OPEN CLASS RULES & REGULATIONS

The Logan County Agricultural Society is governed by the Ohio Department of Agriculture.

Open class exhibitions are open to Logan County residents.

All exhibits must be owned by exhibitor or minor member of the family. Only two (2) entries per class with the exception of livestock. Registration papers must be presented prior to the show. State health laws must apply.

ENTRY FEES: All exhibitors must purchase a \$25 season ticket and pay \$5 per department in which exhibiting unless otherwise stated.

All entries must be made and fees paid by noon, Saturday, June 12, 2021. All entries received by the Fair Office are final. Entry tags will be issued to non-livestock exhibitors and must be attached to article when exhibited. No entry shall compete for more than one premium except Junior Fair entries.

All exhibits must be in place by 9 pm. July 10, 2021. Release of open class exhibitions should follow specific department guidelines.

Livestock must be secured properly for the safety of all.

The Agricultural Society/class departments will contract judges based on prearranged compensation of services. No person will be allowed to interfere with a judge during competition.

When there is only one entry in a class, the judge will award only one premium/placement which may be 2nd or 3rd

The Agricultural Society will take every precaution for the safe keeping of entries after their arrival on the fairgrounds, but will not be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur. The Society will not be responsible for any accident involving any person, animal or article, on the fairgrounds.

Items necessary to care for or display an exhibit is the responsibility of the exhibitor.NO exhibitor can demonstrate their product in such a way as to hinder the demonstration of products of others.

No person except the directors of the Society shall see or be informed of the number or kind of entries made before the closing date of entries

Every effort is made in the preparation of the premium list for the


Logan County Fair but no liability is assumed by the Society for any error.

Complaints, protests and objections should be presented to the Open Class Coordinator in writing and signed and dated by the accuser within 24 hours of the occurrence.

Rule Violations may result in the loss of award(s) and/or premium(s).

The process in which a violation may be investigated could include; questioning the parties involved by department leadership and/or the executive committee of the ag society board of directors. If it is felt an attempt to defraud the Society or a rule violated, the violator will receive written notice of the infraction and penalty determined.

The board reserves the right to withdraw or withhold, for good cause, any premium awarded.

Division 001: MEAT PRODUCTION (BREEDING)

GENERAL RULES:

- 1. Open to all counties.
- 2. Male goats are barred.
- 3. Goats must show no signs of abscesses.
- 4. Goats do not need to be registered to show.
- Goats shown in group classes must be entered and shown in single classes.
- No grade classes. Owner has the right to enter a grade in the class best suited.
- 7. Exhibitors must furnish bedding.
- 8. Goats must be shown in order to receive premium.
- If there are less than two exhibitors in a class, only one premium money will be paid.
- 10. There will be no less than 2 adult goats or 3 kids to a pen.
- 11. Failure to follow the above rules will result in forfeiture of all premium money to that exhibitor.
- 12. Premium money must be picked up

at the fairgrounds by August 1. Premiums not picked up will return to the fair's general fund.

Division 005:

HOMEMADE WINE

- Wines may be made from grapes, other fruit, berries, vegetables, grains, other suitable ingredients or blend of these.
- 2. Ingredients may be fresh, canned, dried, concentrated, or otherwise preserved.
- Wines must be amateur homemade by the process of fermentation and not blended with commercial wines.
- 4. Wines appropriate for fortification may be fortified with commercial spirits.
- 5. Exhibitors may enter one bottle in each class.
- Exhibit should be submitted in clear or colored smooth glass bottle of approximately 26 ounces (4/5 quart). Bottles of general shape called "Bordeaux," "Burgundy" or "Rhine" are acceptable.
- 7. Bottles should have nearly straight sides and a top which can be removed without tools except for a corkscrew. Capsules, foils, or other seals must not be used over the bottle closure.
- 8. Bottles should be filled within 1" to 2" of the fully installed top or cork and must not be overfilled.
- 9. Wines should be clear and free of flotation (not cloudy).
- 10.Labels may be placed on the bottles after judging.
- 11. Wines must be made by the exhibitor. If a family makes the wine together, only one person may be the exhibitor and winner.



The Logan County Garden Clubs will not be responsible for any entries left after 9:00 pm on Thursday, Friday (daylilies) or Saturday. Exhibits not picked up will be placed outside along the west side (rear) of the Grange building.

GENERAL RULES

- Entries are open to all residents of Logan County, members of Logan County Garden Clubs and their families, and residents of counties whose fairs are open to Logan County residents. All exhibitors including juniors, must have an exhibitor's ticket to exhibit in these shows.
- No entries permitted after July 3rd and no additional hand written entries the day of the show
- 3. EXHIBITS MUST BE TICKETED AND REGISTERED BY 11:30 A.M. ON DAY OF JUDGING.
- 4. In all shows, entries not registered by 11:30 am will not be judged and will be for viewing only.
- There will be no grooming or artistic design set up after 12:00 PM on the day of show.
- 7. Open judging by an accredited O.A.G.C. judge will begin at 1 p.m. with quiet prevailing during judging. Exhibitors and interested Persons are encouraged to attend judging. There will be no discussion about the exhibits with the judge prior to and during judging.

- 8. 1st place, 2nd place, and 3rd place winners are awarded at the discretion of the judge in each class. Sweepstakes will be awarded by the point system for each show. In the Monday show, "Best of Show" and "Reserve Best of Show" awards will be given by the judge in all the adult-class container grown plants, in all other adult classes combined. and in junior container grown plants. In Friday Show, "Best of Show" & "Reserve Best of Show" awards will be given by the judge in Artistic Design, Junior Artistic Design, all adult-class cut specimens except roses, and Junior Horticulture. From the Rose Sections, the iudge will select one "Queen of Roses" Best of Show from the larger rose classes, and one "Princess of Roses" Best of Show from the miniature roses.
- Awards will be given at the discretion of the judge whose decision is final. Any award may be withheld at the discretion of the judge.
- 10.All premiums must be picked up at the fairgrounds. If not picked up by August 1, 2021, the premium money will be returned to the general fund.
- 11. There are two junior classes: ages 4 through 12 years of age and juniors ages 13 through 18 years. In addition to premiums awarded to the junior classes, the OAGC Logan County Garden Clubs will award each junior \$5 per show for entering exhibits.
- 12. Premiums: Cut Specimen and Container-Grown Plants 1st -\$2.00; 2nd

-\$1.50; 3rd -\$1.00 Artistic Design 1st -\$3.00; 2nd -\$2.50; 3rd -\$2.00

HORTICULTURE RULES

- 1. Container plants must be potted and in possession of exhibitor at least 45 days prior to show.
- 2. 2. Exhibitors may only make one entry in cut-specimen classes except roses, which may have two entries. All classes must be declared on entry sheet. Tags will be printed and may be picked up the day prior to each show at the Flower Show Building, and should be placed on the exhibits before the entries are brought to the fair grounds. ALL CUT SPECIMANS MUST BE GROWN BY EXHIBITOR.
- Exhibits not meeting the specifications of the schedule will be disqualified. (Example: size of bloom as stated in the schedule, improper count when definite number is specified or side buds left on those specimens to be shown as an individual bloom.)
- 4. Horticulture exhibits must be staged in clear glass containers provided by the exhibitor, except for miniature roses and gladiolus whose containers will be furnished by the show department. Containers should be sturdy enough to hold the entry. Floating full blown roses must be staged in clear wide mouth containers provided by exhibitor. Larger specimens (i.e. sunflowers, large lilies, and large hostas) should be placed in a heavy container that will hold the entry without tipping. No

- quart or pint canning jars will be acceptable.
- 5. Same exhibits cannot be used in more than one show.
- 6. All exhibits should be named if known. ONLY CORRECTLY NAMED EXHIBITS WILL BE ELIBIBLE FOR A BEST OF SHOW AWARD BUT CAN WIN A 1ST, 2ND, OR 3RD PLACEMENT. Write the variety name in the Entry Description area of the tag.
- The size of containers are limited. See class for size. Exhibitor or their designee is responsible for placement and removal of large containers.
- Wedges are allowed in horticultural exhibits as long as the wedge does not distract from the entry.

ARTISTIC RULES

- Plant material for artistic design may be secured from any source. No artificial plant material will be permitted. Painted or artificially colored fresh plant material is never permitted in artistic designs. Cut fruit or vegetables are not permitted. Painted dried material, accessories and line material will be permitted. Plant, dried and line material must be stated on a 3x5 card or listed on the "Entry Description" portion of the entry tag. Do not use an American Flag in any arrangements.

Hosta is shown as single leaf unless otherwise noted. Hosta measurements: Sq. in. = length of leaf from base to tip multiplied by the width at widest point.

Tell the difference between a grass and a sedge (Carex) by looking at the cut

end of the stem and rolling the stem between your fingers. If the stem is hollow and round, it is a grass. If the stem is solid, peel the leaves back and roll the stem between your fingers. If it rolls easily between your fingers, it's a round stem and is most likely a rush. If it does not roll easily, it's an angular stem, which is characteristic of sedges.

The exhibitor may choose to use any number of components to achieve the balance desired. The items are chosen for their color, form and texture with no consideration of functionalism, but must give the impression of dining.

This setting is not arranged for the actual service of food. Some of the appointments are usually displayed in an unusual manner, such as having a plate upright or napkins attached to the background. Innovative staging may be: wall hung panels, open frames, or metal sculptures us unusual backgrounds or underlays.

Figurines or accessories may be used to help interpret the picture.

Table Setting Type II: Type 2 is without a floral design, but with SOME plant material as a secondary part of the

whole picture. The plant material does NOT originate in a regular container. It may be hung or pinned where color, texture and balance are needed. Plant material play a SECONDARY role but MUST be present. Figurines, if used, could be nearly life size so they dominate the plant material.

Participants that sign up for the table setting must exhibit or secure someone else to enter in their place. Backboards will be provided, contact show chair if wanted before fair. Size is limited to 45" tall by 30" wide. Place no staples, tacks, tape, paint, etc. onto the backboard (nothing permanent. Limit 5 entries, confirm with show chair a space is available.

- 10. Professional and custom framing is an option.
- 11. Classes may not be combined.
- 12. Entry name must be covered during judging.

- Work entered in an incorrect section will be disqualified.
- 14. Director makes final decision on standard of good taste.
- Sculpture, textiles and jewelry are placed in glass display. Exhibitor provided models are welcome.
- 16. Specific display requests need to be communicated upon delivery. Attempt will be made to accommodate exhibitor, both for aesthetics and safety.
- 17. Exhibit is displayed at owner's risk. The Logan County Ag Society and the Logan County Art League relinquish all accountability for any damage or loss of property.
- 18. Respect judge's decisions. Refrain from speaking until finished and ready to address the artists.
- 19. Exhibitors are encouraged to attend the critique.
