1. BIDDING WARS – SOMETHING NEW FOR THE CITY

The city of Terre Haute will be involved in a new process for the collection of bids relating to the purchase of two dump trucks for the City of Terre Haute Street Department. Companies choosing to bid on the trucks have already submitted the bid information relating to specifications, and those companies meeting the requirements have been invited to submit bids in a process referred to as a "reverse auction" system.

On March 12, 2009, at 2:00 PM the reverse auction will be held online through the BidBridge company. Those submitting bids will be able to see the bids offered by their competitors and will have a chance to "outbid" their competitors. The public and the members of the Board of Works and Safety will be able to view the bidding as it occurs. When the time limit is met, the low bid will be accepted.

4. TEN INVESTMENT RULES

IT'S IRONIC that the information and wisdom that's necessary to help one be a successful investor is so freely available, yet so few people actually use it. One reason why is during difficult times, those pesky emotions cloud our judgment. As an example of some great investment wisdom that's freely available, a June 2008 *MarketWatch* article published the following 10 investment rules developed by Bob Farrell over his many decades in the investment business:

- 1. Markets tend to return to the mean over time.
- 2. Excesses in one direction will lead to an opposite excess in the other direction.
- 3. There are no new eras excesses are never permanent.
- 4. Exponential rapidly rising or falling markets usually go further than you think, but they do not correct by going sideways.
- 5. The public buys the most at the top and the least at the bottom.
- 6. Fear and greed are stronger than long-term resolve.
- 7. Markets are strongest when they are broad and weakest when they narrow to a handful of blue-chip names.
- 8. Bear markets have three stages: sharp down, reflexive rebound, and a drawn-out fundamental downtrend.
- 9. When all the experts and forecasts agree, something else is going to happen.
- 10. Bull markets are more fun than bear markets.

These are good rules to remember especially during these tumultuous times.
