The other proposal is to prioritize which bills actually get paid, and



which ones don't get paid - which also spells disaster because that means that some demographic of people are going to suffer badly.



Governor Ige recently released a dollar 2.2 million fund overcome environmental hazards at the Kamuela Vacuum Cooling Plant Facility that currently serves the agricultural community Hawai'i Island. The facility has been in dire need of upgrades, including the demolition of an old warehouse as well as the other removal of hazardous structures on the property.

In 2019, the Hawai'i Department of Agriculture set out to better serve the community through expanding facilities at this plant, and it looks like the expansion may also be better serving the environment as well.




