The First Lesson Genesis 3:8-19 God tells sinful Adam he has lost the life of paradise and his seed will bruise the serpent's head.



The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness, on them has light shone.




**The Third Carol:** No. 221, "Lo, How a Rose E'er Blooming" (stanza 1: choir only)

**The Fifth Lesson**.....Luke 1:26-35, 38 The angel Gabriel salutes the Blessed Virgin Mary.

And the virgin's name was Mary. And he came to her and said, "Greetings, O favored one, the Lord is with you!" But she was greatly troubled at the saying, and tried to discern what sort of greeting this might be. And the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. And the Lord God will give to him the throne of his father David, and he will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end." And Mary said to the angel, "How will this be, since I am a virgin?" Till the spear and rod can be crushed by God,



The Sixth Lesson .....Luke 2:1-7

Luke the Evangelist tells of the birth of Jesus.

In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration when Quirinius was governor of Syria. And all went to be registered, each to his own town. And Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the town of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, to be registered with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child. And while they were there, the time came for her to give birth. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in swaddling cloths and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

The Eighth Lesson......Matthew 2:1-12

The wise men are led by the star to Jesus.
