Greetings of Joy and Peace!

The hymn, "*Joy to the World*," written by Isaac Watts, celebrates 300 years of bringing joy to us as we lift our voices in praise to God. Throughout Advent, we will weave joy into each service: Hopeful Joy, Loving Joy, Unabashed Joy, Peaceful Joy, and Incarnate Joy.

Many questions swirl around in my mind about the world's current situation and joy:

Can we be joyful when our life is stress filled? Or when things are not going as we had hoped or planned? Is it right to be joyful when so many people are suffering in the world? Can we be joyful when our planet is being destroyed as we know it and our country is hesitant to take steps to reduce pollution? Can joy and peace go together?

These are just a few of my questions. I am sure many of you have some of your own. I am interested in knowing what they are. If you would like to post your questions on our church Facebook page, I would be curious to know what they are and attempt to address them in worship. Of course, we will sing *"Joy to the World*" at our 5:30 PM Christmas Eve worship.

For Bible study this Advent, we will be using *Light the World* by Amy Jill Levine. Professor Levine is a Biblical scholar at *Vanderbilt* Divinity School and College of Arts and Sciences teaching New Testament and Jewish studies. She is a favorite of our study group. We meet Wednesday mornings at 10:30 AM to noon. It is a wonderful group, which allows for differences of opinions to be shared without any judgement. You are invited to join us.

Our December church schedule is full of offerings to worship God, connect with others, share in outreach and mission, and have some time to experience joy in our lives.

Jesus said, *I have told you these things so that you will be filled with my joy. Yes, your joy will overflow!* (John 15:11 Living Translation)

As a human being, it's sometimes too easy to have the glass half empty habit and dwell on things that aren't right or don't go our way.

Wise teacher Richard Rohr says: "Negativity leaves us in a state of victimhood and/or anger; it is immature if we stall there for long."

If I dwell on how dissatisfied I feel, I can make myself really sad and angry! This sort of thinking robs me of joy and of the power to improve the situation.

What a good thing we have the Thanksgiving holiday to nudge us in the right direction and remind us to stay in gratitude.

What are you grateful for? What do you give thanks for? Is once a year enough?

I am encouraged our church has a culture of sharing joys. A weekly practice to give thanks and keep our hearts on track.

One way of growing closer to God, and especially if you are going through a hard or sad time, is to find something to be grateful and give thanks for more often, maybe daily – even if all you can think of to be grateful for is your warm bed at night! When we need God's help, give thanks for it in advance. Know that it is coming. The apostle Paul said: 'Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with THANKSGIVING, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. (Philippians 4:6-7, NIV).

<u>Stewardship Campaign and Financial</u> <u>Giving</u>

Thank you to all who have responded with their 2020 pledged amount. Asking a person to pledge does indeed help the church to plan for the next year:

> What ministries can the church continue to fund? Is there enough money to continue with a full-time pastor?

Will we be able to maintain our church building and address some of the needed improvements? Can we expand our ministries to touch more lives? How far? How wide?

These are some of the questions church leadership can answer when it knows how much income can be expected in the next year. Income comes from pledges, investment income, fund raisers, etc.

However, pledging is not only for church planning. As Christians we are called to be as generous as God is generous to us. We can never match God's goodness and generosity, but we are called to give back what we feel is acceptable to God- a giving that is not "whatever I have left-over" but what is a line in our budget; giving God of our first fruits. (See Deuteronomy 26 and/or Proverbs 3). We fill out a pledge believing this is a good amount and what we believe we can achieve. However, it is easy to allow our money to go other places during the year. A pledge holds us accountable to God, promising we will strive to maintain what we have committed. (Unless unseen circumstances apply). As we are called to hold one another accountable, this is one way the church helps its people stay aligned with their actions matching their words. If you have not already done so, please prayerfully make your pledge and return them to the church.


