August 8, 2016

The Horse Cave City Council met in regular session Monday, August 8, 2016 at 6:00 P.M. at City Hall. Present were Mayor Randall Curry, council members Vickie Rogers, Maronda Gibson, Perry Martin, Alan Harper, Jackie Buckingham, and David Lindsey. Mayor Curry declared that a quorum was present and called the meeting to order.
