President's Report

2020 was a turbulent year for Victorians. This cascaded to the DVCA and subsequently the LPCC.

Would there be a 20/21 season? When would it start? What would the format be? Could clubs train?

There were plenty of unanswered questions until we finally heard it would be a 14 round one-day season commencing on 14 November - over a month later than normal.

Clubs were committed to doing whatever it took to get a season underway. So, sanitiser, QR codes, and social distancing became the norm.

This meant of course that our Junior Winter Academy had to be cancelled... and indoor pre-season.

At Lower, we had the additional complication of renovations preventing access to our clubrooms, so an 11th hour decision was made to move home games to Beale Reserve until rooms completion.

Despite the chaos, there was an element of business as usual...

Our culture reset continued and several former Lions returned to the club, including Brent Ryan, Liam Hunt, Brad Wright, Sam Staples, Adam Bowen and Liam Lacy. This was strategic as they are quality people, and character is as important as talent in building a strong and sustainable culture.

We continued to create pathways for our juniors which **must** remain our primary growth model.

Current/former juniors Anuga Caldera, Sam Staples, Adam Bowen, Sam Hoyne, Liam Chilcott and Max Willis all played their 1st A Grade match this season, while u16s Alex Campbell, Luke Robbo, Jack Nailer and Cal James each had a taste in the 2s.

A highlight for the club was the Mash Shield Round 5 winning match v Hurstbridge where **every player** in the side was a product of the Lower Plenty junior program.

Another highlight for me, as always, is our family connections. In the 4s, Alex Preston, the James brothers and Baxter Carson got to play with their dads. In other grades, Carlyons, Calderas, Campbells, Ryans and Bowens played together. Plus, we saw 3rd and 4th generation family members join our junior program!

With no pre-season to gauge numbers, we baulked at entering a 5^{th} senior side in 20/21, but we're confident we'll have the necessary numbers for next season. The senior club used **83 players** in total for the season (v 70 last year), so five senior sides plus Veterans is definitely attainable.

Bill Jenkin did an amazing job in his first year as Captain-Coach. The work Bill put in pre-season, be it recruiting or preparing amid all the COVID restrictions, was huge! As well as his leadership, he had an incredible year as a player: DVCA Team of Year (along with Brad Wright), runner-up in the 'Duckworth-Turner' comp medal, along with back-to-back Club Champion and Tex Tyrrell awards. His 675 runs has been bettered by only one player ever in our history - Fred Leslie, a Hall of Famer.

Bill has been appointed for a 2nd term and planning for 21/22 is underway as we aim to not only make finals but win it and get back into Money Shield. Wins against sides like Rosebank and Laurimar show we're not far away.

Jeff Watt did a great job as Chairman of Selectors and Net Coach. Jika spent most of his time at grades other than the 1s to ensure a whole-club perspective from a strategic and developmental perspective. Jika's passion is infectious and we love what he brings - he's also back for 21/22.

Thanks to skippers Doc, Gav, Chess and Marty for their leadership and flexibility all year. Congrats to Gav and the 3s for making the GF and giving us an exciting final few weeks. And, we're indebted to Marty for getting the Veterans going again - this is enormously important for the club.

Well done to all award winners - in particular to Geoff MacIsaac, who won the rebadged 'Watson/Jenkin' Best Club Person award, our newest Life Members in Travis Smith and Gaven Brown, and of course 'The Fox', Peter Barnett, on becoming our newest Hall of Famer.

Luke Preston and Colleen Robertson led a great Junior Program that sets us apart from other clubs. Thanks to all coaches, and doubly so to Geoff MacIsaac for also running Junior Blasters program.

Off-field

As referenced earlier, in addition to having COVID to deal with, we had the complication of being displaced to Beale Reserve for the season during renovations. The end product is fantastic, and will be enjoyed by players and supporters for many years to come, but it did make for a tough year.

Thanks to our small but hard-working Committee, in particular the Executive. Len managing to feed the guys each Thursday after training was a phenomenal effort, Jamie does a power of behind-the-scenes operational work, Lutt's in year 20 as Treasurer... but the whole committee contributed.

On the topic of volunteers, we were delighted to nominate Tony Mash for a Cricket Victoria **'50 Year Service'** award. Wob is our historian, he submits all scores into My Cricket each week and attends the Blasters every Sunday with grandson Cooper - a legend of LPCC and a truly deserved recognition!

Our social functions were limited by COVID restrictions - few, but enjoyable. The Steak & Punt night, Xmas Party and \$3k draw were highlights. Well done to Heath, Len and the Social Committee.

We had an exceptional Presentation Night at the Heidelberg Golf Club with 100 present, including a great spread of Life Members and young families. Thanks to all who attended to make it memorable.

Financially: despite COVID limitations and the displacement, operating profit was up again on last year's great effort. We're in a powerful financial position and now able to responsibly invest in development, recruiting, equipment etc. Our full financial statement will be presented at the AGM.

I want to **thank all club sponsors** once again, in particular those who appear at the tail of this report. Your support is invaluable and helps keep cricket at Lower Plenty affordable for players and families.

These last two years have been seasons of significant change. In addition to a change in strategy and new rooms, we've delivered some creative initiatives to build upon the club's history, including:

- Life Member video series, 'In My Day' (courtesy of Max Willis' video skills),
- Player number assigned @ 50 senior games (211 in total), and
- LPCC Hall of Fame.

Thanks to the club for allowing me the honour of leading it these past two years. I've enjoyed our rebuild, focusing on culture and inclusiveness. We're set for a successful and sustainable future.

Senior Coach's report

I would firstly like to thank the whole of the Lower Plenty Cricket Club board and committee for giving me the opportunity to lead this fantastic club, which was a great privilege and honour. In what was a year like no other with restrictions and new rules and regulations to ensure we were compliant with all COVID measures, I would like to thank those that were heavily involved with the setup of training facilities i.e. check-ins, ball sanitising etc.

Also, I would like to thank the captains of other sides (Trav, Gav & Chess) for their efforts and working closely with their respective playing group and for helping make my job easier with reinforcing consistent messages to players across all grades.

With the change of format to one day cricket saw a major theme of the season becoming around adaptability. With the shorter format suiting a number of players, some players in the beginning of the season were more suited to the longer format. However, what this adjustment did force all players to do was to work on their skillset to best suit a shorter form game.

Working with a number of batsmen on their intent at the crease and looking at different areas to score helped tap into new skillsets, while bowlers had to work on variation deliveries to suit the shorter format and work on being very specific with their plans and fields to different batters.

Overall players were able to see development in their own personal game that not only helped for this shorter form season but will also be beneficial in seasons to come. This can help players have another string to their bow and to have further versatility when we return to the longer format next season.

Across all senior sides we were able to see growth and development throughout the year with a number of younger junior players also getting a lot more exposure to senior cricket which can only ever have a major positive affect and fast track their development. Having a continued focus on

building from within and giving and will help the club on our way to long term success and sustainability.

Overall, while in the beginning of the season we had our challenges adapting to new training and playing protocols, we believe our club is in a strong position to further develop from within and see a strong presence across all senior sides.

Having eight debutants throughout the year with a good mix of experience and youth was a great balance throughout the season with our playing group.

While there were many other team and individual highlights throughout the year, I think the one that stands out from the rest was in round against Laurimar where we chased down 234 which was decided with a last ball boundary off the bat of Alex Horner. Knowing that we could chase down a big total again instilled a lot of belief in a young group that we can win from any situation.

Another major highlight that didn't involve runs or wickets this year, which was more of a club highlight, was that on a couple of occasions we were able to field a side in our first eleven that was made up entirely of former Lower Plenty CC Juniors. This was a massive highlight and reinforced our focus of having good Lower Plenty people back home.

In summary, in what was an unfortunate finish to a good year with just missing finals, I am very confident in this group to take the next step next season and push finals and to have that ultimate success.

It was a bit of a 'coulda-been' year for us. We were in most games up to our eyeballs, with only about four (including the last two) that we were never really that competitive. We certainly struggled a bit with the ball but it gave opportunity for some of the young guys to gain some valuable learning experience. I nearly asked the club to invest in some extra defib units to be at our games given the close nature of many of them:

- A loss in the last over to North Eltham Wanderers in Rd 2
- Winning 8-down at Old Paradians chasing 98 in Rd 5
- A last ball win away at Mernda the following week best team moment for the season, all contributing to the win
- A win off the 3rd last ball vs Banyule Rd 8
- A tie with Lower Eltham in Rd 10.

Early days, it was as if we needed to learn how to win in the 1-day format. There were some games we probably should have won but didn't. Hopefully after taking a bit to adapt to the 1-day format, we can take those learnings into 2-day cricket should it return next season and post some really good scores with the bat, and successfully defend them with the ball.

Unfortunately, with injury and unavailability, we had 29 players rotate through the side. It is what it is, but it'd be great if we could put an AFL-type cap on that in the coming seasons to allow for some team consistency.

Highlights:

- Lots of young guys getting amongst the runs a few 50's amongst them to Chilli (x2), James Carlyon, Taco and Adam Bowen
- Loads of young guys getting an opportunity with the ball great to see Alex Campbell have a consistent season and the likes of Cal James get a chance for a couple of games and gain significant confidence through them both. Best performance was 4-40 from Max Hughes.
- Seeing the talent coming through and helping to foster their development was gold
- Couple of father-son games, and huge thanks to the club for helping to make this happen. Jordie & Al Campbell, and Chris, Adam & Mick Bowen. The Bowen's game will stay with many of us for a long time.
- Taco's 100 vs Banyule believe it was his 1st ever, too. Got run out going for a 3rd in the 2nd last over. No-one knew until after he was off the ground. We ended up getting over the line for him.

Veterans XI:

After a hiatus the previous year, I was keen to see the Veterans back in action, so volunteered to coordinate the over 40's side representing the elder age group of the club.

I sat down with Michael Ryan on Monty Oval during the latter stages of lockdown to discuss the plans and ethos for the Vets side. We agreed with that the Vets should:

- Where possible, be a self-sufficient team and not rely on those that are eligible yet play Senior cricket on a Saturday to 'double up'.
- Not necessarily be meritocratic in nature, with a focus on creating a large squad of players which in turn will increase the participation of those players back at the club.
- Have a positive benefit of the mental health of those re-involved in the club by training, playing and socialising with fellow teammates.
- Have an ethos of upholding the spirit of cricket, to play in the 'right way' which is to respect the game, the umpire and the cricket club whilst also playing with enjoyment and positivity.

• Be a good role model for other LPCC teams and supporters who see how the Vets conduct themselves on and off the field.

Although > 50 players were proposed to play for the Vets, those who were fully committed preseason were not sufficient in number so Kiwi and I put a post on the local *Monty Life* Facebook Community page asking for players to come down and play. From this post, three new players came down (Crispy, Hayesy and Copes), and each became core members of the side. The local Facebook pages are under-utilised in my opinion with regard to promoting the club to a wider community.

The Vets' first training session was held on the Thursday prior to the season commencing in C Grade. Vets trained the Thursday before each game, in a separate net to the other teams which was beneficial in terms of similar skill levels and breeding camaraderie.

Early in the season, local side Greensborough dropped out of the competition and so B & C grades combined and the number of games increased for the regular season from 6 to 7.

Some on-field highlights include:

- A full team of at least 11 players playing each of the 7 games of the season.
- A total of 19 players in total playing across the 7 games
- 4 out of the 7 tosses being agreed with a 'gentleman's toss' without tossing a coin due to either side having a preference to either bat or bowl first.
- Playing local rivals Montmorency (at Lower Plenty for the first time this season) and having a large support down to watch, including all of the first team squad.
- A record of 3 wins and 4 losses which meant missing out on the C grade one-off final.
- 11 x 40no batting retirements.
- The catching of Brendan Lambert and James Hayes.
- Work horse Paul Beadle taking out the Captain's Award.

In conclusion re-establishing the Vets side has been a success this season with good participation and a sense of enjoyment, spirit and ownership of the team felt by all that participated this season.
