Enoch

Enoch in the Hebrew is pronounced Chanok and it means dedicated. He was the 7th man from Adam which is the number of Righteousness and divine completeness. He was the son of Jared and the father of Methuselah.

Enoch was only one of two (Noah being the other) people that I found where it was written that he walked with Yahweh rather than before Yahweh which was written about Abraham and David.

Amos 3:3 "Will two walk together except they are agreed?" You have to be on the same mindset to be walking with someone toward a common goal and Enoch must have had great faith to be able to be counted worthy to walk with Yahweh. He's also mentioned in Hebrews 11:5 (the Faith Chapter) as one of the faithful and immediately after this verse it states in 11:6 "But without faith it is impossible to please YAHWEH. For it is right that the one drawing near to YAHWEH should believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of those that diligently seek him". So again just think about the faith Enoch must have had.

Enoch started his walk with Yahweh 300 years after he fathered Methuselah which might indicate that once he became a father a greater sense of reasonability came about and sought to seek Yahweh with everything he had.

Also in Hebrews 11:5 it states "that Enoch was translated so not to see death and was not found because Elohim translated him". One of the definitions of translated is "to bear, carry or move from one place, position to another". Genesis 5:24 "And Enoch walked with Elohim. Then he was not, for Elohim took him. The strong's number for **took** is H3947 which means to accept, bring, buy, carry away, drawn, fetch, get, infold, mingle, place, receive, reserve, seize, send for, take (away, -ing,), use, win. No way does this indicate that Yahweh took him into heaven because in Hebrews 11:13 it states that "These all died by way of faith, not having received the promises, but seeing them from afar, and being persuaded, and having embraced and confessed that they are strangers and pilgrims on the earth. I believe that when it talks about Enoch not seeing death it has to be talking about the 2nd death and not the 1st.

Something else that's interesting is that Enoch lived 365 years and was also the shortest living man in the genealogy from Adam to Noah. If we look at a day for a year showing that we has believers in Yahweh and Yahshua we need to be walking with Elohim everyday of the year to the best of our ability to be counted worthy to be qualified as walking with Elohim.
