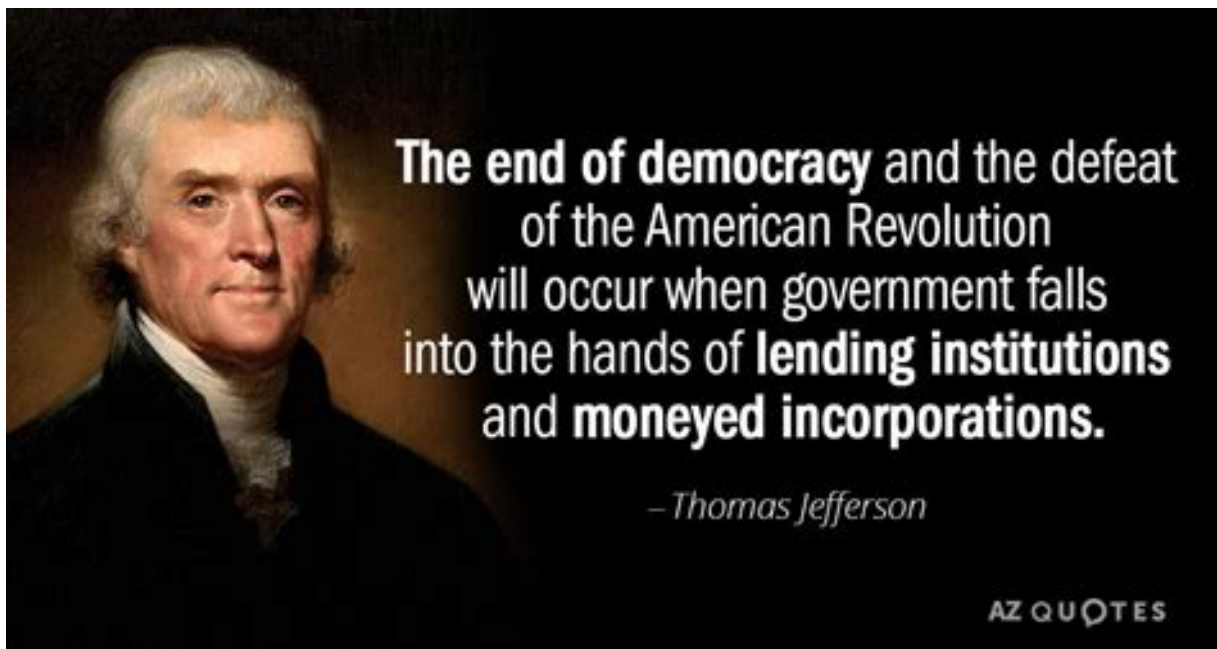

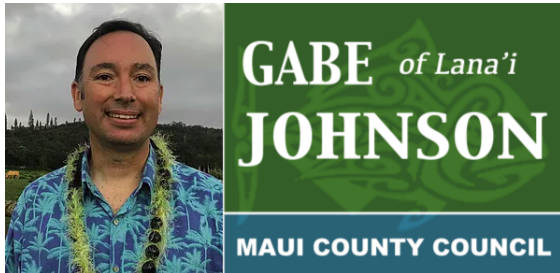
which ones don't get paid - which also spells disaster because that means that some demographic of people are going to suffer badly.

Governor Ige recently released a 2.2 million dollar fund to overcome environmental hazards at the Kamuela Vacuum Cooling Plant Facility that currently serves the agricultural community of Hawai'i Island. The facility has been in dire need of upgrades, including the demolition of an old warehouse as well as the removal of other hazardous structures on the property.

In 2019, the Hawai'i Department of Agriculture set out to better serve the community through expanding facilities at this plant, and it looks like the expansion may also be better serving the environment as well.

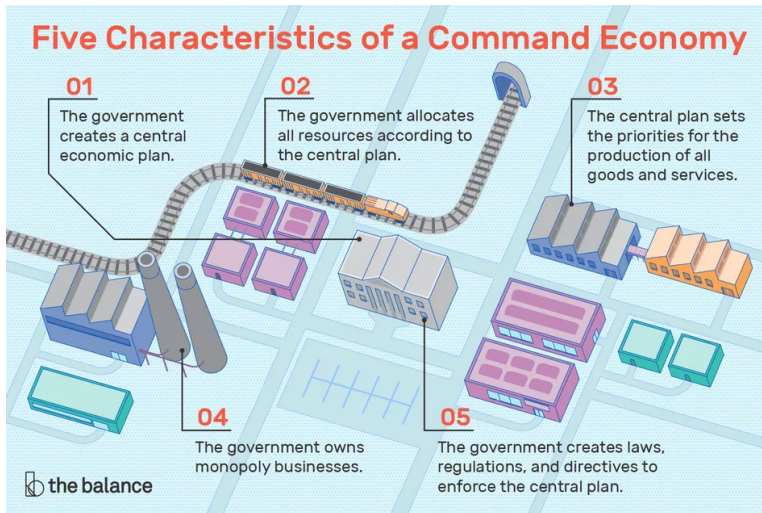

According to the Hawaiian Kingdom Blog, several international consulates have shut their doors in Hawai‘i, and in the legal world there is a chance that this is because Hawai‘i is not legally a state of America. While this news is very new to some, it has been a known fact among the local population for generations already. Why isn't this taught in school? Nobody has the answer for that.

Most recently, Finland and India have removed their consulates following suit with the Czech Republic because of the War Crime violations that America has consistently been in violation of, since the late 1800s.

"The Consular Hawai'i comprises 38 countries, 32 of which are also members of the PCA Administrative Council in The Hague, Netherlands. These countries

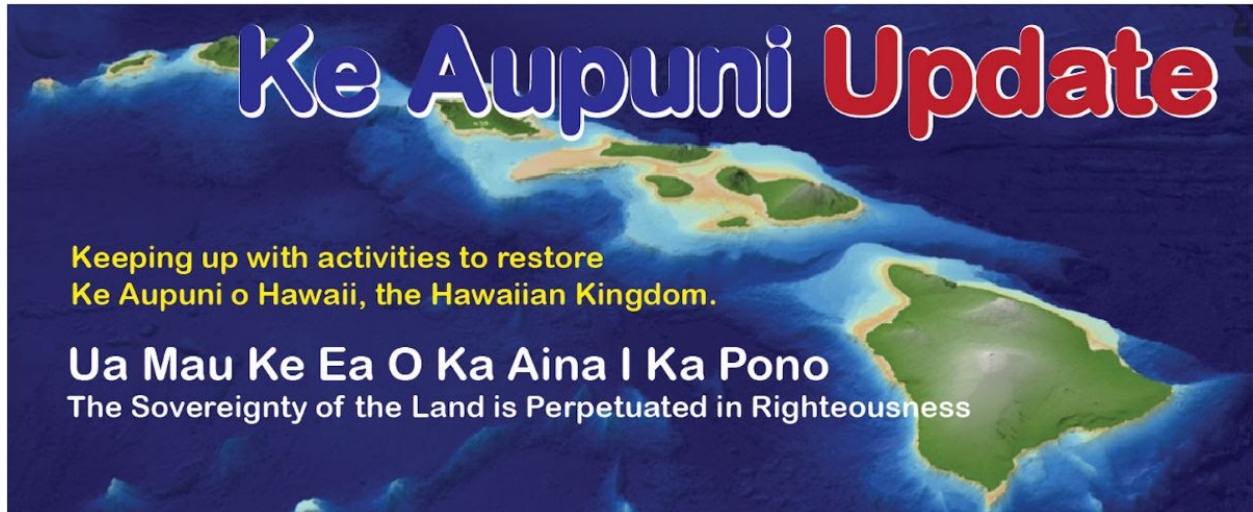
