'Trevor's Column'

Dear sisters and brothers,

Last week I reflected on the desire expressed by many respondents to our recent National Church Life Survey that they wanted to see *building a sense of community* as a priority over the next 12 months. To foster togetherness needs changed attitudes, actions and speech in the way we relate to one another. To that end there is one essential attitude needed to build authentic Christian community which will also be attractive to a needy watching world. The fundamental command of Jesus for building community is *love one another*. We know the text because we have often sung it in worship, even though overfamiliarity may mean we miss two key things Jesus is stressing -

A new command I give you: love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another.

Firstly, loving others is obligatory for the friends of Jesus. Despite what we think 'love' does not come naturally. Left to ourselves we will only love narrowly (for example, our friends to whom we are drawn by common interest). But this is a command to love those who are different, difficult or awkward. Moreover since commands are addressed to the mind and the will, the curious modern idea that love is a just a feeling is knocked on the head. Instead out of obedience to our Saviour we are to serve our brothers and sisters despite our feelings. I learned this particular lesson about love being a command when I was a teenager. There was a boy at our school who was awkward and lonely. He hung around on the edge of our Christian group so we decided if we were serious about following Jesus we had better try to include him. We therefore spent time with him, including him in our lunchtime games even though he was not very good. We listened patiently even though his interests were not ours. In other words we served him as Jesus had taught us to do and to our surprise he came to faith in Christ. In time he became a good friend because we had obeyed this command of Jesus. I had learned that love is a choice made on the path of discipleship. Secondly, it is a new command, not to love as we love ourselves but to instead love as he has loved us. In other words the stakes have been raised because there is a new standard and a new motive. Moreover in the new covenant initiated by his death there is a new inner resource in the shape of His indwelling Spirit to enable us to begin to love each other in a cross like way. In short there is a new sacrificial model or standard for loving and a new motive and incentive as well. If we are to build community in this church then we will need this mindset or attitude. We will need a willingness to lay down our lives for others in obedience to our Saviour Christ.

Luke 10:1-20 (Text for 8.30am & 11am)

After this the Lord appointed seventy-two^[a] others and sent them two by two ahead of him to every town and place where he was about to go. ² He told them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field. ³ Go! I am sending you out like lambs among wolves. ⁴ Do not take a purse or bag or sandals; and do not greet anyone on the road. ⁵ "When you enter a house, first say, 'Peace to this house.' ⁶ If someone who promotes peace is there, your peace will rest on them; if not, it will return to you. ⁷ Stay there, eating and drinking whatever they give you, for the worker deserves his wages. Do not move around from house to house. ⁸ "When you enter a town and are welcomed, eat what is offered to you. ⁹ Heal the sick who are there and tell them, 'The kingdom of God has come near to you.' ¹⁰ But when you enter a town and are not welcomed, go into its streets and say, ¹¹ 'Even the dust of your town we wipe from our feet as a warning to you. Yet be sure of this: The kingdom of God has come near.' ¹² I tell you, it will be more bearable on that day for Sodom than for that town.

¹³ "Woe to you, Chorazin! Woe to you, Bethsaida! For if the miracles that were performed in you had been performed in Tyre and Sidon, they would have repented long ago, sitting in sackcloth and ashes. ¹⁴ But it will be more bearable for Tyre and Sidon at the judgment than for you. ¹⁵ And you, Capernaum, will you be lifted to the heavens? No, you will go down to Hades. ¹⁶ "Whoever listens to you listens to me; whoever rejects you rejects me; but whoever rejects me rejects him who sent me." ¹⁷ The seventy-two returned with joy and said, "Lord, even the demons submit to us in your name." ¹⁸ He replied, "I saw Satan fall like lightning from heaven. ¹⁹ I have given you authority to trample on snakes and scorpions and to overcome all the power of the enemy; nothing will harm you. ²⁰ However, do not rejoice that the spirits submit to you, but rejoice that your names are written in heaven."
