Driver Sign-On will commence at 7:20am  
Scrutineering will commence at 7.30am.

The compulsory drivers meeting will begin at 8.30am at the base of the control tower.

**All Scrutineering will cease during the drivers briefing.**

**All Small Car Cup track activity will cease at Completion of the Final race.**

## 1. ENTRIES

- 1.1. Entries open upon publication of these regulations.
- 1.2. Only entries completed by the official entry method and accompanied by the correct fee will be accepted.
- 1.3. This event is open to those competitors holding a current AASA, MA or PWC Racing Licence. To apply for a Racing Licence, please contact us at [smallcarcup@drivetekmotorsport.com](mailto:smallcarcup@drivetekmotorsport.com)
- 1.4. All vehicles must have been registered with **Small Car Cup**.
- 1.5. All drivers must hold an SCCR membership.
- 1.6. Membership Card to be presented at Sign-On. Renewal cards for 2022 will be available at sign-on.
- 1.7. New Competitors can apply at sign on for membership
- 1.8. Entries will close on Tuesday 11<sup>th</sup> January 2022. Late entries will be accepted with a \$50.00 late fee unless grid is full.
- 1.9. We reserve the right to cancel or postpone this event. In the event of a cancellation, moneys will be transferrable to the next event or refunded if another event cannot be scheduled.

## 2. CLASSES OF COMPETITION

- 2.1 3 x classes will be run on the day
  - Class A. 00kW – 64kW
  - Class B. 65kW – 81kW
  - Class C. 82kW – 88kW
- 2.2 Should there be insufficient entries in any competition class, the decision to cancel the class, or to combine classes and re-distribute any awards will be at the discretion of the Event Director or the Clerk of the Course.
- 2.3 Minimum entries at round 1 in any class are 2 cars.

## 3. ENTRY & ENTRY FEE

- 3.1 Entry will be by SCCR on-line entry system only. **Paper entries will be accepted if applied for**
- 3.2 Each entry must be accompanied by payment in full
- 3.3 Entry fee is
  - Small Car Cup \$300.00
  - Additional Driver \$150.00
  - Dorian Timer included in entry fee.

- 3.5 No refunds will be given for not competing in any heat or for failing to attend this event after entry fee is paid.
- 3.6 No entries will be accepted without full payment.
- 3.7 An entry acceptance will be sent to each driver with any additional information.

## 4. SIGN ON

- 4.1 Driver, Pit Crew and Officials Sign-on will be via QR Code with a back-up system.

## 5. DRIVER APPAREL

- 5.1 Driver's apparel shall be as specified in Small Car Cup Regulations.

## 6. VEHICLE AND SAFETY REQUIREMENTS

- 6.1 Vehicles must comply with the Small Car Cup GrpA category regulations - 2022-Version 1a.
- 6.2 Vehicles must also comply with all relevant articles of the SCR's
- 6.3 A minimum four-point safety harness to the SFI 16.1 standard or Internationally Recognised Equivalent must be fitted.
- 6.4 A Frontal Head Restraint system is not required but is highly recommended.
- 6.5 A securely mounted 2lt oil catch can must be fitted to the engine.
- 6.6 An additional throttle return spring must be added to the throttle return system.
- 6.7 Clear or lightly tinted contact must cover headlights.

## 7 SCRUTINEERING

- 7.1 Scrutineering will begin at 7:30am
- 7.2 Vehicles entered in the competition must have passed scrutineering prior to participating in any track activities.
- 7.3 Full driving apparel must be presented at scrutineering.
- 7.4 Vehicles which suffer damage must be re-scrutineered before entering the track again.
- 7.5 Late arrivals to the circuit **MUST** see the Clerk of Course to arrange scrutineering.
- 7.6 Any vehicle presented for scrutineering will be deemed to have started the event.

## 8 DRIVERS BRIEFING

- 8.1 All drivers must attend the compulsory drivers briefing before being permitted onto the track.
- 8.2 Any drivers who arrive late **MUST** see the Clerk of Course to arrange a Drivers Briefing. Failure to do so may result in exclusion from the event.

## 9 RACE NUMBERS

- 9.1 All race vehicles must have their race number and class letter displayed on both front doors (Left and Right) Door numbers to be on a Black or White number square or disc or contrasting colours. Refer: **Small Car Cup & NSWTC Regulations**
- 9.2 A race number and class letter in yellow 150 mm in height is to be displayed on the upper left side of the windscreen and the rear screen.
- 9.3 A class letter must be placed alongside all numbers on the car.
- 9.4 Drivers surname to be across the top of the windscreen.

## 10 TIMING

- 10.1 Timing will be done by ELDEE TIMING SOLUTIONS using Dorian or A&B Timers

## 11 NOISE

- 11.1 The maximum noise limit is 90dB measured at 30 metres.
- 11.2 Noise testing will take place all day. Any car found to exceed the maximum noise emission limit will be suspended from the event until the Chief Scrutineer / Clerk of Course is satisfied that action has been taken to bring it within the limit. Any vehicle that exceeds the limit in two races will be excluded from the remainder of the event.

## 12 PIT LANE

- 12.1 A speed limit of 20 kilometres per hour will apply in pit lane at all times. If this limit is exceeded, the Clerk of Course may impose a penalty.
- 12.2 All vehicles are limited to walking pace only at all times when moving through the rest of the facility. Drivers should be aware of pedestrians and small children in particular.
- 12.3 Smoking is banned in the Pit lane and Paddock area. Designated smoking areas are available. **2 point penalty** applies to anyone smoking in the pit or paddock area at any time on the day.

## 13 FUEL

- 13.1 Only commercially available pump fuel is to be used. 91 – 98 Octane (RON)
- 13.2 No Av Gas or race fuels is to be used.
- 13.3 Fuel can only be stored in 20 litre fuel drums or containers that meet AS1940/AS/NZS2906 or higher in order to comply with OH&S requirements and the Dangerous Goods Act 1985.
- 13.4 There is a maximum of 2 x 20 litre containers per pit or paddock garage at any one time.
- 13.5 Refueling will take place in the designated area accompanied by a fire marshal. All drivers, crew, and passengers must be outside of the vehicles while refueling.

## 14 PIT CREW

- 14.1 Competitors are responsible for the actions of their pit crew.
- 14.2 Only Authorised Pit Crew are permitted into Pit Lane and Marshalling during competition.
- 14.3 All Authorised Pit Crew are required to sign on. Sign on will be via QR Code
- 14.4 All Pit Crew must be appropriately attired as per the Apparel Requirements for Pit/Service Crew.

## 15 PIT WALL AND MARSHALLING

- 15.1 Only persons signed on as an official, a competitor or as Authorised Pit Crew can have access to the Pit Wall during competition.
- 15.2 Spectator viewing is not permitted on Pit Wall during competition.
- 15.3 Only Competitors and Pit Crew can access Pit Wall for signaling and timing purposes.

## 16 MARSHALLING AND STARTERS ORDERS

- 16.1 All competitors are required to report to the marshalling area when nominated to do so.
- 16.2 All competitors must be in position in marshalling ready to race prior to the "Five Minute" warning, to be deemed to have fallen under "Starter's Orders" from this point until the start.
- 16.3 Any competitor who fails to be in position for the starters order, may still be permitted to enter the circuit at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course where:
- Entering the course can be done safely
  - Does not disadvantage other drivers
  - Must start from the rear of field

16.4 Any Car that did not finish the previous heat must start from Pit Lane.

## 17 EVENT FORMAT

### 17.1 Practice and Qualifying.

- A. Practice will be 1 untimed heat of 4 laps each
- B. Qualifying will be a one flying lap shootout.
- C. Any penalties from practice will be carried over to the heats.

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#### 17.2 Heat 1

- A. Heat 1 starting positions will be in order of fastest to slowest from qualifying shoot out regardless of class A B or C.
- B. Starting Single file, a rolling start behind the Pace Car, the heat will be 10 Laps.
- C. The winners will be the first one in each class to take the chequered flag

#### 17.3 Heat 2

- A. Heat 2 starting positions will be in finishing order of heat 1 finishing positions regardless of class A B or C.
- B. Starting Single file, a rolling start, the heat will be 10 Laps
- C. The winners will be the first one in each class to take the chequered flag

#### 17.4 Heat 3

- A. Heat 2 starting positions will be in finishing order of heat 2 finishing positions regardless of class A B or C.
- B. Starting Single file, a rolling start, the heat will be 6 Laps
- C. The winners will be the first one in each class to take the chequered flag

#### 17.5 Heat 4

- A. Heat 4 starting positions will be in finishing order of heat 3 finishing positions regardless of class A B or C.
- B. Starting Single file, a rolling start, the heat will be 6 Laps
- C. The winners will be the first one in each class to take the chequered flag

#### 17.6 Heat 5

- A. Heat 5 starting positions will be in reverse order of qualifying positions regardless of class A, B or C.
- B. Starting Single file, in pairs released from pit lane with 5 second gap between pairs the heat will be 11 laps.
- C. The winners will be the first one in each class to take the chequered flag

#### 17.7 Heat 6

- A. Heat 6 starting positions will be in reverse order of qualifying positions regardless of class A, B or C.
- B. Starting Single file, in pairs released from pit lane with 5 second gap between pairs the heat will be 11 laps.
- C. The winners will be the first one in each class to take the chequered flag

#### 17.8 Round Photo

- A. The highest point scoring car from each class is required to stop at the control tower at the completion of the final race for Series Photo's

#### 17.9 Cautions and re-starts

- A. Cautions and re-starts will be as per the CR's for the series.
- B. All restarts from a caution period will be single file.
- C. The Clerk of Course will advise all competitors of any changes.

#### 17.10 **Red Flag**

- A. In the event of a red flag or a heat being cut short finishing places will be at the last full timed lap.

#### 17.11 **Points**

- A. Points will be scored by each car per heat.
- B. The driver in each class that scores the highest points on the day will be the "Class Winner"
- C. For 2022 there will be no round winner trophy.

#### 18 **POINT SCORE**

- A. Points will be scored by each car in each heat. Each class will receive the same points as listed in the series Competition Rules

#### 19 **TIE FOR POINTS**

- 19.1 In the case of a tie for points in a Class, the following will be applied.
  - a) A countback on point per heat during the day. (If this is the same)
  - b) Who completed their fastest race lap of the day first. Official Eldee Timing will be used.

#### 20 **POLE POSITION**

- 20.1 The pole sitter will lead the cars to the start line at a speed of no more than 50kph until the start line is crossed.
- 20.2 The fastest qualifier will have the choice to start on the Left or Right hand side of the track in the case of a double file start.

#### 21 **SERIES POINTS SPREAD**

- 21.1 All 6 heats will count towards Small Car Cup Championship.

#### 22 **HEAT/RACE FINISHER**

- 22.1 To be deemed to have finished a Heat or Race, a car must take the Checkered Flag under its own power regardless of laps covered.
- 22.2 A car in the pits is not deemed a finisher.
- 22.3 A car may return to the track from repairs etc in the pits to take the checkered flag provided the car is authorised by the Chief Scrutineer to do so and the checkered flag has not been shown to the leading car.

#### 23 **COVID -19 REGULATIONS form Small Car Cup**

- 23.1 All competitors and pit crew will have their temperature taken prior to entering the Facility.
- 23.2 Anyone suspected of a high temperature will not be accepted to enter Pheasant Wood Circuit.
- 23.3 All Competitors, Pit Crew and Officials must supply a Covid NEGATIVE test done in the 7 days prior to the event.
- 23.4 All Competitors, Pit Crew and Officials must supply their own hand sanitizer and sanitizer wipes for use throughout the day.
- 23.5 All Competitors, Pit Crew and Officials must supply their own Face Masks
- 23.6 All Competitors, Pit Crew and Officials to maintain 1.5m Social Distancing at all times unless from the same household.

#### 24 **PENALTIES**

- 24.1 Penalties for driving infringements will be dealt with by the Driving Standards Officer and/or the Clerk of Course and the event Stewards.
- 24.2 Penalties may vary at the discretion of the Driving Standards Officer and/or the Clerk of Course.

#### 25 **PROTESTS**

- 25.1 Protests must be lodged on the day and within 30minutes of the completion of the race it refers.
- 25.2 All protests must be accompanied by a \$250.00 fee
- 25.3 \$200.00 returnable only if the protest is upheld.

#### 26 **AWARDS AND PRESENTATIONS**

- 26.1 Trophies Presentation will be held after the completion of all races. (This depends on current Covid-19 restrictions)
- 26.2 Trophies &/or Certificates will be presented on the day if possible.

## **27 FACILITIES**

- 27.1 No Fuel is available at the circuit.
- 27.2 Café facilities are available all day.
- 27.3 A coffee van may also be available.

## **28 SMOKING**

- 28.1 Smoking within the Pit and Paddock areas is prohibited at all times **(2-point penalty)**
- 28.2 Designated smoking areas are available on the South side (Far Side) of the Café and at rear of the pit car park.
- 28.3 See Venue map for these areas. (Supplied with entry confirmation).

## **29 DRUGS & ALCOHOL**

- 29.1 Consumption of alcoholic liquor by drivers or pit crew is forbidden prior to the completion of the meeting in accordance with SCRs. All drivers must not have a BAC exceeding 0.01.

## **30 DRUG AND ALCOHOL TESTING**

- 30.1 All competitors and officials are advised that random drug and alcohol testing may take place during the competition.
- 30.2 Any driver or crew member or official found to be under the influence of alcohol or recreational drugs during the event will be excluded from the event, and further penalties may be imposed in accordance with the SCRs.
