## **TREC GB Championships Selection Process**

TREC Ireland members have been given 10 places at the TREC GB Championships to be spread over all 7 classes. The top Irish riders at each level will be selected to compete and represent TREC Ireland.

The classes open for qualification are:

Level 4 individual  
Level 3 individual  
Level 3 pairs  
Level 2a individual  
Level 2a pairs  
Level 2 individual  
Level 2 pairs

These 10 places will be allocated based on a point scoring system over a selection of specified competitions. These competitions include:

## **Application process**

First step: Riders wishing to apply for selection must complete an application form and send to [chairman@trecireland.com](mailto:chairman@trecireland.com) to be received by midnight Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> April.

Second step: Over the coming months riders should pick their five best competitions from the list above in order to gain the highest number of points (as per points scoring criteria). At least one event must be in 2018 and this event must be at the chosen level for qualification. At least one event must be in 2017. Only two events can be at a level lower than qualification level. Riders must complete and submit their **results form** and send to [chairman@trecireland.com](mailto:chairman@trecireland.com) to be received by midnight of Sunday 29<sup>th</sup> July.

## **Additional Information**

Points will be awarded out of a maximum of 100 points divided as follows:

POR – 50 points;            PTV – 30 points;            MA – 20 points

### **How to gain points**

The scores from each phase of the five chosen competitions will be used to allocate points. The actual placing of a rider in a competition will not be used in the point allocations.

It is possible to combine the results from 2 competitions. For example, the scores from a MA/PTV competition may be combined with the POR score from a POR competition. However the scores from a 3 phase event cannot be combined with those of another competition.

### **International competitions**

International competition experience is hugely beneficial and as such bonus points will be awarded for any one International competition in which a rider has completed all 3 phases.

International competition at the level of qualification or higher: a 50 point bonus is awarded.

International competition at a level lower than qualification: a 30 point bonus is awarded.

If an International Competition from the list of events above is chosen, the scores will be used to allocate points and the bonus will be awarded in addition to this. If the rider attended an international competition prior to 2016 the bonus points will be awarded but scores will not gain points. International competition bonus points can be included in addition to your top five selected competitions.

### **Traceurs**

If a rider has not competed enough to submit five competitions they may be awarded points for tracing. 25 points will be awarded for a route traced at the level of qualification or above. These points can be combined with actual scores from a MA/PTV competition in order to cover all three phases.
