Sunday, June 2nd is 'Kids Against Hunger' Meal assembly day at Asbury United Methodists Church. All members are encouraged to stay after church and help assemble 4,000 meals for distribution to those in hunger around the world. A potluck meal will be served prior during the 10:00 fellowship time (bring one dish to pass) and meal assembly will begin shortly after. Many hands will make for fun and light work, while also fulfilling the nutritional needs of hungry children and families throughout the world.

Pastor Rob has expressed interest in a Community Garden to be planted just east of the church. Several students from the Northwood-Kensett High School would come on their annual cleanup day on the morning of May 8th to prepare the ground and will be supervised by Pastor Rob.


Women United for Change: 150 Years in Mission


