Trophies and Rosettes

Trophies will be awarded to: 1st place where entries are over 5. Alternative prize may be given where entries are under 6.

1st & 2nd place where entries are over 30 1st, 2nd & 3rd place where entries exceed 60.

Place Rosettes will be awarded to at least 10% of the entry.

Clear Round rosettes will be awarded in all classes.

Anysize classes are intended as fun classes for older dogs, new dogs and 'don't fit anywhere else' dogs. Clear Round rosettes will be awarded and dog treats will be available in the ring for each dog that runs.

All place and clear rosettes and trophies must be collected at the show.

A rosette will be awarded to the best unplaced BSD in all Large Classes. (Sponsored by Bernadette King)

Helter Skelter: A jumping course usually set in increasing or decreasing circles.

Steeplechase: A flowing jumping course consisting of hurdles and pipe tunnels only.

ABC: Open to all dogs except Border Collies, Working Sheepdogs, and their crosses.

In the event of a dispute, the judge's decision is final.

Anysize classes: Particularly suitable for inexperienced dogs or handlers and those dogs that are unable to

compete at their full height. Jumps will be at three heights: 20cms, 30cm and 40cms. Handlers may choose the height appropriate for their dog, regardless of their dog's size.

No weaves, tyre, long jump, or see saw will be used in these classes. Anysize Jumping will have no weaves, tyre, long jump or contact equipment.

Anysize Helter Skelter & Steeplechase have only jumps and pipe tunnels in a course with increasing or

decreasing circles.

Dogs entering Anysize classes may not enter any other classes.

BSDA of GB Agility Challenge (Sponsored by Bernadette King)

Any BSD entered in Classes 58 and 114 will be eligible for the BSDA of GB Agility Challenge.

The points for the BSDA of GB Agility Challenge will be calculated from the results of the above classes.

Trophies will be awarded to the BSD achieving the highest BSD ranking as winner and to the second highest ranking BSD as runner up.

Camping

CAMPING is available for £42 per unit (£37 BSDA of GB members). Entry from 3pm Thursday 26th May. If you arrive early you will not have access to the camping area till 3pm. No arrivals after 9pm without prior arrangement with the Show Manager contact tel no. 07866 490410.

Showers will be available.

- Please only park where directed and leave a minimum space of 20 feet between units.
- Open fires/barbeques are NOT permitted
- All units must carry a fire extinguisher and/or have a bucket of water at the front of the unit at all times.
- There will be no 'joining' of gardens
- Training equipment is not allowed in the camping areas
- No dogs to be left loose in gardens, or tethered to vehicles, whilst unattended.

Helpers

Your help is needed! We are a small team organising this show and we would be very pleased to receive offers of help on the rings especially for Sunday. If you are able to help, please indicate this when entering the show.

If you are a club, training group or a group of friends and would be able to run a ring for us (Including scrimer and ring manager) please complete the relevant section on the entry form. Please give the names of the individuals and the group and how many camping pitches you require. You will receive refreshments, 6 food vouchers and £100.

Individuals: if you help on the ring for at least half a day will receive refreshment and a lunch voucher. Scrimers will receive refreshments, lunch and a £15 refund. Ring managers will receive refreshments, lunch and a £10 refund.

If you could help with set up/take down please email <u>bernadette.king13@gmail.com</u>. Camping will be available on Wednesday and Sunday night.

Helpers will have preferential camping - let us know who you want to camp with – but please do not leave your entry until the last possible moment!

ELIGIBILITY FOR CLASSES

In the following definitions of classes First Prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed Championship Agility, Premier Agility, Open Agility or Limited Agility Shows (i.e. special classes and invitational events excepted). Only a first place with a clear round completed within the course time set by the judge will count towards grade progression.

Standard classes may be scheduled for Agility Shows, as Agility classes or Jumping classes. All standard classes must contain the Weaving Poles obstacle. Standard Agility classes must contain the following elements: "A Ramp", Dog Walk and See-Saw. With this proviso classes are defined as follows:-

A maximum of four standard classes may be scheduled for any dog on an individual day of competition. Any number of special classes may be scheduled.

Class Structure. A Class may either be held as a Graded Class or a Combined Class. A Graded Class may be scheduled for a maximum of three consecutive Grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade. A Combined Class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

Progression. Progression from each Grade will be determined by the eligibility for the class as referenced in H(1)(A)11. Results from Combined Classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade.

To count for progression wins must be gained in standard classes at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows.

Only a first place with a clear round completed within the course time set by the judge will count towards grade progression.

Competitors will be allowed to walk the course set at Small, Medium, Intermediate or Large height without their dog(s) before the class begins.

Points Progression. At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to Grade 4 by winning 100 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme (Regulation K3.c refers). A minimum of 50 points must be gained in agility (not jumping) classes in the relevant grade. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the Show Secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade.

Progression on points must be done prior to the closing date of entries. It is not possible to change a grade on points once the entries have closed.

STANDARD CLASSES

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the two wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

Grade 1

Open to owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a minimum of two first places at Grade 1 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, at least one of which must have been gained in an agility (not jumping) class. N.B Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1 are not eligible for this class.

Grade 2

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 1 and are not eligible for Grades 3, 4, 5, 6, or 7.

Grade 3

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of two first places at Grade 2 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, one of which must have been gained in an agility (not jumping) class, or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 and are not eligible for Grades 2, 4, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 4

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of three first places at Grade 3 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, two of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping classes), or have elected to progress on points from Grade 3 and are not eligible for Grades 2, 3, 5, 6 or 7

Grade 5

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of four first places at Grade 4 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, two of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for Grades 2, 3, 4, 6 or 7

Grade 6

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of four first places at Grade 5 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, two of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for Grades 2, 3, 4, 5 or 7.

Grade 7

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of five first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, three of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for Grades 2, 3, 4, 5 or 6.

SPECIAL CLASSES

Societies may schedule classes other than those defined above as "Special Classes". The eligibility for "Special" classes must be defined by the Society and included in the schedule. The word "Special" must be included in the title of the class. Where special classes are classified for older and/or inexperienced dogs, the height of the hurdles, the A-ramp, and the dog walk, and the length of the long jump, may be reduced below the dimensions specified in these regulations, in which case such dimensions must be included in the class definition in the show schedule.

Marking for special classes may deviate from marking for standard classes, but must be specified in the schedule. Wins, places and clear rounds in special classes will not count towards agility warrant points or grade progression at Kennel Club shows.

Show Rules and Regulations

- Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B, or else registration or transfer of registration must have been applied for. The registration number/ authority to compete (ATC) number will be required for each entry.
- All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete (ATC)
 number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club Registration
 number or an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- 3. Entry Fees: £4.50 per class, £18.00 per team (£3.50 per class for BSDA of GB members).
- 4. There is no prize money in any class.
- 5. Internet entries will be accepted at: www.agilityshows.online
- 6. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 7. Only dogs of 18 calendar months of age and over on the day of competition are eligible for competition at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows.
- 8. A dog must not compete in the same class more than once, including special classes.
- 9. Not For Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
- 10. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
- 11. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the competitions is forbidden.
- 12. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
- 13. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A single flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar ie. not attached by a ring.
- 14. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another iudge.
- 15. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
- 16. Sponsorship: The Kennel Club.
- 17. Detailed rules for Kennel Club Qualifiers are listed within this schedule.
- 18. Kennel Club standard marking regulations apply for all standard classes.
- 19. The hurdle height in Anysize classes will be: 20cm, 30cm & 40cm, if used the A-Frame will be 5ft and the dogwalk 1m.
- 20. The height limit for dogs.
 - a. Large Dog classes For dogs measuring over 500mm at the withers.
 - b. Intermediate Dog classes For dogs measuring over 430mm and measuring 500mm or under at the withers.
 - c. Medium Dog classes For dogs measuring over 350mm and measuring 430mm or under at the withers.
 - d. Small Dog classes For dogs measuring 350mm or under at the withers.
- 21. Judges at an Agility Show may not enter for competition a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the Show at which they are judging. Dogs may be disqualified if proved to have been handled in the class by the scheduled judge's spouse or immediate family, or resident at the same address as the scheduled judge.
- 22. Removal of dogs from Competition:
 - Following discussion between the show management and/or a veterinary surgeon, a dog shall be prevented from competing and/or removed from the Show if it is:-
 - a. A bitch which is in season.
 - b. Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease.
 - c. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
 - d. Of such temperament or is so much out of control as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
 - e. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
 - The circumstances of such a removal shall be recorded in the competition/show Incident Book and submitted to the Kennel Club.
- 23. Dog Agility is a competitive and physically strenuous activity. It is the responsibility of the owner/handler to ensure their dog is 'fit for function' and that they themselves are fit to take part. By signing the entry form you confirm that to the best of your knowledge your dog is fit and able to take part in Agility classes on the day of the show.
- 24. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition, i.e. (2nd May 2022), shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify Agility Aid or the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show (13th May 2022). The dog will then be moved into the appropriate class(es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor will be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
- 25. Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them will be reported to the Kennel Club.
- 26. In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the society will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses. If the show processor has the provisions to do so, competitors will be refunded in the manner in which they had entered the show, but in any event the society will refund fees within 3 months of the show date to all those who had entered and requested a refund within 1 month of the show date.
- 27. Except for mobility aids, nothing shall be carried in the hand while the dog is under test and food shall not be given to a dog whilst in the ring. Competitors are prohibited from wearing bags or leads whilst under test.
- 28. Should the judge deem a re-run is required, any result and/or faults gained in the previous run must be discounted.

- 29. Separate entry forms must be completed by each owner and must be signed by the owner or his authorised agent in accordance with provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied by the appropriate fees.
- 30. Free Passes N/A.
- 31. Competition of Dogs Suffering from Contagious or Infectious Disease No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A11.
- 32. It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order. Competitors must run as close to their running order as possible. Failure to do so may be reported to the Kennel Club.
- 33. Animals in Event No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the Board. However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
- 34. A pay on the day class will be held if time permits.
- 35. A practice ring may be available to dogs entered for competition at the show, if space allows. This ring must be supervised by a responsible adult with agility knowledge.
- 36. Welfare of Dogs An exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars is not permitted at any Agility show licensed by The Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue and within the precincts of the show.
- 37. If you choose to download your ring cards you are agreeing for the information on them to be publicly viewable online.
- 38. The show organisers or their authorised agents may make results from this show publicly available and share results with third parties for the same purpose.
- 39. Training will not be permitted in the ring before, during or after the show.
- 40. Any exhibitor forwarding a cheque which is returned by the bank will be charged an additional £10 to cover bank and administration charges before the entry is accepted.
- 41. Overpaid fees will not be refunded, payment should be made in sterling, post-dated cheques will not be accepted.
- 42. Your attention is drawn to Kennel Club rule F8(A) regarding dog fouling. "Any owner, exhibitor or handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club Licensed Show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including the car and caravan parks and the show approaches".
- 43. All dogs are entered at their owners' risk. Whilst every care will be taken, the BSDA of GB will not accept responsibility for loss, damage or injury to persons, dogs or property.
- 44. Campers must remain within their allocated space and MUST NOT obstruct the roadways. Joining of gardens is not allowed. All units must be equipped with own fire extinguishers and/or bucket of water at the tow bar.
- 45. Training equipment must not be used in the confines of the show, including the camping and parking areas.

NOTE: Children under the age of 11 are the responsibility of a Parent or Guardian and must be supervised at all times including when competing.

DOGS ARE NOT TO BE LEFT LOOSE IN 'GARDEN' AREAS OR TETHERED TO VEHICLES WITHOUT BEING ATTENDED.

DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS - Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

Directions from West:

From M11 Junction 8 roundabout, take the B1256 Dunmow Road (signposted Takeley). At Takeley (Four Ashes), turn right into B183 signposted Hatfield Broad Oak. After approx. 1 mile turn left and then 1/3 mile later take another left (signposted Great Canfield). After about 2 miles Ashfields Carriage & Polo Club will be on your left (Please do not use Cuckoo Lane).

Directions from East:

From Dunmow take the B184 signposted The Rodings, and just after you enter High Roding, turn right into Canfield Road. At the "T" junction turn left and continue on for approx. 2 miles. Ashfields Carriage & Polo Club will be on your right.



International Agility Festival Team Agility Competition (Special) 2022

All events must be judged under the appropriate Kennel Club regulations H & H (1) in force at the time of the event. Competitors entering any competition will be deemed to have agreed to abide by these regulations.

These competitions will be scheduled as a Special combined class for grades 1 to 7 with a separate qualifying competition for each height category.

There will be up to 8 separate heats for large, intermediate, medium and small height dogs at Kennel Club licensed shows throughout the country.

Eligibility

This event is open to teams from Kennel Club Registered and Listed Status clubs which, at the time of entry to the qualifying heat, have indicated in their Kennel Club registration details that they have an interest in agility or are an Agility Listed Status Club. Each team entry will consist of 4 dogs from the same height category, with 4 different handlers, plus up to 2 reserves. Only dogs entered in the team or as reserves at the qualifying event will be permitted to compete for that team in the final should a change of dog be necessary. Only handlers that competed at the qualifying event or those listed as reserves will be permitted to compete for that team in the final should a handler be unable to compete. All team members must be members of the club at the time of qualifying for the International Agility Festival Team Final. Dogs do not have to be entered into any other class at a qualifying heat and a team entry will constitute acceptance of the Organising Club and Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

Clubs may only qualify one team in each height category for the final at the International Agility Festival on Friday 12 August 2022.

Once a handler or dog has run for a Kennel Club Registered / Listed Status Club in the International Agility Festival Team Agility qualifying event they cannot run for another Kennel Club Registered / Listed Status Club in a qualifying event at the same height category during the qualifying year. (Handlers or dogs entered as reserves may run or be entered as reserves for a different team, provided they did not run in the original team's heat).

Competition Rules

The competition will be held under Kennel Club rules and regulations for Agility and any handler entering the competition will be deemed to abide by these rules and regulations. Jumps will be set at the standard height for each height of dog.

This is normally a team relay event involving a baton change between each dogs run. However due to Covid-19 there will be no baton changeover, and the event will be run as 4 individually scored runs following each other. The times and faults of each dogs run will be added together to produce a team score.

An elimination will incur a penalty of one hundred faults.

The total time of the team of four dogs must be recorded for marking purposes irrespective of the number of faults or eliminations that a team incur.

If any of the team members fail to complete the course or any of the team dogs fouls the ring the whole team will be disqualified. Please note that some areas of marking for the International Agility Festival Team event differ from standard marking due to the fact that it is a relay class with cumulative marking and time.

Qualifying

The winners of each heat will be invited to the International Agility Festival final 2022 to compete in the small, medium, intermediate or large height finals. In the event that the winning team or club in a heat has already qualified for the final then the highest placed unqualified team in that heat will be invited to the final at the International Agility Festival.

If a team does not take up the invitation to compete in the final the invitation will be rolled down to the next applicable team from the relevant heat.

Administration

Note to show societies: The Show Secretary should record the top five placed teams and send the results to the Working Dog Activities Team at the Kennel Club within 14 days of the show by email. These results should include the name of the team, name of the Registered / Listed Status club the team represents, team captain's name and address and the handlers, dogs and reserves in the team.
