

The Caregiver Carry-All Competitive Event is a State Event conducted virtually prior to the NJ FCCLA Fall Leadership Connection. It is an **individual** or **team** event that encourages participants to prepare to be an effective caregiver by planning appropriate portable activities for a specific age group and situation/location. The focus of this event is to create an activity bag that focuses on **Car Safety** and that addresses developmental needs and multiple intelligences.

ELIGIBILITY

1. Participation is open to any affiliated FCCLA member(s). Affiliation for each participant must be submitted by **November 1, 2022**.
2. A chapter may enter two (2) entries in each event category for this event.
3. An entry is defined as one (1) individual participant or one (1) team of no more than three (3) participants.
4. An event category is determined by the participant's grade in school and type of Family and Consumer Sciences program.

PROCEDURES & REGULATIONS

1. The Caregiver Carry-All project must be planned and prepared by the participant(s) only. Supporting resources are acceptable as long as participant(s) directly coordinate the information into the content of their project and the resources are cited appropriately.
2. Participant(s) must be registered and attend the current year's NJ FCCLA Fall Leadership Connection to participate in this event.
3. Participant(s) will compile a collection of digital and tangible items that support activities that can be used to entertain and developmentally stimulate a preschool age group during three to four (3-4) hours of care. Safety should be a primary concern. Participant(s) will develop a resource bag and a digital informational file folder. Participant(s) should plan to include a variety of categories of play such as Quiet Play, Active Play, Cooperative Play, Manipulative Play, Make-Believe Play, Creative Play, and Learning Play.

4. Toys, games, books, arts and crafts, etc. must be items created or found in a home and/or school locations that are in good condition. Participants are not allowed to purchase brand new items for the bags.
5. Participant(s) must plan digital and in person activities/toys/games for preschool age children for 3-4 hours focusing on **Car Safety** that demonstrate the critical safety tips that preschool children need to know, delivered in a fun and entertaining way. The activities should focus self-awareness, social awareness, self-management, responsible decision making, and relationship building.
6. The collection of activities/toys should stimulate cognitive development, motor skills, social skills, and emotional development. These four (4) areas of development can be addressed through the use of diverse learning styles.
7. The suggested attention span of the target age for the child should be noted and taken into consideration as the activities/toys/games are planned. Participant(s) should plan ten to fifteen (10-15) activities.
8. The size of the Carry-All bag (such as a market bag) should not exceed 14" tall by 13" wide by 9" deep. Participant(s) may decorate the bag.
9. Each entry will have an assigned folder to submit their project materials via Google Drive. A link to submit materials will be provided to the adviser upon competitive event registration. All entries must be submitted by **November 9, 2022**, and privacy settings must be viewable to anyone with the link.
10. Each entry must submit the following materials and they must be labeled in the Student Folder:
 - A. **A Project Identification Page**
 - B. **Activities Plan**
 - C. **Summary Page**
 - D. **Document of up to 15 photos**
 - E. **Works Cited Page**

CAREGIVER CARRY-ALL SPECIFICATIONS

Digital File Folder

Each entry will have an assigned digital folder to submit their project materials via Google Drive. A link to submit materials will be provided to the adviser upon competitive event registration. All entries must be submitted by **November 9, 2022** and privacy settings must be viewable to anyone with the link or saved as a PDF.

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| Project Identification Page | One-page document must include participant(s) name(s), school, chapter name, event name, event category, child age group, and situation/location. |
| Activities Plan | One document, not to exceed three (3) pages, describe each activity and list(s) the materials needed and how each is used. Connect each activity to the developmental needs of the age group with multiple learning styles. Explain the role that safety plays for each activity. The plan and its activities should be innovative, meet the developmental needs of preschoolers, and address multiple learning styles. The plan should occupy the child for the given time period, stating approximate times for each activity. |
| Summary Page | One-page document to explain the value of researching and preparing for a care giving experience and the importance of addressing developmental needs and multiple learning styles. |
| Photo Documentation | Provide up to 15 clear pictures of the carry-all bag and the contents. One photo should be of the bag neatly packed. The other photos should show all of the contents of the bag. |

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| Works Cited | One-page document to list all references and how the research was conducted using MLA or APA format. |
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Carry-All Bag

Participant(s) will compile a collection of activities that can be used to entertain and developmentally stimulate a preschool age group during several hours of care. Photos of the carry all bag must be submitted with the digital file folder.

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| Material Condition | Materials are well chosen, in good condition, and accurately reflect the activities plan. |
| Appropriate Materials | Materials are age-appropriate and safe for preschool age children. |
| Diverse Materials | Materials are diverse, creative, meet the developmental needs of preschoolers, and address multiple learning styles. |
| Bag | Bag is effective, functional, and organized. |
