#### **Know any Good Lawyers?**

Well, I imagine most lawyers wouldn't know this, and I don't know it either. Is it illegal to have a Corpus Christi procession through the streets?

My guess is that the same law applied in Ireland as in England under the Catholic Emancipation legislation.

When the Act of Union was passed two hundred and twenty years ago, Emancipation was due to come in then - but the king felt he couldn't sign the Act, it would break his Coronation Oath. Nearly thirty years later he was going to sign it, then he changed his mind and changed his mind again when the Prime minister said he'd resign if he didn't sign it.

One of the provisions of the 1829 Act was against outdoor Catholic rites and ceremonies. A Blessed Sacrament procession was part of the climax of the 19th International Eucharistic Congress in London 112 years ago this month. Large crowds were expected, the Church had liaised with the Home Office and the police - but five days before the procession they were asked to call it off, it was an illegal procession.

The monarch had demanded action. Edward VII was smarting from the criticism of his recent presence at a Requiem Mass for the assassinated King of Portugal.

The procession went ahead without the Blessed Sacrament: over 1,000 in the procession, thousands lining the route and the event ended with the archbishop giving benediction from the cathedral balcony. Game, set and match to the Catholic Church, declared the secular press.

Another provision of the Act was to limit the Jesuits - but you can ask a lawyer about that!
