From Fr. Francisco's Desk

Dear brothers and sisters,

I was reading a reflection that Pope Francis did last time we read this Gospel in Advent and I invite you to read it: "On this second Sunday of Advent, the Liturgy places us in the school of John the Baptist, who preached "a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins". Perhaps we ask ourselves, "Why do we have to convert? Conversion is about an atheist who becomes a believer or a sinner who becomes just. But we don't need it. We are already Christians. So, we are okay". But this isn't true. In thinking like this, we don't realize that it is precisely because of this presumption — that we are Christians, that everyone is good, that we're okay — that we must convert: from the supposition that, all things considered, things are fine as they are, and we don't need any kind of conversion. But let us ask ourselves: is it true that in the various situations and circumstances of life, we have within us the same feelings that Jesus has? Is it true that we feel as Christ feels? For example, when we suffer some wrongdoing or some insult, do we manage to react without animosity and to forgive from the heart those who apologize to us? How difficult it is to forgive! How difficult! "You're going to pay for this" — that phrase comes from inside! When we are called to share joys or sorrows, do we know how to sincerely weep with those who weep and rejoice with those who rejoice? When we should express our faith, do we know how to do it with courage and simplicity, without being ashamed of the Gospel? Thus, we can ask ourselves so many questions. We're not all right. We must always convert and have the sentiments that Jesus had." What is amazing is that we forget that we are truly called to convert every day and to turn to the Lord. Let us take advantage of Advent to re-center our lives in Christ. Remember that on Monday December 10 at 7 PM we have our Parish Penance Service that is an opportunity to come and accept the call to convert in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Also, Wednesday December 12 we will celebrate Our Lady of Guadalupe with a Mass and a Procession. Finally, next Sunday December 16 at 5 PM we will do our annual parish tree decorating and lighting followed by Hot Chocolate and Christmas Carols at Mother Angela Commons.

Saint Francis de Sales — Pray for us!

Queridos hermanos y hermanas:

Estaba leyendo una reflexión que hizo el Papa Francisco la última vez que leímos este Evangelio en Adviento y los invito a que lo lean: "En este segundo domingo de Adviento, la liturgia nos coloca en la escuela de Juan el Bautista, quien predicó "un bautismo " del arrepentimiento para el perdón de los pecados ". Tal vez nos preguntemos, "¿Por qué tenemos que convertir? La conversión es sobre un ateo que se convierte en un creyente o un pecador que se vuelve justo. Pero no lo necesitamos. Ya somos cristianos. Entonces, estamos bien ". Pero esto no es cierto. Al pensar de esta manera, no nos damos cuenta de que es precisamente por esta presunción, que somos cristianos, que todos somos buenos, que estamos bien, que debemos convertirnos: de la suposición de que, considerando todas las cosas, las cosas están bien como están, y no necesitamos ningún tipo de conversión. Pero preguntémonos: ¿es cierto que en las diversas situaciones y circunstancias de la vida, tenemos dentro de nosotros los mismos sentimientos que Jesús tiene? ¿Es verdad que nos sentimos como Cristo se siente? Por ejemplo, cuando sufrimos alguna mala acción o algún insulto, ¿logramos reaccionar sin animosidad y perdonar de corazón a quienes nos piden disculpas? ¡Qué difícil es perdonar! Que difícil "Vas a pagar por esto" - ¡esa frase viene de adentro! Cuando estamos llamados a compartir alegrías o tristezas, ¿sabemos cómo llorar sinceramente con quienes lloran y se regocijan con quienes se regocijan? Cuando debemos expresar nuestra fe, ¿sabemos cómo hacerlo con valentía y sencillez, sin avergonzarnos del Evangelio? Así, podemos hacernos tantas preguntas. No estamos bien. Siempre debemos convertirnos y tener los sentimientos que Jesús tenía ". Lo sorprendente es que olvidamos que estamos verdaderamente llamados a convertirnos cada día y a volvernos al Señor. Aprovechemos el Adviento para centrar nuestras vidas en Cristo. Recuerde que el lunes 10 de diciembre a las 7 PM tenemos nuestro Servicio de Penitencia Parroquial que es una oportunidad para venir y aceptar el llamado a convertirse en el Sacramento de la Reconciliación. Además, el miércoles 12 de diciembre celebraremos a Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe con una misa y una procesión. Finalmente, el próximo domingo 16 de diciembre a las 5 p.m. haremos nuestra decoración e iluminación anual del árbol parroquial, seguida de chocolate caliente y Villancicos de Navidad en Mother Angela Commons.

San Francisco de Sales - ¡Ruega por nosotros!

Queridos irmãos e irmãs,

Eu estava lendo uma reflexão que o Papa Francisco fez da última vez que lemos este Evangelho no Advento e convido-o a lê-lo: "Neste segundo domingo do Advento, a Liturgia nos coloca na escola de João Batista, que pregou "um batismo de arrependimento pelo perdão dos pecados ". Talvez nos perguntemos: "Por que precisamos nos converter? Conversão é sobre um ateu que se torna um crente ou um pecador que se torna justo. Mas nós não precisamos disso. Nós já somos cristãos. Então, estamos bem ". Mas isso não é verdade. Pensando assim, não percebemos que é precisamente por causa dessa presunção - que somos cristãos, que todos são bons, que estamos bem - que devemos nos converter: da suposição de que, todas as coisas consideradas, as coisas estão bem como estão, e não precisamos de nenhum tipo de conversão. Mas vamos nos perguntar: é verdade que nas várias situações e circunstâncias da vida, temos dentro de nós os mesmos sentimentos que Jesus tem? É verdade que nos sentimos como Cristo se sente? Por exemplo, quando sofremos alguma transgressão ou algum insulto, conseguimos reagir sem animosidade e perdoar de coração aqueles que nos pedem desculpas? Quão difícil é perdoar! Quão difícil! "Você vai pagar por isso" - essa frase vem de dentro! Quando somos chamados a compartilhar alegrías ou tristezas, sabemos como chorar sinceramente com aqueles que choram e se alegram com aqueles que se alegram? Quando devemos expressar nossa fé, sabemos como fazê-lo com coragem e simplicidade, sem nos envergonharmos do Evangelho? Assim, podemos nos fazer tantas perguntas. Não estamos bem. Devemos sempre nos converter e ter os sentimentos que Jesus teve ". O que é surpreendente é que nos esquecemos de que somos verdadeiramente chamados a nos convertermos todos os dias e nos voltarmos para o Senhor. Vamos aproveitar o Advento para recentrar nossa vida em Cristo. Lembre-se que na segunda-feira, 10 de dezembro às 19 horas, temos o nosso Serviço Penitenciário Paroquial que é uma oportunidade para vir e aceitar o chamado para converter no Sacramento da Reconciliação. Além disso, na quarta-feira, 12 de dezembro, celebraremos Nossa Senhora de Guadalupe com uma missa e uma procissão. Finalmente, no próximo domingo, dia 16 de dezembro, às 17 horas, faremos nossa decoração anual de árvore paroquial e iluminação, seguida de Chocolate Quente e Canções de Natal em Mother Angela Commons.


