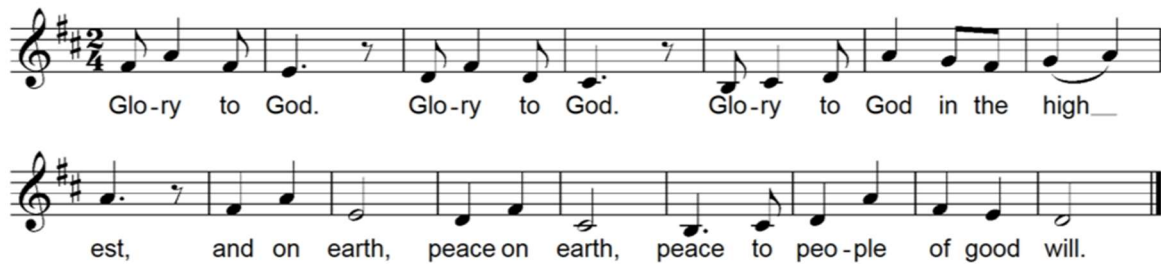


#### PRAYER OF SPIRITUAL COMMUNION (*prayed by all before the Communion Hymn*):


