MAINTAINING YOUR DELIVERANCE—IMPARTING GOD'S WORD

God's word In my first pamphlet: Jul-Aug 2008, I explained the steps needed in order to maintain

With the infilling of the Holy Ghost came awesome benefits to the believer. God gave us "The Fruit of the Spirit" Gal. 5:22-23. Unfortunately, due to self-will, disobedience, flesh, unforgiveness, anger, and a slew of evil spirits, God's fruit doesn't prosper in our lives as they could. We're not consistently fruitful. We are joyful and gentle one day, but two days later we can't stand people. Jesus Christ consistently expressed His fruit. The fruit of the Spirit is Christs' character, His nature.

The Fruit of The Spirit

Firstly, Renounce sin, Bind, Rebuke, and Cast out evil spirits and demons from "Prayers That Rout Demons," and "The Demon Hit List." Following are the declarations of scripture regarding Gal. 5:22-23. Speak them aloud & in faith, using "In the name of Jesus."

I. Love: Loving God & Others-Matt. 22:37-39. "I love the Lord my God with all my heart and with all my soul and with all my mind, and I love my neighbor as myself." Agape Love-I Cor. 13:4-7. "My love is patient, it is kind, it does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud, it is not rude, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no records of wrongs. My love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres." 2. Joy-Gladness of heart. I John I:4. "My joy is complete & full in God through Jesus Christ. For I am joyful in hope, patient in affliction, faithful in prayer." 3. Peace-No worries. Is. 53:5. "I live in peace & I command peace in my atmosphere because, lesus was punished for my sins so that I may have peace. For the punishment that brought me peace was upon Him & by His wounds I was healed." Peacemaker. Ps. 34:13-14. "I am a peacemaker & peacekeeper for I seek peace and pursue it. I speak no evil or lies. I keep my tongue from evil and my lips from

speaking lies. I turn from evil and do good. I seek peace and pursue it." 4. Longsuffering: Patient endurance. 2 Tim. 4:2. "I manifest the spirit of longsuffering for I preach the word, being instant in season and out of season. Reproving, rebuking, and exhorting with all longsuffering and doctrine." 5. Gentleness-Not severe, rough, or violent. Polite, kind, respectable. Titus 3:2. "I manifest the spirit of gentleness. For I speak evil of no man, I am no brawler, but I am gentle, showing all meekness to all men." 6. Goodness-Moral excellence that's consistently maintained in spite of evil influences or temptations. Kind, generous. Ps. 34:14. "I manifest the spirit of goodness for I depart from evil and do good, I seek peace and pursue it." 7. Faith-Confidence in the testimony of another. Col. 1:23. "I continue in the faith, grounded and settled. I'm not moved away from the hope of the gospel." 8. Meekness-True humility. Col. 3:12. "I am Gods chosen people, holy and dearly loved, so I clothe myself with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience." 9. Temperance-Self control; habitual moderation in any indulgence or appetite. Prov. 16:32, 1 Cor. 9:27. "I am temperate in all things. I am slow to anger and I rule my spirit. I keep under my body and bring it into subjection."
