Apology



@ the Art Gallery of South Australia until November 6 2022. Works on display include abstract sculptural pieces by award winning Moriyama Kanjiro who hales from the famous Koishiwara kiln area of Fukuoka.

3D Sculpture/Textile

- Must not exceed 25kgs or in excess of 150cm squared.
- Textile includes fibres like cotton, wool, hemp, silk or even synthetics like polyester and nylon.
- Sculpture includes clay, wax, stone, metal, fabric, glass, wood, plaster, rubber, and random "found" objects.
- Must be accompanied by a card detailing artist's name.
- 3D works can be placed on plinth or hung: please state on your entry form.

Delivery and Pick Up

- Entrants are to cover all delivery and transport costs.
- On delivery, artists should take their wrappings away with them (bubble wrap, cardboard corners, and so on). Wrapping cannot be stored or supplied by the City of Canning.
 - All artworks are to be clearly labelled on the back of the artwork indicating the artist full name and title of piece.
- It is the artist's responsibility to ensure artwork is dropped off and picked up within timeframes listed. Late artwork will not be accepted.

Work not picked up in timeframes provided will be held by the Events

Please note that times specified may be subject to minor change which will be communicated to the participant via the email supplied on this form.

Sales and GST

- All artwork must be for sale with the exception of youth entries (ages 12-17).
- All sale prices must include a 20% commission fee.
- Artists, who do not have an ABN, please sign the statement on the entry form to avoid tax being deducted from any payment to be made.

Rules for Exhibiting

- All works entered must be less than 12 months old from the closing date for entries, not have previously won an award and must be an original.
- 2 x D-rings and cord hanging assembly are mandatory for all hanging works. Please ensure these are attached professionally and securely. No glue, tape, staples or temporary fixtures as these will not hold and will not be accepted. You will be requested to fix any unsuitable hanging assembly should it not meet our requirements.

General Rules

- Artists may submit one (1) entry only. Entry fee (\$30) is non-refundable.
- Incorrect or incomplete entry forms or failure to comply with Conditions of Entry will result in disqualification.
 - Only title, price and medium are permitted to be altered minimum one (1) month prior to closing date.
- A digital photograph of your work will be required as part of the entry for internal preview purposes.
- The City of Canning, while taking good care, will not take
 responsibility for the damage or loss of artworks. It is the
 responsibility of the artist to provide insurance for their works
 as the exhibition is not always manned. The option for a security
 tag sticker will be available at drop off. As the exhibition is not
 always manned, this is the best option to keep your art safe.
 This will be at the artist's discretion as it can cause slight tears
 on removal, depending on the medium used.
- Entrants must agree that the organisers reserve the right to reproduce entries in print, film or digital format for promotion, education, and documentation purposes in association with the City of Canning.
 - If artworks are deemed unsuitable for exhibition as they raise copyright issues, are culturally insensitive, obscene, upsetting and/or not family-friendly, the entry will be cancelled.
- Once an artwork has been placed by the curator, it will remain in place for the duration of the exhibition and cannot be moved or withdrawn.

- The Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Artist Award is open to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander artists aged 12 and over.
- There is no particular theme regarding work that can be entered.
- Rules and restrictions apply see below.

Category Rules and Restrictions

Painting, Drawing, Mixed Media and Photography

- Must not exceed 150cm high by 150cm wide by 90cm deep and weigh more than 5kgs. This size includes the frame.
- · Painting category includes acrylic, oil, watercolour etc.
- Drawing category includes pen, pencil, charcoal, chalk, crayon etc.
- Photography includes film, digital and can be edited in a digital program e.g. Photoshop.
- Mixed Media includes all those options listed in painting, drawing and photography.
- Digital Art includes digitally altered still images which are computer generated, scanned, or drawn using a tablet or mouse with software/technology of your choice. Must be printed for display.
- All above categories can be displayed on canvas, paper, wood, metal or any base you choose, as long as they adhere to the size and weight restrictions.





Something fun to watch

I love my British murder/mysteries so signed up for a free trial of Britbox and while browsing came across this fun and fabulous program - The Great Pottery Throw Down. It's like MasterChef for potters! I'm not a potter but I found it fascinating seeing the potters making such a variety of items ranging from garden sculpture to porcelain chandeliers, doing raku firings and bricking up the gas kiln. Why not try Britbox for a (free) week and binge view The Great Pottery Throw Down?

Mary Wallace's 'decorative techniques for greenware' class was a fantastic way to spend a Sunday! We arrived to find a goodies bag for each person to keep: 6 ready-to-use clay tiles, course notes, 4 home-made tools, 2 transfer samples, 2 delicate chinese paper stencils and a 10g sachet of mason stain to make our own slip at home.

Mary told us how to make the carving tools (from old umbrella ribs) and how to properly mix a batch of slip. Then she demonstrated a series of techniques - giving us the time to play with her wide range of coloured slip and try each method in turn. It was such fun experimenting - and seeing how everyone in the class came up with different ideas.

This course drastically lifted my skill level and will allow me to create a wider range and better quality of ceramics.

Mary Wallace Greenware Decoration Techniques




- Applied torn paper to white tile. These later show as white.
- Painted with mauve slip and applied torn paper.
 These later show as mauve.
- Painted with pink slip and applied torn paper.
 These later show as pink.
- Painted with blue slip over remaining unpapered tile.
- Pulled off all paper to reveal colours, which appear to be the opposite order to how they were painted, with white on top and blue background.
- Painted grey slip detail. Scored circles.



- Applied cut transfer paper face down on white tile. Patted with slightly damp sponge until colour transferred.
- Placed 'warrior' paper stencil on white tile.
- Painted red slip over the remainder of the tile that was not covered by the transfer.
- Removed the 'warrior' paper stencil to reveal white tile.






- Painted black slip beneath where the panda stencil would be. Placed the stencil and sponged away any exposed black slip. This left black slip protected by the paper stencil.
- Painted Chinese letter in liquid latex.
- Cut and placed paper leaves.
- Painted black slip and red slip next to each other, over everything.
- Removed paper leaves, panda stencil and latex.
 Cut veins of leaves.



- Use a tile that is dry enough to cut crisp grooves without powdering.
- Cut grooves for the centre of the flower. Painted red slip over the grooves to fill them up. Wiped off the excess.
- Cut grooves for the outer parts of the flower.
 Painted yellow slip over the grooves to fill them up. Wiped off the excess.
- Cut grooves for the leaves. Painted green slip over the grooves to fill them up. Wiped off the excess.
- Let all slip dry well. Scraped all excess off with sharp blade to leave tile clean and level.



- Started with a tile that was quite dry.
- Painted shellac in lines on the tile.
- When shellac was dry, used a wet sponge to wash away the surface of the tile not protected by the shellac, leaving it slightly lower than before.
- The shellac will burn off when the tile is fired in the kiln, leaving raised lines in the clay.
- You can't do further work over the top of shellac
 unlike latex, which is used in the same way as a paper stencil.

Nieman Marcus Cookies



You may or may not have heard the The Urban Legend of The Nieman Marcus Cookie Recipe. (Nieman Marcus is a department store chain in the US)

As the story goes, a woman and her daughter went to lunch at a Neiman Marcus Cafe, and enjoyed the chocolate chip cookies so much that they asked to buy the recipe. They were told it would cost 2.50, however she discovered later when reading her credit card statement she had actually been charged \$250. She contacted the company but they wouldn't provide a refund, saying that was the price. Acting in revenge she started a email chain letter containing the recipe, and it began circulating the web in the late 1990s.

The legendary story went viral and probably passed through your email stream a couple of times back in the day, but has since been disputed.

Apparently the only truth to the story of the "\$250 cookie recipe" is that they really are delicious.

Ingredients

455 gm butter

402gms caster sugar

400 grms brown sugar

225 gms grated chocolate

450gm chopped nuts

544 gms flour

450gms oats, blended.

1 tsp salt

2 tsp baking powder

2 tsp vanilla

2 tsp baking soda

680 gms choc chips

4 eggs

Method

Cream butter and sugars, add eggs and vanilla. Mix dry ingredients together and add to wet mixture. Add grated chocolate, nuts and chocolate chips.

Roll into balls and place 5cm apart on tray. Bake for 10mins at 190C


The recipe makes 112 cookies, so best halve it.


These three sections are joined in an enthralling and ingenious symphony, as recurring notes and themes deepen and enrich one another

So when one November morning a chatty young couple with two chatty young daughters move in next door and accidentally flatten Ove's mailbox, it is the lead-in to a comical and heartwarming tale of unkempt cats, unexpected friendship, and the ancient art of backing up a U-Haul.
