italy

Le Marche (Ich mar-keh) is one of the neatest hidden gems in Italy. Embracing the Adriatic Sea, with breath taking landscaping and hilltops. This region is a wonderful place to visit. Marche extends over an area of 3,743 square miles of the central Adriatic slope between Emilia-Romagna to the north, Tuscany and Umbria to the west, and Lazio and Abruzzo to the south. Finding off-the-beaten-track gems is increasingly hard. Which is precisely what makes the region of Le Marche, Italy one of the favorite places to visit for Italians. The name "Marche" comes from the marches of Ancona, Camerino and Fermo, the name of this part of the region during the ninth and eleventh century.

You will enjoy the rolling hills of Le Marche in all shades of green, medieval hilltops, towns, tiny villages, with beautiful houses, vineyards, olive trees, wonderful beaches by the blue sea and an excellent variety of food to enjoy.

One city that you should stop and visit is Ancona a beautiful historic city which is characterized by the position overlooking the sea. Ancona a rich center of history and monuments, from well preserved semi-urban parks and beautiful surroundings. Ancona is a leading port for the fishing fleet: sole can be found in abundance, along with sea bass, sea bream, turbot and monkfish. Other types of fish; paranza fish for frying and soups, blue fish for grilling, claims, mussels, shellfish, and all kinds of mollusks.

parks, and excellent cuisine. The historic center of Ancona is delightful and is enclosed within

the nineteenth-century walls. The best way to visit Ancona is by foot. You can walk pleasantly from one point of interest to another. You can start from the central square "Piazza del Plebiscito", The Church of San Domenico, located in the square, contains two masterpieces: the Annunciation by Guercino and the Crucifixion by Titian. The Government Palace, the Civic Tower with the clock and some beautiful noble palaces overlook Piazza del Plebiscito. Piazza del Papa is the heart of Ancona, also has bars, cafes, and restaurants.

Santa Maria della Piazza is the most important and oldest church in Ancona. In the fourth century BC there was an early Christian Basilica, as evidenced by the splendid mosaics in the floor that can be admired through the glass plates.

A visit to Ancona's Stunning Arch of Trajan should be something you don't want to miss. The monument was erected at the beginning of the 2nd century AD by the senate and

people of Rome in honor of Emperor Trajan, during his reign. The arch stands on the harbor wall itself, built on a high plinth of a travertine stone base. The

limitations of the existing width of the wall meant that it needed to be narrow but tall, allowing it to be clearly visible from both land and sea. It was modelled after the Arch of Titus in Rome. Inscriptions on the attic are executed on the side facing the city and proclaim the dedication to Trajan, as he who had "given ships safer access to Italy with the construction of this port at his own expense".

It was from this site that Trajan departed on his successful and famous battle against the Dacian's, as commemorated in Trajan's Column in Rome. Few places in the world will you find such an important and handsome ancient monument easily and freely accessible to the public as this wonderful attraction in Le Marche.

Between the Guasco hill and the Cappuccini hill, you can admire the Roman amphitheater dating back to the first century BC. The amphitheater, which can accommodate up to 10,000 spectators. Another interesting place is the largest urban park in all of Ancona: The Cardeto Park, overlooking the sea, where you can take long walks to fully enjoy the luxuriant nature which, in the spring months, is covered in a wonderful flowery mantle.


There is no surprise at the prevalence of fish in the local cuisine in the region. A predominance that takes over when we talk about "brodetto" and "baccalà." The first one is a typical fish soup (it takes thirteen different varieties) to which tomatoes and toasted slices of bread are added. The baccalà (stockfish) competes with the brodetto for the role of the dish of the heart of the Ancona people, a key role given that an "Academy of stockfish" was founded in the city. Then there are "moscioli" (wild mussels), squid, anchovies, and all the fish from the Adriatic Sea. To oppose this prevalence of the sea there is the "vincisgrassi," lasagna of puff pastry with meat and tomato. Also worth mentioning are the famous "Ascoli olives," olives stuffed with a mixture of roasted and then minced meats, mixed with egg, grated Parmesan cheese, and nutmeg. They are fried and served hot. Enjoy some excellent wines Rosso Cònero and Verdicchio di Jesi that will complement your meal.
