Advent—Waiting for the Coming

Advent is about the three Comings of Christ. The first Coming was in Bethlehem about two thousand years ago. The second Coming is what the Bible calls the "Parousia" (Greek for "being present") at the close of the age when Jesus comes to judge the living and the dead. And the third Coming is how Jesus in the form of the Holy Spirit comes to faithful believers in the meanwhile.

We await these "Comings." The word Advent was often reserved for the arrival of an important dignitary or a king, or the arrival of a really important thing, or the arrival of a pivotal event. So Advent indicates that whatever is coming is really important.

I have never been particularly good at waiting. Whether it is waiting for a stoplight to turn green, or for an important package to arrive, or for biopsies or medical test results, I'm not a very patient person. And the very existence of ATMs, 24 Hour Walmarts and pharmacies, drive-up windows, overnight shipping options, and online-shopping all tell me that I am not alone. We twenty-first century folks are just not good at waiting.

I get sour while waiting. There is an old saying that some people age like fine wine, and others age like expired milk. I'm afraid I age like expired milk while I wait. But using horrible traffic jams, slow drivers driving down the road with their turn signals flashing for miles, delayed and lost packages, late airplanes and cancelled flights, and innumerable other methods, God continually tries to teach me how to wait.

It dawns on me that God is teaching us all how to wait right now. Advent is usually the four weeks before Christmas, starting around Thanksgiving; but this year, we began Advent approximately in the middle of February. We are all waiting for the Covid pandemic to be over. We are waiting for the availability of an effective and safe vaccine. We are waiting to be able to go back to doing things normally – in person schools and colleges, shopping in person instead of online, doctors' offices that don't treat us like lepers, being able to gather together to ask the

Lord's blessings, begin able to have a covered dish supper with friends, take a trip or vacation, or even for the entire family to gather for the holidays.

We have been going through Advent now for about 9 months and we will go through it for another several months before the vaccines become available, we receive two doses and develop immunity to the Covid 19 virus.

As we wait for the Comings, it is important to not grow weary. It is important to continue wearing masks, washing our hands, sanitizing everything in sight, and doing whatever we can to make sure that we are still here when the Coming comes.

So, please be patient with us as we do the best we can with virtual services, drive by outdoor communions, online Sunday Schools, zoom meetings. Just know that we will be stuck in Advent for a bit longer, and that we will eventually get back to "normal" as soon as we possibly can. Keep the faith, be patient with all, stay safe, and know that God's time is the best time.

A special thank you to worship for finding a way to engage us in person on this special day.




If you would like to order Poinsettias for Christmas in honor or memory of someone please let the church office know.



Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I pray this message finds you safe and well as we continue to be Church in Covidtide. As you know, a surge in the number of cases in North Carolina and Mecklenburg County have forced us back into diocesan Phase 1B, which allows only people essential to the service to be in the building during worship. It also reduces the number of congregants who may gather indoors to 10, and outdoors to 25.

Covid has forced another significant change in how St. Mark's and many other parishes end the year.

Diocesan rules will not allow us to conduct official parish business virtually, which means we cannot hold an annual meeting or Vestry election.

Here's how we plan to handle annual meeting business:

1. Treasurer Brian Pouliot and the finance committee are preparing the annual budget for 2021. Once it is complete, we will share it with all St. Mark's members and allow for two weeks of congregational reaction and comment before the Vestry votes to amend and/or approve it.

If you have not sent in your pledge, please do as soon as possible so the finance committee can budget appropriately for the coming year.

- 2. We will take extra time during the announcements after services on Dec. 6 -- which would have been the date of our Annual Meeting -- to provide important updates on:
 - The search for our next Rector
 - Construction of our new fellowship hall
 - Flyin' Lion Transition-to-Work Ministry
 - La Escuelita San Marcos
 - Ranson Middle School
 - The Rafters at Historic St. Mark's wedding ministry

If there are other updates you would like to see included, please email vestry@stmarksnc.org by Dec. 1.

- 3. The diocese gives us two alternatives to an in-person Vestry election, which it will not allow:
 - We can leave the positions open until we are able to hold an in-person election.
 - The current Vestry can vote to elect three new members to serve full terms.

Because St. Mark's needs a full Vestry in these times, the current Vestry will name three new members, plus an alternate, in December. A handful of parishioners have agreed to be considered for these positions. If there are others, please email vestry@stmarksnc.org by Dec. 11.

4. We want to hear from you, so in place of the annual meeting, the Vestry will host a series of Zoom calls with 8-10 participants each to share the results of the survey conducted in September and October, and to talk further about what we're looking for in our new Rector. We are on schedule and will begin the search in earnest after the first of the year. These meetings will help ensure we represent the whole of St. Mark's in our work.

We will send details and sign-up instructions for these Zoom calls later this week.

If you are interested in having a one-on-one conversation with a Vestry member rather than joining us on Zoom, please email vestry@stmarksnc.org or let the church office know.

These continue to be times filled with uncertainty and opportunity for a congregation willing to take risks in our service to God and our community. We pray for all who are working to sustain our church and her ministries as we follow the Holy Spirit. We pray, too, that our community will continue its vigilance toward vanquishing the virus so we can return to the hill and worship together.
