My beloved Wisconsin siblings in Christ,

I greet you in this New Year. 2020 has been a wilderness challenge for us, but we are a people of the Good News – we are not through the wilderness yet, but we are striving toward the Promised Land.

I am reminded of God's promise through Moses to Joshua from Deuteronomy 31:7-8, "Then Moses summoned Joshua and said to him in the sight of all Israel: 'Be strong and bold, for you are the one who will go with this people into the land that the Lord has sworn to their ancestors to give them; and you will put them in possession of it. It is the Lord who goes before you. He will be with you; he will not fail you or forsake you. Do not fear or be dismayed."

I want us all to hear the promise of Moses – God is with us. God will not fail or forsake us. We should leave behind fear and dismay and trust in the Lord. It is easy for us in Wisconsin to think we are through the wilderness that the COVID pandemic caused because the numbers of new cases are falling. But as we look at the rest of our country, we see that there is still a long way to go.

But we have good news of vaccines, and a deeper commitment to wearing masks, and healthy social distancing. Our churches have been praised and affirmed for not holding in-person services and meetings, for taking every possible precaution to protect each other and to use creative means of staying connected.

We may need to continue this way for months to come, but with the brightening light of the Promise Land, growing ever brighter. I am so proud of all the precautions and safety measures our laity and clergy members have taken. Well done, good and faithful stewards. Now let us stay the course for the necessary months ahead so that when we return fully to our sanctuaries and churches, we do so with the assurance that all will be well, healthy, and thriving.

We understand the deep desire for gathering and being together, but we also need to be aware of, and understand, the risks that gathering poses.

Like John Wesley's Three Simple Rules, we have adapted Three Simple Rules for Re-Entry: Be Cautious:

To determine your best next steps as a local congregation, we recommend that you follow your local County Health Department Guidelines for gathering. Information pertaining to your county's guidelines and county/public health numbers can be found here: Wisconsin County Information. We encourage your leadership team to access the vaccine information on the Wisconsin Health Department website and share it with your congregation. We also encourage everyone to get a flu shot if they have not done so already. We ask that you remember John Wesley's rule of "Do No Harm" when making your decisions for re-entry. Please remember the vulnerable in your congregations and communities when developing your re-entry plan.

Be Gracious:

We ask that you show grace to those who may have differing opinions of what the re-entry process may be for your church and congregation. Be gracious to those who may choose to remain in a virtual setting, or choose to safely worship in person, whether that be laity or clergy.

We ask that you encourage one another while making these hard decisions. Work collaboratively and creatively with one another. Remain respectful of the decisions that your laity and clergy leadership are making regarding whether to open the building or not.

Be Flexible:

Be mindful that cases, vaccines, and information are changing daily. Remain flexible with your re-entry plan knowing that you may have to pivot back to virtual. Make a plan that has tiered phases to it so that you can quickly adjust without having to have an "all or nothing" plan. Finally, please remember to follow the CDC guidelines of social distancing, mask-wearing, and proper hygiene. CDC Guidelines

Experts are recommending proper ventilation and air purification systems.



Concerns for the group members were shared- Jim & Mary Beede unable to attend today due to Jim's recent injury, and Cheri's upcoming surgery on her ankle.

<u>Old business</u>- discussed projects finished in December (School donation, Christmas cards for our college students, and the Christmas Family collection). Per Pastor Paul another family was also supported due to a sudden need. Care-Net baby bottle collection nearing completion and we need all bottles returned.

New business: Made tentative plans for projects that we felt needed to be done in 2021.

We decided to try planning our Special Sunday offerings and our local projects on a quarterly basis. Last year we made a yearly plan and then the pandemic hit causing that plan to need major adjustment. (Despite that, we were able to accomplish amazing things for missions due to the help of our congregation!)

We discussed the Special Sunday offerings and the new system that has been initiated by the UMC. Anson United Methodist Administrative Board Meeting 1-25-2021

Present: Pastor Paul, Lee Crogg, Kim King, Kathy Cernohous, Jean McIlquham, Don Hauser

The meeting was called to order by Kim. Pastor Paul opened with prayer.

The secretary's report from the conference call meeting on 10/29/20 was read approved.

Treasurer's Report: Balance in the general account is \$16,147. Balance in the stained- glass fund is \$31,997.50. Balance in the Memorial is \$4131.04. Don reported expenses in 2020 of \$15,447.74. Income in 2020 was \$10,872.50 from membership and \$3031 from other sources; \$396 from the glass sale, \$135 from an insurance rebate, \$1500 grant from the Methodist Church foundation, \$1000 in memory of Pastor Dave Busker from Tom Roycraft. Members are often mailing their donations directly to Don. 2020 apportionments have been paid.

Old business: The total income from the December glass sale was \$4746. \$396 was returned to the general fund from donations, sales of pickles, honey, crafts, etc. The glass fund has provided several donations: \$410 was donated to the Jim Falls Food pantry, \$500 to the Open Door Clinic, \$500 to the homeless in Chippewa and \$500 to the Jim Falls school playground fund. Kaye Vaughn, from the Holcombe Church, is closing her stained glass studio and has donated about \$5000 in glass supplies to Anson. A \$200 donation was sent to the Holcombe church as she designated. Church Mutual has provided a water sensor, now placed in the woman's bathroom. It will alert us to a broken pipe. Don tested the sensor by putting water on the floor. He received both a text message and a phone call to alert to the water spill. He also received a message when the problem was resolved. The service is at no-charge.

SPRC report: There has not been a recent SPRC meeting.

New Business: Don reports receiving the \$1500 grant. There was discussion about using the funds to purchase a projector and screen, fixing the leaking kitchen faucet or improving air quality in the basement glass work area. No decision was made. After discussion, it was decided to reopen the church for services beginning on Ash Wednesday, February 17th at 6:45 pm and then on Sundays at 11:15 am. We will follow conference guidelines, with masks required, no singing, collection plate in back, 6 foot distancing, individual prepackaged communion, hand sanitizer and bathroom wipes. The County limits of 15 people in the gathering will be strictly followed. Should it become necessary, Kathy has offered to take reservations, but typically our attendance is under that number. Pastor Paul will continue daily devotions and his on- line church service each Sunday, offered through face book and the church website. A Lent study program is being planned.

Other business: As the cost of fire inspection from Cintas has risen, other alternatives will be researched. The Ezra report is due in February.

Meeting adjourned, Pastor closed with prayer.
