

#### **GAE Review**







# GAE TA Pays



- GAE TA pays up to:
  - -\$250/semester hour
    - Only pays for Tuition
  - -16 hours/fiscal year (1 Oct 30 Sep)
    - 5 Courses per fiscal year
  - 130 hours for undergraduate study
  - -39 hours for graduate study



## GAE TA Does NOT Pay



- GAE does NOT pay for:
  - -Books
  - -Lab fees
  - -Other School Fees.



## GAE TA Does NOT Pay



- GAE does NOT pay for:
  - -First professional degrees
  - -Doctoral programs
  - **–Lower and Lateral degrees**



# GAE Eligibility



- All "Active" duty Soldiers
  - -AGR
  - -Drilling National Guard Soldiers (M-Day)



## GAE NOT Eligible



- The following are **NOT** eligible for GAE TA
  - -ROTC Scholarship Students
  - -Soldiers that are FLAGGED
  - -Individual Ready Reserve (IRR)
  - -Inactive National Guard (ING)



## **GAE** Time Conditions



 Must have at least one (1) year of service after Advanced Individual Training (AIT) or Basic Officer Leaders Course (BOLC)

- Must have completed 10 years of service prior to working on a MASTERS Degree.
  - -If TA was used to pay for any portion of the undergraduate degree



## GAE Recoupment



- If the Soldier withdraws from classes because of personal reasons.
- Receives a GRADE of "D or F" for undergraduate courses
- Receives a GRADE of "C, D or F" for graduate courses





- Duplication of Benefits may be an issue.
  - -DVA Regulations
  - -DoD Regulations
  - -Military Branch specific regulations





• Recent change: You may use both FTA and Chp 1606/1607 benefits during the same semester as long as they are not for the SAME COURSE.





 Due to the complexities of this situation, we HIGHLY RECOMMEND you contact your School VA Rep to discuss your options and verify your MGIB entitlement and enrollment status prior to making this important decision.





- Solution
  - -There is no ONE answer fits all

-Counselors must sit down with each individual Soldier and develop a Course of Action that is best for that Soldier.

- No CAC!!
- GoArmyEd.com is now the Army wide source for TA
  - 1. Establish a login password.

2. Go through the VIA process.

3. Upload a copy of the statement of understanding (SOU).





#### 4. Register for classes at school

- 5. Upload your degree plan,
  - Go to Degree Works
  - Shows the Past, Present, and Future Classes (Christmas Carol)





#### 6. Upload your class schedule

- Detailed Class Schedule showing
- Course Name, Course Code, Course ID and Number of Credits
- (English, ENGL, 203, 3SH's)
- Start and End dates of the Course





- 7. Upload your cost statement.
  - Account Summary by Term

#### 8. Request TA in GoArmyEd.com





9. After 6 semester hours you must upload a Course Planner before any more classes can be approved.

• Mirror the Course Planner to the Degree Plan





• Recent change: All courses for which FTA funds are being requested must be APPROVED by the state FTA manager BEFORE the 1st day of class or you get NOTHING.





 This means you must have an uploaded and approved SOU, degree plan, course planner, and detailed TA request for each class. This is not a one-day process. You can't wait to do it until the week before class starts!





• All requests for approving a <u>degree</u> <u>plan</u>, <u>course planner</u>, or <u>tuition</u> <u>assistance request</u> will be processed on a <u>first-in</u>, <u>first-out</u> basis.





• Keep your E-mail address and other account information in GAE up to date. (Note: AKO died on 31MAR15).

• Requests should be submitted <u>at least</u> 10 days before the start date to allow time for processing.





• But please submit as far out as possible (NET 60 days ahead).

• e.g., If your class starts in May 2016, you should be registering in March 2016 in GoArmyEd.

# Why VIA?




 Over 64,000 new Soldiers request "TA – eligible" access in GoArmyEd each year and 68,000 additional Soldiers request home school and/or degree plan changes.

 Research supports hypothesis that students with clear career goals have higher degree completion rates.





#### **VIA Summary:**

- VIA launched in GoArmyEd on 12 December 2015
- VIA is a decision support tool that helps Soldiers
  - research and choose a long-term civilian career goal,
  - a degree that prepares them for their career goal and
  - a "best fit/best value" school

  - -requesting a GAE Account








### VIA Overview



Soldier can complete VIA in multiple sittings. VIA saves progress so that Soldier can continue where he/she last left off or make revisions.





# VIA Summary



• VIA makes career recommendations based on Soldier's interests, values, salary goals, and other preferences.

• Job growth nationally and in the part of the country they may wish to work as a civilian.



# VIA Summary



• VIA recommends degree options that best prepare the Soldier for his or her selected career goal and that are offered online or in a classroom within 50 miles of the Soldier.

• When a Soldier compares degrees he/she can learn more about the degree and number of courses required to complete the degree.



# VIA Summary




• VIA recommends schools that offer the Soldier's selected degree and sorts them in order based on cost and outcome factors.



### VIA Overview: School (cont.)



Soldiers can compare schools based on modality of degree offered, cost, admissions criteria, and success outcomes of other Students generally and **Soldiers** specifically that attended the school.





#### VIA Overview (cont.)



Soldier's final review of his/her career goal, degree, and school choices before submission to an Army Education Counselor for approval.









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## "CIP" Code



What is a "CIP" Code?

-The Classification of Instructional Programs (CIP) provides a taxonomic scheme that supports the accurate tracking and reporting of fields of study and program completions activity.

#### Transfer of Education Benefits





The transfer of education benefits (TEB) was designed as a retention tool by DoD. It is separate from simply earning Ch 33 benefits.





- Beginning 1 Aug 2012, SM were allowed to execute a TEB agreement.
  - -Must be completed while still in service.
  - -Incurs a 4-year service obligation
  - -Service obligation is waived for involuntary separation (e.g., medical, force reduction, age 60).





#### **Total military service**

• 1-5 years

• 6 - < 10 years

• 10 years or more

#### Eligible for transfer

No one

• Spouse and child; child must wait until year 10 to use.

• Spouse and child; both can use immediately.





### OJT and Apprenticeship



OJT and Apprenticeship

• GI Bill can be used to pay a stipend to the SM while participating in on-the-job training (OJT), apprenticeship, or registered apprenticeship (RA) with participating civilian companies.



### OJT and Apprenticeship



- The Technical College System of Georgia (TCSG) has degrees for many apprenticeship programs.

- RA certificates are nationally recognized and provide the recipient with a significant boost in earnings potential.



### APPRENTICESHIP



- What is Registered Apprenticeship?
  - A unique employer-sponsored education and training program
  - Annual requirements: 2,000 on-the-job training hours (full-time) and 144 hours of related classroom instruction
  - Supervision is provided by a journey-level craft person or trade professional



### APPRENTICESHIP



- Programs generally last from two to five years
- Nationally-recognized credential issued upon completion
- Nearly 16,000 employers sponsor over 20,000 programs
- -450,000 apprentices currently employed in the U.S.
- Veterans can earn full-time apprentice wages <u>and</u> collect monthly GI Bill benefits for the duration of their apprentice training period!

 COOL (Credentialing Opportunities On-Line) helps Army Service members find information on certifications and licenses related to their jobs.





- Use COOL to get background information on credentialing and find detailed information on:
  - Credentials related to an Army Military Occupational Specialty (MOS)
  - Credential requirements and potential gaps between Army training and civilian credentialing requirements

 Resources available to fill gaps between military training and civilian credentialing requirements





• Learn how experience in the Army could speed up getting a promotion or landing a civilian job. Military Occupational Specialties are mapped to civilian credentials, and Service members can learn how to obtain these credentials and plot out their careers.
