

This first part is taken from my pastoral letter last year but it is

important and I wanted to feature it again. June is another busy month for many of us as summer is officially in full-swing, Father's Day, VBS, camping, family reunions, etc. I am a firm believer in the importance of the family and the role of the father. I came across an article in the Northwood Anchor on the week of May 19th 2021 - that reiterates the importance of what I have been advocating for. Here is a synopsis of the article: Build a strong family to benefit children and adults

Children and adults benefit from being supported by a strong family unit, no matter how it is defined. This support can come from parents with a positive relationship, extended family and friends, and the community according to Joy Rouse, a human sciences specialist with Iowa State University Extension and Outreach. There are six characteristics that strong families share: 1) family members have a strong commitment to each other and make their relationships a high priority. 2) They make it known that they appreciate each other. 3) They talk to each other about small things and big issues. 4) They spend time together. 5) They believe in a greater power and have shared beliefs (we know this to be God and Christianity but others find strength and comfort in other religions). 6) Strong families cope with difficulties and crises effectively.

For many of us this seems like common sense but with the changing family dynamics and the shrinking of the nuclear family these characteristics are not the norm. When I look at these six characteristics I not only picture my family (immediate and extended) but also my church family. When we make relationships a high priority, appreciate each other, talk, spend time together, share a common experience in a personal relationship with Jesus, and bearing each other's burdens – this is what I love about my church family. By living these out in our own families and being in community together is a benefit to all: children and adults.

Since this article was rather P.C. it did not mention specifically the importance of fathers who have an active, participatory relationship with their children. Recently I saw a commercial that featured a father and daughter playing catch and it chronicled her growing up and each different sport and the message was I do not remember when our game of catch started but I know that whenever I toss the ball, you are there to throw it right back to me. Fathers Matter!

Finally, a couple of programming notes. Father's Day, June 19th, is going to be a joint service at the Worth County Fairgrounds at 9am in the Shelter House. Brothers Walker will be leading worship again this year and there is no admission charge that morning so this is your chance to check out the fair for free. Also, the Worth County Cattleman's put on a BBQ lunch that is phenomenal – so, come to church at the fair and treat dad to a great lunch.

VBS in Bolan starts the next day and runs June 20th – 24th from 9am to noon. I rented a van and can transport children from Asbury and Northwood, look for more info in the newsletter. I will also be leading the discovery center again this year and look forward to seeing everyone again.


It is my hope that you have been enjoying our sermon series on the Book of Revelation. There is only so much about this book though that fits for a sermon.

Nancy, Council Chair, called the meeting to order at 10:10 am

Devotions by Bobbi Hooks-Rebuilding God's house taken from the March/April Upper Room Devotional Booklet

- Motion by Sandy; 2nd by Dean to approve the minutes of the March 17th meeting as read by Karen Abrahams, Council Secretary. Motion carried
- Treasurer's Report by Terry with a balance of \$17, 568.38. 1) Apportionments paid through March. Plan to pay 2nd quarter in July. 2) Share Shoppe is paid through March. Plan to pay 2nd quarter in July. 3) Insurance is paid up through June. Will pay the remaining balance when the bill is received in June or July. 4) A new ACH agreement was facilitated this month to pay the copier lease payment. Our new standard payment is \$203.05 split with Asbury which is lower than the previous agreement. 5) In April we paid out of the General Fund for a new cordless head set microphone and two hand held microphones which were purchased from Amazon on our Visa card. These were not included in the sound system estimate and the cost was \$649.49. They were needed to complete our sound system project which is funded by the Trustees. 6) We need to clarify the intent of the board as to the AV Tech position and also what is required to receive the \$25 per Sunday. The consensus of the council is to have a sub when Carter our AV Tech is gone. Tami Meyer has volunteered to be a sub and be trained to fulfill the functions of the AV Tech. 7)We started the year with a cushion and a good financial position, but we're gradually eating it up. Discussed the reports showing how we are spending our money and the status of our finances. 8) Again, I'd like to thank Margie Barber for her work in creating and fine tuning our accounting system. It is simple to use but required a lot of time to create. Motion by LeAnn; 2nd by Karen Abrahams to approve the Treasurer's Report. Motion carried

SPPRC met in April to fill our Another Set of Eyes Report. They will meet again in July


