September 1, 2021 "Feeding Birds in Autumn and Winter"

He will show examples of feeders, suggestions of seed varieties and recommend ideal sites to place feeders for your best viewing and enjoyment.

October 6, 2021 7:00pm "Discover Pollinating Bees"

Discover the importance of pollinating bees. Steve Klima will show a video of their activities and explain the value of this essential species. Now is the time to prepare for introducing and preserving Pollinating Bees for your garden. Fall and winter is the perfect time to build your own bee houses and to order your dormant bees for Spring! What fun it is to have a rearing experience of building your own Bee House to protect and attract essential pollinating bees! It will make the dreary days of winter spark the excitement of looking forward to the long-awaited spring and have the joy of knowing you are making a difference in the pollinator's community. Then he'll have directions on building your own "bee house" and have contacts for ordering your dormant bees and any other supplies you may need.

Spring Valley Update for September/October Newsleaf – 2021

Spring Valley's facilities and programs officially opened on July 1 with regular hours and little to no restrictions in regard to numbers of visitors! Due to recent spikes in COVID infections, and in line with state of Illinois mandates, the Park District is once again requiring all visitors to wear a mask when inside our facilities regardless of their vaccination status. Some facility hours were changed this summer, and these changes will be permanent. See below.

- Spring Valley's grounds and walking trails remain open for walkers every day from 8am-8pm throughout the summer. Portable toilets are available near Merkle Cabin and Heritage Farm; the new restrooms near Bison's Bluff Nature Playground are now operational and open every day until 8pm. New picnic shelters are also open for use near the Nature Center.
- The auxiliary parking at St. Matthew's Church is available every day. The gate leading onto Heritage Farm's walking paths is opened every morning and locked at night.
- The **Nature Center Museum** is open to visitors every day from 10am-6pm., including the restrooms, drinking fountain and vending.
- Volkening Heritage Farm's Visitor Center is open to visitors every Wednesday-Sunday from 10am-4pm. The historic farmhouse at Heritage Farm is also open during these times. NOTE that livestock returned to Heritage Farm back in May. There are two cattle, four pigs and a large flock of poultry. Staff is once again dressing out in period clothing any day the farmhouse is open, and interpreting late 19th century farm life.
- **Bison's Bluff Nature Playground** is open daily from 10am-6:45pm in September and 10am-5:30pm in October, except during inclement weather. We are continuing to staff the playground in order to maintain appropriate visitor capacities. 1-hour play sessions are scheduled throughout the day, and an admission fee is being charged for all children between 2 and 12 years of age. Reservations are not required but available online to ensure admission on busy days. Admission is \$2/resident or \$3/non-resident.
- The **Monarch Rearing Program** resumed in early August, with daily butterfly releases behind the Nature Center. Volunteers have been helping to rear limited numbers of monarchs, while many people continue to raise them at home. Butterfly releases take place (dependent on weather and availability of butterflies) at 11:05am and at 2:50pm. every day until the end of September.
- A number of other programs and special events will be offered throughout the autumn (see descriptions below).
- Volunteers continue to assist with outdoor conservation projects, trail maintenance, and with some of our modified events and programs. If you are willing and able to assist with projects, please contact Brenda Korecky at brkorecky@parkfun.com.

Autumn Events & Programs

NOTE: On-line pre-registration is required for all of the programs listed below, and pre-registration is available but not required for some special events. Nearly all classes have limited capacity and will be held outdoors whenever possible. Hop & Vine Fest – Sat., October 2, 4:00-7:00pm

A night of wine, brews and food – sponsored by the Schaumburg Park Foundation and Schaumburg Bank & Trust. This popular adult evening event returns to Spring Valley this year as an early autumn fundraiser in support of Schaumburg park projects and program scholarships for families in need. Tickets are \$60/person and can be purchased online at www.SchaumburgParkFoundation.org. Attendees will receive wine, beer and food sampling tickets that can be redeemed at the various vendor tents – all outdoors! Live music will also be provided. Parking for the event is at Conant HS, with a shuttle bus transporting attendees to the Nature Center. Must be 21 or older to attend.

Concert at the Cabin – Sat., September 11, 4:00-7:00pm

The Spring Valley Community Concert Band will be back this year for an evening of wonderful music under the shelter next to Merkle Log Cabin. Bring your own picnic dinner — Ravinia-style — or purchase grilled food and beverages from our vendor. You may also bring your own seating or blanket; however, there will be some picnic table seating provided. Park at the Nature Center and take the wagon shuttle to the Cabin or make the short walk from St. Matthew's Church parking lot to the Cabin area. The music begins at 5:00pm. Admission fee is \$3/person or \$12/family.

Trails & Ales – Sat., September 25, 4:00-7:00pm

This popular adults-only offering is back this year with a new format. Small pre-registered groups will depart at different start times, following the 'ale trail' to sample a variety of craft beers paired with tasty hors d'oeuvres, breads, and dessert items. Wear comfortable walking shoes and prepare for a culinary adventure! Pre-registration required! Fee is \$20/resident or \$25/non-resident.

Harvest Celebration – Sun., October 17, 12:00-4:00pm

This down-sized version of Spring Valley's popular Autumn Harvest Festival will feature demonstrations of 19th century farm life, kid's crafts and games, live music, food, and more. Parking is available at the Nature Center or at St. Matthew's Church. Admission fee is \$4/person or \$16/family.

Trick or Treating at Spring Valley – Sat., October 30, 12:00-4:00pm

Dress in your Halloween best and bring the kids out to trick or treat along the trails at Spring Valley! Preregistration is required for this special event, with limited capacities for each start time during the day. Park at St. Matthew's Church and begin your Halloween adventure at Heritage Farm. The trick or treat trail will then head out into the woods, eventually bringing you back to the Farm. Registration deadline is Oct. 27! Fee is \$4/resident or \$6/non-resident.

Heritage Farm Monthly Themes

Heritage Farm will continue hosting a different theme each month. Every Saturday and Sunday in September, stop by the farmhouse to learn about the amazing, shape-shifting pretzel. Then, visit the Farm's Museum Shop to purchase a warm pretzel! In October, the versatile apple will be showcased with demonstrations in the farmhouse and apple treats available in the Museum Shop.

Farm to Table Series

For an in-depth dive into traditional cooking and unique recipes, these instructional programs provide you with all of the tools and know-how to create delicious dishes at home. **Hand Twisted Pretzels** will be offered on Sat., September 11 from 10:30am-noon; **Apple Everything** will be offered on Sat., October 9 from 10:30am-noon. Pre-registration is required; fee is \$16/resident or \$20/non-resident.
