
Active Shooter Incidents in U.S., 2000 – 2013




Incidents Are Becoming More Frequent...





There were 160 Active Shooter incidents in the U.S. between 2000 and 2013. That's over 11 per year.



There were 115 Active Shooter incidents between 2007 and 2013, over 2 1/2 times the amount of the previous 7 years.





247 victims suffered at the hands of an Active Shooter between 2000 and 2006.



486 people were killed and another 557 were wounded.

That's 1,043 direct victims. The report does not outline how many total families were affected. 2007 - 2013




796 people were victimized by an Active Shooter between 2007 and 2013. That's over 3 times the amount from the previous 7 years.

Who's Doing the Shooting?








154 of the shooters were a lone male. That's over 96% of the total incidents.

In fact, only 2 of the 160 incidents involved more than 1 shooter.


Of the Active Shooter incidents that took place at schools, 65% of the assailants were students at the school.

Only 6 of the shooters were female. That's less than 4% of the total cases.


How Long Do Incidents Last?



35% of incidents lasted less than 2 minutes.



34% of incidents lasted between 2 and 5 minutes.



31% of incidents lasted longer than 5 minutes.


Impact on Law Enforcement



46% of the time, Law Enforcement was unable to respond in less than 10 minutes.

60% of the time, the incident was over

before police arrived.



28% of the time, Law Enforcement engaged the shooter.

9 officers were killed in action, and another 28 were wounded.
