ART TIDBITS

You've signed up to be a vendor in an art event...now what?

Signing up to be a vendor in an art fair is a big step...congratulations!

Are you ready? Do you know what to bring to the event? Sometimes it's the obvious things we forget to have on hand so we have prepared a little cheat sheet of things you might want to consider before your vendor event. We hope this helps you prepare.

- 1. Your Art
 - a. Plan which pieces you plan to bring to the show. If you are new to the vendor world, it might be beneficial to do a test run of your display so you know exactly which pieces will fit into your display space.
 - b. Consider attaching a sticker or business card to the back of your artwork to remind the buyer exactly which vendor the art was purchased from and encourage them to view your other works on your website.

2. Tablecloth

- a. Most vendor events require that you cover your table with a tablecloth that extends to the floor. You can use whatever color you want, but black tablecloths are pretty standard as they don't show marks and dirt as easily as some other colors might. These are fairly inexpensive and easily obtainable on Amazon. For a 6-foot table, you will need a rectangle tablecloth approximately 90 x 132 inches.
- 3. Table

a. Find out if you are expected to bring your table, or if the organizer of the event will provide tables. If the vendor is providing the tables, verify the size of the table. It is fairly standard to use 6 ft tables, but you will need to verify this with your event organizer. If you must bring your own table, they are fairly cheap and easily available from Amazon, Walmart, Target, Costco, etc.

4. Price Stickers

a. Art that is clearly marked with a price will sell easier than unmarked pieces. Don't force people to ask the price as they may be too shy and never ask. Clearly marked prices give customers confidence that the price charged is the same price no matter who is purchasing your art. You can purchase small, quarter-sized round price stickers next to your piece. Be careful about attaching price stickers directly to your work or the frame as they can be difficult to remove, and it has the potential to cause damage to your art or the frame. (I learned this the hard way.)

5. A Method to Display Your Art

a. Vendor events do not allow you to hang your art in the venue so you must decide how you want to display your art. Options for displaying your work include table easels (for small works), floor easels for larger works, or a wire grid panel with T-based floor stand from which you can hang your art.

6. Business Cards

a. It is recommended to have business cards available for customers to take. Even if they didn't make a purchase today, they could contact you in the future about a piece they saw or to arrange for a commission.

7. A Method to Receive Payment

- a. Determine the types of payments you will accept; cash, credit card, checks, Venmo, Zelle, etc.
- b. Bring enough cash along with you to make change for those cash buyers but be sure to have a method to keep your cash box out of sight and secure.
- c. If you are accepting credit card payments, obtain a free Square reader (or other vendor device) to process your credit card sales. Be sure to setup your card reader app prior to the show with the products you will be selling, setup the tax rate on the card reader so it automatically charges the appropriate sales tax (7% in Collier County), and practice running a few transactions through and reversing them to become comfortable using the device prior to the vendor event.

8. Determine How to Package Purchases

a. Help your customers keep their purchase safe until they get it home. Provide a plastic slip, gift bag, or box to package their purchase. For larger pieces, consider using shirk wrap to package the piece so it is not damaged while the customer transports their purchase. I always like to add a sticker with my business name on my packaging, so they remember which artist they purchase the piece from. Make it easy for them to reach you in the future for additional purchases.

9. Optional Supplies

- a. Scissors
- b. Tape: Both Scotch tape and duct tape can come in handy
- c. Signage for your booth to identify you to your customers and/or collectors.
- d. Paper and pencil: Be prepared to write down specifics for commission orders
- e. Clipboard and form to capture customer names and emails (if not captured on your card reader device). This makes it easy for you to follow up the sale with a thank you after the show.
