From that time on, Jesus began to preach and say, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand."

As he was walking by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon who is called Peter, and his brother Andrew, casting a net into the sea; they were fishermen. He said to them, "Come after me, and I will make you

fishers of men." At once they left their nets and followed him. He walked along from there and saw two other brothers, James, the son of Zebedee, and his brother John. They were in a boat, with their father Zebedee, mending their nets. He called them, and immediately they left their boat and their father and followed him. He went around all of Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom, and curing every disease and illness among the people.

What would cause Jesus to make such a dangerous move? Are you able to stand up for what is right when you know you will suffer pain or loss when you do? What do you think of Jesus when he acts like this?
- 2. Do you think Jesus needed friends? "At once they left their nets and followed him." How long did it take Peter and Andrew to respond to his invitation? What do you think was going on in their heads and hearts?


"Come with me," you, said.
