




Keewaydin Island - Tuesday, January 4, 2022

Keewaydin, accessible only by boat, has become Sarasota Shell Club's premier destination. We have had incredible luck finding pear whelks, paper figs, true tulips, all manner of cockles and even the elusive golden olives and junonia shells. This trip is definitely not to be missed!

Carefree Learner Trip - Friday, January 21, 2022 8:00 am

Cayo Costa State Park - Tuesday, February 1, 2022

Cayo Costa is an excellent beach-combing location accessible by boat out of Bokeelia. Baby ears, golden olives, and many other species may be found here. It is also great for sand dollars. There is the opportunity to snorkel on the bay side. The more intrepid sheller may rent a cabin or tent site on January 31 for the early morning negative tide on February 1. Calusa shell middens may be viewed both in Bokeelia and on Cayo Costa.

Carefree Learner Trip - Tuesday, February 1, 2022 7:00 am

Peanut Island - Sunday, March 20, 2022

Peanut Island is a unique location on Florida's Atlantic Coast. The island is operated as a city park by Palm Beach and is accessible by ferry. Many species found here are uncommon on the Gulf Coast, or anywhere else in Florida for that matter, including Caribbean Fighting Conchs, Partridge Tuns, and Distorsios. Wading and snorkeling increase your chances of locating rare finds. The negative tide is at 4:33 pm, so you may want to bring your tent and reserve a camping spot, allowing you to take advantage of the 5:05 am negative tide on Monday. Don't miss the nearby Flagler Museum if you have the chance.

Fossil Trip - Silent Auction at the Schmelz's

In leu of a fossil pit exploration this trip offers a chance to acquire choice fossil specimens from the collection of paleontologist, Gary Schmelz (Naples, FL). We will meet at a predetermined place and move onto Gary's home where the silent auction will be held. After that we will have chance to move on to the new Marco Island Museum and then for a neat lunch at the Little Bar restaurant in Goodland. There is no cost to the trip (except the fuel). 

Finally, volunteering at our Shell Show is a unique and most rewarding experience!

THE ARTISANS (ongoing)

The Artisan group is asking for a few volunteers who would like to sort and organize some items. There are many other chores that go along with all of the varied items we need to produce. We meet EVERY Thursday on the campus of the Bee Ridge Presbyterian church (Proctor & McIntosh) from 10a.m. to around 1p.m., we would be so happy to have your help. Please consider giving us a few hours sometime. Just show up!

58th SHELL SHOW (February 11 & 12, 2022)

OVERVIEW

There are 2 shifts each day, mornings & afternoons. Please ponder on these opportunities to help your club succeed in this much anticipated Sarasota yearly event. Sign-up sheet will be available at each monthly meeting beginning in October (we are starting early, can you tell we are excited!). **It's SHELLABRATION time!**

- **Volunteer at Large Filled** 

1 volunteer per shift. This flexible person is willing to serve whenever or wherever he/she is needed during the shift. Volunteers will be contacted prior to & during their shift & informed of the area where they are needed.

- **Admission / Entrance Table**

2 volunteers per shift sell the admission tickets, give a little bag of shells, and maintain a log of how visitors learned about the show. Time flies at this table! This opportunity might be challenging for new members.

- **Membership Table No one signed up yet _ Outgoing personalities needed! And we do have many!**

2 volunteers per shift explain the activities of our club, provide brochures and assist with the completion of the membership application. Many visitors are interested and stop at this table to ask questions.

- **Raffle Table 1 place left on Fri afternoon, more on Saturday**

2 volunteers per shift explain how the raffle works and sell tickets. Usually quite busy.

- **Artisans Table**

4 volunteers per shift interact with the public showing interest in the artistic creations for sale. This includes assisting with viewing price tags, wrapping purchases, setting paid ones aside if needed. Chairman Donna Bartels handles the money.

- **Guard of the Artistic Exhibit**

1 volunteer per shift walk around the exhibit area or sit where they can watch for any potential problems, keeping people, in a positive and polite manner, from touching the items/exhibits. All are fragile and people are frequently tempted to TOUCH them. Visitors will ask questions about the award ribbons and interact with volunteers.

- **Club Table (Duane Kauffmann's Table) FILLED** 

2 volunteers per shift sell & package shells that were donated to our club by private collectors. Incredible finds are possible at discounted prices for crafters and treasure hunters. First day involves sorting shells & setting up the table. Basic knowledge of shells is helpful.

- **Lunch area for volunteers FILLED** 

1 volunteer per shift to ensure that only SSC volunteers have access to a free lunch and that the area is maintained clean. Currently, those volunteer positions are filled for 2022.

- **Tablecloths**

On Thursday morning, before the truck's arrival, at least 10 persons are needed to cover each table (excluding dealers') with a tablecloth and secure it with large safety pins.

- **Loading & unloading the truck**

The more per day, the easier! A truck driver is needed on Thursday and on Sunday (both ways)

(1) Load on Wednesday afternoon 2/09/21 at the Artisans room (Bee Ridge Presbyterian Church) corner PROCTOR & McIntosh.

(2) Unload at the Show on Thursday 2/10 after the tablecloths are set-up.

(3) Pack-up, load at the Show from 8:00 A.M. to Noon on Sunday 2/13/21 and then unload at the Artisans' room.

25 Years Ago


President June Bailey opened the January 9, 1997 meeting of the SSC. No attendance data are provided. Treasurer's report showed a balance of \$5037.


Library Notes
