

Parish Mission Readiness Statement Committee Report
From Deacon Jim Mason**

As you know we are currently in a most crucial phase of the Baltimore Archdiocese's Be Missionary Disciples Planning process. Parishes have been asked to prepare a two- to three- page "Parish Mission Readiness Statement" by the end of this September.

The statement will first describe our parish's opportunities and challenges to its "mission readiness," or its ability to serve God and the community while answering Christ's call to "make disciples." Ultimately, parishes in the Archdiocese of Baltimore will continue, cluster, or close.

Recall my homily of about two weeks ago now... I said that there is a special call from the Lord to each of us. I said there is a call to each of us from our own Archbishop William Lori to be disciples... missionary disciples! Will we follow and make it our spiritual **Reality** today? Or will we wait, hope someone else does it and risk waking up in **Nowhere Land**?

The future of our churches is at stake. We need your help and continue to ask for your help. And many of you have answered that plea!

On Tuesday July 5 we met a second time to continue to meet every Monday evening after the 7:00pm Mass to tackle this task until completed. All parishioners are welcome to attend meetings. We will create the best document we can to illustrate for the Archdiocese who and what we are all about here on the edge of the Western Region [and the Tri-State area]. We want to show the Archdiocese why we want and need to continue and how we will do it! Initially, Gary Voight, with the aid of Ian McAlister, David Mellott, Fr. Jack, and myself, has prepared and presented a brief overview of the fall 2015 survey results. From the initial group, Ian McAllister has graciously volunteered to write the final document that will be presented to the Archdiocese. Remember, he needs our help [input].

At our first meeting our focus was directed to our current Parish Mission Statement. It is printed on the Bulletin cover....

At our second meeting our focus was active information gathering. on our church programs, outreach programs, fundraisers, and other activities, we had a general brainstorming session listing any and all of the activities we have done over the years. New parishioner Kristin Lennon [with the aid of her husband, David] took diligent notes and typed out our thoughts arranging them in the Archdiocese's Core Mission Priorities:

- Prayer, Worship & Sacramental Life
- Welcome & Fellowship
- Evangelization
- Material and Pastoral Care for the Poor & Suffering
- Education, Faith Formation & Discipleship
- Promotion of Vocations
- Stewardship of Resources

The list, too extensive to list here, has been sent to active committee members and will give to anyone who asks. We realize it is by no means complete but as Kristen commented, it is "mind-boggling"--we are "a very busy parish!". Our two- to three- page report may need to be accompanied by an addendum!

Our next meeting is this Monday, July 11 after the 7:00pm Mass to brainstorm into the future. Get involved.. We have a great group. We begin each session with the same prayer that was said before each session of Vatican II. We invoke the Holy Spirit to come to us, remain with us, and enlighten our hearts...
