

• CHILDREN'S MESSAGE

Theme: Reformation Sunday **Scripture**: 1 Kings 5:1-5; 8:1-13 **Items Needed**: Play Dough

Good morning girls and boys! Happy reformation Day! Today is a day to celebrate! Did you notice I'm wearing red today. Also, look, the Church is wearing red today too. Do you know why we're wearing red to celebrate Reformation Day? Red is the color that reminds us of God's Holy Spirit. On this day over 500 years ago a Catholic Monk named Martin Luther nailed 95 problems he saw in his Church to the doo of his Church Building. Back in those days that was like how your teachers put things on the bulletin board at school.

That seems like a pretty weird thing to celebrate doesn't it? Well what we're really celebrating is how those 95 problems that Martin Luther noticed became the starting point for how the entire Church reformed. Reformation... That's a pretty big word isn't it? But if we look closely we can see some smaller words we might be able to recognize and understand. How about Re-Form or Re-Formation. That just means to change shape.

Here's what I mean. I have this play dough here and it's in the shape of... What? That's right a circle. Suppose this circle is the Church. I think the shape for the Church is a little off. So I'm going to make some changes. I'll fold this piece here. Next I'll fold this over here. Now, that makes a better chape for the Church. It's a heart. I re-Formed the play dough from a circle into a heart. Does this have the same amount of play dough? Is it the same color? The only thing that changed is the shape.

That's what it means to reform. When Martin Luther identified 95 problems it wasn't just him who changed the Church. In fact is wasn't all the Church people even. It was the work of God's Holy Spirit. That's why we wear Red today. To remind us of the work of the Holy Spirit. We remember that if things go wrong we can always change and fix it. The reformation didn't just happen once and then it was done and over. Reformation Sunday reminds us we can always change. We can always be better. We can always do better at following Jesus and loving God and loving our neighbors. That's really Good News!

Let's pray before you get to go downstairs for Sunday School... Dear God, Thank you for your Holy Spirit that calls us together and helps us understand your instructions for us. Thank you for the reformers in the Church like Martin Luther. Help us to always try to reform ourselves to be better at loving you and loving one another. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

• SCRIPTURE READING: 1 Kings 5:1-5; 8:1-13

P: Our scripture reading is from the Book of 1 Kings, Chapters 5 and 8.

C: Glory to you O Lord.

5 Now King Hiram of Tyre sent his servants to Solomon, when he heard that they had anointed him king in place of his father; for Hiram had always been a friend to David. ²Solomon sent word to Hiram, saying, ³"You know that my father David could not build a house for the name of the Lord his God because of the warfare with which his enemies surrounded him, until the Lord put them under the soles of his feet. ⁴But now the Lord my God has given me rest on every side; there is neither adversary nor misfortune. ⁵So I intend to build a house for the name of the Lord my God, as the Lord said to my father David, 'Your son, whom I will set on your throne in your place, shall build the house for my name.'"

 \mathbf{Q} Then Solomon assembled the elders of Israel and all the heads of the tribes, the Oleaders of the ancestral houses of the Israelites, before King Solomon in Jerusalem, to bring up the ark of the covenant of the Lord out of the city of David, which is Zion. ²All the people of Israel assembled to King Solomon at the festival in the month Ethanim, which is the seventh month. ³And all the elders of Israel came, and the priests carried the ark. ⁴So they brought up the ark of the Lord, the tent of meeting, and all the holy vessels that were in the tent; the priests and the Levites brought them up. ⁵King Solomon and all the congregation of Israel, who had assembled before him, were with him before the ark, sacrificing so many sheep and oxen that they could not be counted or numbered. ⁶Then the priests brought the ark of the covenant of the Lord to its place, in the inner sanctuary of the house, in the most holy place, underneath the wings of the cherubim. ⁷For the cherubim spread out their wings over the place of the ark, so that the cherubim made a covering above the ark and its poles. ⁸The poles were so long that the ends of the poles were seen from the holy place in front of the inner sanctuary; but they could not be seen from outside; they are there to this day. ⁹There was nothing in the ark except the two tablets of stone that Moses had placed there at Horeb, where the Lord made a covenant with the Israelites, when they came out of the land of Egypt. ¹⁰And when the priests came out of the holy place, a cloud filled the house of the Lord, ¹¹so that the priests could not stand to minister because of the cloud; for the glory of the Lord filled the house of the Lord.

¹²Then Solomon said, "The Lord has said that he would dwell in thick darkness. ¹³I have built you an exalted house, a place for you to dwell in forever."

• SERMON

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and from the one who destroyed and rebuilt the temple in three short days, Jesus Christ our Lord, amen.

Today is not only Reformation Sunday, but also Reformation Day! On this day in the year 1517, 504 years ago, Martin Luther and Catholic Monk in Wittenberg Germany nailed 95 debating points to the town church door. This sparked what has become known as the Protestant Reformation. In today's scripture reading Solomon believes he is fulfilling the promise God made to Solomon's father, King David, by constructing a marvelous temple on the same site where Abraham nearly sacrificed the first heir to God's promise of a great dynasty and a land flowing with milk and honey to go along with it. Trouble is, Solomon wasn't listening to God and instead followed his own wishes and desires. The excerpt we read from this epic saga this morning tells the tale of King Hiram of Tyre who had heard of the death of his BFF David and the crowning of David's son Solomon to King David's thrown. He wanted to send a gesture of good will and love to David's son in hopes that they could also become BFFs.

Do you remember the song, "That's What Friends Are For?" It was a big hit back in 1986, earning a Grammy and many other awards. Here's a few lines from that song: For good times and bad times, I'll be on your side forever more, That's what friends are for... We see in today's scripture a king from a foreign nation who was a good friend of David. He then also became a good friend of David's son Solomon. When Solomon calls on King Hiram of Tyre, he will kindly fulfill all of Solomon's requests. Solomon had desired to build a great temple for the Lord God, but was that what God really wanted from Solomon? Solomon's desire to build this house for God wasn't based on God's call in his life, but on a misunderstanding of the promise God made to his father, King David. Solomon really wanted the glory and splendor as shown in the building of a Temple to YHWH to reflect on himself, not on the glory of God. Despite God's lack of enthusiasm for the project, He was at the same time allowing it with reservations. Underneath all the splendor God already saw the cracks appearing.

The house that YHWH had really wanted Solomon to build had been a spiritual house made up of his sons and daughters, not a house of wood and stone. God desired David and then in turn Solomon to raise up sons and daughters who would be faithful and follow God's commandments. This temple building project had its start back in the book of Second Samuel, Chapter 7 where David intended

to build the temple in Jerusalem, but God, through the prophet Nathan, stopped him. God told David that instead of David building a house for God that God would build a house for him. The concentration throughout this story should not be on the building of a brick and mortar Temple, but on the building of a dynasty which would result finally in the arrival of the Coming King. 'YHWH tells David that he will make him a house (dynasty) -- your seed – God will make a dynasty for God's Name and God will establish the throne of his kingship forever -- and David's house, his kingship, will be established forever, through his dynasty... YHWH's emphasis was thus on the promise of the foundation of a dynasty which would finally result in the everlasting King, the one we call Jesus who is the Messiah and our Savior and our Lord forever and forever. The truth is that in building the physical house and being satisfied with it and putting too much emphasis on it, Solomon did in fact miss out on the need to build a spiritual house. It would only be because of God's activity that the spiritual house would come to a reality in our Lord Jesus Christ. On the other hand, God did in His graciousness accept the physical house from their hands, simply because He knew they were bringing it to Him from a right attitude of heart. He recognized and made allowance for our human weakness.

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YHWH's allowing of the building of the Temple would have caused no problem if only Israel (and later the Jews) had recognized the physical Temple was only a symbol of the 'spiritual house' that YHWH would establish in the Coming King. How different history would have been in that case. They did partly grasp it in the idea of the coming of the Messiah, they had totally wrong ideas about Him, and overall both failed to recognize Him when He came, or to recognize that His coming signaled the demise of the Temple which had lost its significance with His coming. They had become wedded to the Temple. To them the Temple had become more important than the Messiah. Similar blindness to some extent pervades much of the church today. We too tend to make our Church Buildings into idols. In the Temple Solomon built the Hebrew people established elaborate procedures for animal sacrifice in order to have their sins washed away by the spilling of the blood of the sacrifice. I certainly hope none of you believe that your sins are forgiven based on the amount of money that you put in the offering plate. To the extent we look to our physical Temple as the only place to worship the living God or the place where non-Scriptural sacrifices of our time. Talents, and treasures provide for our forgiveness, then we also have failed to recognize that the physical Temple as well as the entire sacrificial system has outlived its usefulness. Sacrificial giving as a way to rid ourselves of our sin is no longer a valid option.

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That system has been fully replaced by Jesus Christ Himself and our own bodies have become the spiritual Temple of the Holy Spirit (1 Corinthians 3.16).

I say all of this to show you how the Church has been in need of constant reforming since it first began. David needed Nathan to remind him of God's Word and God's will. Unfortunately, Solomon either didn't have a Nathan to bring him back to God or, if he did Solomon ignored him. In our day, I've heard the saying many times that we don't go to Church, we are the Church. That saying has been uttered so many times it's become just another slogan or platitude, but it is still true.

In the book of First Peter, Chapter 2 Peter writes: "³ if indeed you have tasted that the Lord is good. ⁴ Come to him, a living stone, though rejected by mortals yet chosen and precious in God's sight, and ⁵ like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. ⁶ For it stands in scripture: "See, I am laying in Zion a stone, a cornerstone chosen and precious; and whoever believes in him will not be put to shame." (1 Pet. 2:3-6 NRS)

Today God's House has added a new living stone, Helena Proffitt. Helena, as you will in just a few minutes make your promises before this congregation and

before your God, you will take your place in God's Spiritual Temple. Today, you

become part of the Spiritual Church in your own right. At your Baptism others made promises for you, but today you stand on your own and those promises are now yours to keep, with God's help and the help of all of us as well. Jesus has called your name and you now have your opportunity to respond. My prayer for you and for all those here in this congregation is that we continue to ask for God's leadership and for God's Holy Spirit to guide us. The Church today is in need of reform just as much as in David's time, in Solomon's time, in Martin Luther's time. Maybe even more. Today we're faced with issues and divisions that seem to defy human understanding. We're divided on everything from politics, to wearing of masks during Worship. How do we know God's true will for us in this kind of divided culture? I don't have every answer. I wish I did. I do know one thing to be true that we can all count on. Through Jesus, God has revealed his intentions for us and for all mankind. God became human to show us that He doesn't desire our eternal punishment for our sin, but rather God's only desire is to save us from our sin. I also know that when we pray and ask for God's help and guidance, even if we make mistakes and do the wrong thing, God is gracious and merciful. God forgives our every mistake and our every sin. So, with nothing to lose and everything to gain, why not act boldly and do our best to follow what we believe to

be God's lead. Luther put it this way, "Sin boldly, but love the Lord Jesus Christ even more boldly.

The question for all of us today comes down to this: are you willing to follow the leading of God's Holy Spirit even if you're not 100 percent certain of the call? May you hear and listen to that still small voice of God whispering in your ear. May you use the teachings of the one universal catholic Church and the wise council and advice of your sisters and brothers in Christ here at Trinity to help you discern God's voice from all the others that demand your attention. May you willingly join in as one of the living stones that make up God's Spiritual Temple, the one God intended to build all along. I for one am blessed to be a small part in that temple and I pray you are too. Amen.

Bless this meal and all those who share it; inspire your people for service; continue the reformation of your churches; and renew the world with your mercy, with your healing, your justice, and your peace, with the joy of life in your household.


