School Year Programs

Background

As the new school year is around the corner, we at Bravo, are excited to welcome back our young artists for the school year programming. Our school year programs are artistic outlets for young performers, no matter if you are attending in person or virtually.

In light of the COVID-19 pandemic, we want to assure you that Bravo Creative Arts is taking the necessary steps and protection to make sure all artists and staff remain safe and healthy. The 2020 School Year Safety plan is based off our 2020 Summer Camps Safety plan. The summer camp safety plan was created based on requirements and recommendations from **New York State's Interim Guidance for Child Care and Day Camp Programs During the COVID-19 Health Emergency** document and **Reopening New York Child Care and Day Camp Programs Guidelines** document. For the school year programs, we also have taken guidance from the **Interim Guidance for Low-Risk Indoor Arts & Entertainment During the Covid-19 Public Health Emergency** document.

This document is subject to change- however, any changes will be followed up with an update to parents/guardian. Please understand that our school year programs will be different from years' past. We will be working diligently to make these artistic opportunities memorable at a time when the arts are needed the most.

Arrival and Dismissal

For arrival and dismissal at Bravo Creative Arts, we ask that all artists arrive at a predetermined drop off and pick up location. This information will be sent out in a welcome email. Each vehicle will be greeted by Bravo Staff members, who will be wearing staff shirts.

Temperature Taken:

All artists and staff will have their temperatures taken using a contactless thermometer before entering the building by staff. For artists arriving, the passenger side rear window should be rolled down, allowing the Bravo Staff member to perform a temperature check. The designated staff member will have their hands washed with soap and water and will be wearing gloves and a mask. Temperature must be below 100.4 F to enter the building as per state guidelines.

Daily Questionnaire:

Parents/guardians of artists must answer “yes” or “no” COVID related questions each day as part of sign in, if the child has exhibited any signs of COVID-19 they will not be permitted to enter the building. If your child is sick or not feeling well, please do not bring him/her to the scheduled event.

Hand Sanitizer:

Students should use hand sanitizer upon entering and exiting. Bravo staff will provide the hand sanitizer at the designated drop-off area and throughout the rehearsal.

Artists must keep masks on upon entering and exiting the building

Masks

Along with wearing masks while entering and exiting the building, students must wear masks any time it is seen necessary by staff. These decisions will be made based off of New York State guidelines. Students may take off their masks during breaks while keeping social distancing (over 6 feet apart, etc).

We will encourage all artists to bring their own masks from home. However, we will have some extra masks in the rehearsal space as needed. All Bravo staff and volunteers will be required to wear masks any time they are working with artists and cannot keep adequate distance.

During rehearsals, students must wear masks. However, during performances, face shields may be used in addition or in place of masks during performance.

Performances

At this time, live performances with audience have not been permitted by New York State and we are unsure of when they will be allowed. As guidelines are changing frequently, we have two possible plans for performances. We will keep families posted as we know more from New York State.

Performance Plan #1:

We plan on showing our work in the same way we did our summer camp programs. Throughout the rehearsal process we prepared artists for filming. At the end of the rehearsal process, they wore their costumes and did their scenes, music, and dancing in front of a camera. The recordings went through an editing process and was uploaded as a private video on YouTube for friends and family.

Performance Plan#2:

In the event that live performances are permitted, we will reach out to families about dates and times as well as safety policies that are recommended by New York State. We expect to allow 50 audience members or 25% capacity for attendees. Each artist will be allowed two tickets to the performance prior to opening it up to additional family members and friends. Details are subject to change based on New York State guidance.

In Unlikely Chance of Issue

In the unlikely event that an artist is suspected to have COVID-19 or exhibited symptoms of COVID-19, the artist immediately will be brought to an area without other students. A Bravo staff member will notify parents/guardians to pick up the artists. Parents/guardians must stay in the vehicle while picking up potentially sick artists. A Bravo Staff member will escort them from the building to the vehicle.

If an artist is tested and the test comes back positive, the artists will not be admitted to return to Bravo until the mandatory quarantine has ended and a new test comes back negative. Bravo will work in conjunction with the Monroe County Department of Health and Recreation Centers to notify those who may have come in contact with the individual. Any positive test result will remain confidential in accordance with New York State guidance.

Per CDC guidance, anyone exhibiting any symptoms must stay at home or will be sent home until cleared to return. Students should also stay home if others with whom they live with exhibit the onset of any COVID-19 symptoms or have tested positive.

Additionally...

If New York State guidelines change, we will update this packet to send to impacted programs. Also, if the Finger Lakes Regions takes a step back due to COVID-19 and is no longer in Phase 4, Bravo will reassess upcoming programs and offer options to enrolled families.

Drinking fountains will not be available this year due to COVID-19 risks. Please bring a water bottle.

If you or someone in your immediate family has traveled outside of New York to state that is on New York's travel advisory list, you must complete your mandatory 14-day quarantine before returning Bravo programs.
