Ponderings From The Pastor

INVESTING IN GOD'S FUTURE: GRATITUDE AND TRUST

AS I WRITE my regular article for this month's <u>Epistle</u>, it is just a couple of days before our next <u>New Beginnings</u> event: the Friday night all-church introduction to the house group sessions, and then the Saturday training event for our house group facilitators. The current plan is to kick off the group meeting process with an all-church covered dish dinner and then the first session <u>together</u> as a large group—this will take place on the first Sunday of Advent (December 2, 2018). Mark your calendars for that day!—and plan for about 45 minutes to an hour for the group meeting following the dinner (the first session topic: *Marks of a Vital Congregation...*I promise to try and keep the sermon short and worship moving along that morning!). The house group meetings themselves will start up in January; keep an eye out for information about registering for one of the house groups! Registration will start on December 2.

AS I PONDER what we will be learning together when everyone gets a chance to see and think about the assessment report (this will happen at the house meetings), I am sure there will be some challenging information! I also know that there will be some things stated which we already know very well, to which we might be tempted to say "well, DUH!" Either way, I wonder what it will say about HOW we spend our time and energy...and the relationship between DOING and BEING.

YOU MIGHT WONDER what I mean by that...and it's simple, really: we are all pretty good at DOING—doing worship, doing mission, doing service projects, doing meetings...in general, "doing church." But, often (too often) we are NOT so good at BEING: taking time for God, to be WITH God in silence and contemplative forms of prayer (meditation, centering prayer, extended silence, etc). Being with God feeds our souls, recharges our spiritual batteries—it heals and makes whole and gives us the "fuel" and the motivation to "do," and enlarges our capacity to love. Worship once a week is <u>not</u> enough. When we do not take time for God we set ourselves up for burnout and "compassion fatigue." Have you ever felt that way?...a bit burned out? A hardened heart that doesn't feel compassion like it should? Overwhelmed with the world's pain (and your own), and not knowing what to do or where to turn?

IN THIS MONTH of Thanksgiving, and as we prepare for intense conversations about what God wants from us, I offer this poetic prayer, which begins with GRATITUDE. That's a <u>great</u> place to start with any kind of contemplation! Read this prayer (from Rev. Steve Garnaas-Holmes' daily prayer blog "*Unfolding Light*," www.tinyletter.com/ stevemgh)..use it, pray it, <u>slowly</u>...come back to it several times before Thanksgiving...and any time you feel a little "burnout" gnawing at your spirit or dogging your heels!

for all you have received,
that you see and that you do not see.
Let your gratitude grow into trust
that you are included in a great wonder;
and entrust yourself to the grace you are given.
Let your trust blossom into compassion

Let your compassion flourish into solidarity,
knowing you are one with those who suffer
and that their wholeness is part of yours.

Let your solidarity bear fruit in justice, working for freedom and fullness of life for all, against all evil and oppression. And when you are most challenged by the forces of injustice, most weary and discouraged, return to gratitude that you are guided, accompanied, empowered and saved; and entrust yourself to the undying love of God.






