





With the reopening of the Office for Recreation, Sport and Racing's grant funding program, Council is again preparing a grant application to support construction of the Wool Trail between Blyth and Brinkworth.

The Wool Trail will be an exciting 18km walking and cycling trail winding its way through the picturesque Mid North landscape between Brinkworth and Blyth.

The trail will deliver free active recreation opportunities for both local users and interested tourists as the area's only off-road exercise trail featuring educational materials on the many native trees and abundant birdlife in the district.

The Wool Trail is so named because it follows the route taken by bullock teams delivering wool south to Port Adelaide Wool Stores, honouring this journey which helped establish the economic prosperity in the Mid North region.

Community support is viewed as one of the key application assessment criteria and your pledge to support the project will be vital in building our case for funding assistance.

With new walking trail projects, the government will be backing these with 75 per cent of the total project cost so any investment we get from the community on top of Council's contribution will greatly leverage the overall project budget.

We are seeking pledges as soon as possible to finalise the project plan and overall budget. <u>Please respond before Friday 11th November.</u>

For those offering in-kind support for carting scalps from Clare Quarry's site at Spalding to the Wool Trail please work on a value of \$14.50/tonne + GST.

For those offering in-kind support in the way of just labour, work on a value of \$25.00/hr. + GST (this value is set by the Office for Recreation, Sport & Racing).

"Till at last, at last, the war was won. That's why we wear a poppy son" The small boy turned to as if to go. Then said. "Thanks lady, I'm glad to know."


"That sure sounds like an awful fight, But your son- did he come back alright?" A tear rolled down each faded cheek. She shook her head but didn't speak.


