While it may seem dark and gloomy now, Spring is coming and along with that Easter, lilies, song birds, the smell of fresh cut grass and of course – baseball. People always ask me why I live in Iowa and my response is always the same: I love the seasons and I love the people. I have lived in other places and they were fun for a while but it wasn't lowa. I remember the first Christmas I spent in Southern California, I went for a run that morning in shorts and a tank-top, we had the screen door open to the house and people decorated their houses but without snow on the ground it just seemed artificial.

When we lived in Idaho, we had all four seasons and it was a very beautiful area but the people were not very friendly. There was an independent spirit that was only concerned with themselves and their family – not of others. Understand that this is a generalization and I met many nice and wonderful people in both places but not like lowans. Growing up in lowa, I spent everyday in the summer playing baseball, going fishing, riding my bike, anything outdoors with my friends and went home when it was time for supper. My parents didn't have to worry about me, we had no cell phones, tablets, or computers - you actually went over to your friends' house and knocked on the door to see if they were home.

Kids today will never know the struggles I had growing up like: having to get up to turn the channel on the television and only having the option between 3 or 4 channels. Having to use a rotary phone and if you messed up on the 8th number - having to hang up and start again. Listening to the radio for hours until they played your favorite song so you could record it on your cassette player. The hours spent creating that special mix-tape to give to your sweetheart on Valentine's Day. The struggle is real!

Youth of today have their own set of struggles and they are far greater than the struggles I dealt with at their age. Violence, bullying in ways that are worse than when I was a teenager, pressures to succeed, to be accepted, and for their own personal safety. Even the lowa that I know and love is not immune from these problems. What is the answer? For me it is always the church – not the building but the people. If we are the church, then we need to be the church. As the church we need to stand up when there are injustices in our communities, speak out against violence, and embrace those who have been hurt with love and acceptance. Pray for our schools, our teachers and students. Pray for our leaders and those who are called upon when there is violence and abuse. Pray for us as the Body of Christ to be the hands and feet of Jesus.

I am looking forward to Easter and Confirmation Sunday, as it is a time to honor our young people and to show them the hope of Jesus. Plan to join us on those Sundays and may the peace of God, the love of the Son, and the joy of the Spirit be with you now and always. Amen.

**Mission Kits:** For the month of April, I'd like to focus on Hygiene Kits. The list of items is below. Since we assemble the kits at the Church, don't feel that you need to provide complete kits. If you see an item on sale, feel free to purchase a number of that item.

## **Hygiene Kit:**

- 1 new hand towel (15"x25" up to 17"x27")
- 1 new washcloth
- 1 large, sturdy comb (at least 6 inches of teeth)
- 1 toenail or fingernail clipper no emery boards or metal nail files
- 1 bath-sized bar of soap in wrapper (3 oz. bar or larger); No Ivory or Jergens
- 1 new adult size toothbrush in original sealed wrapper
- 10 adhesive bandages (3/4" by 3") common household bandages acceptable
- 1 one-gallon size re-sealable bag



**Hygiene Kits** help disaster victims reclaim their dignity and self-respect. When people can maintain personal hygiene, their overall health improves.

As our Church's representative for the **Share Shop** board, I'm always looking for volunteers to work our Church's shift, which is on the second Thursday of each month from 1:00 to 4:00 p.m. We need to provide two workers for each shift. The Share Shop provides a wonderful and necessary service to folks who struggle financially. There they can find nice, clean clothing, shoes, toys, books, and household items such as dishes, utensils, blankets and nick knacks. The job usually entails taking in donations, putting clothing on hangers and "filing" them in the correct size rack.

The sign-up sheet is on a clipboard on the table outside of the office. Spending an afternoon at the Share Shop is always rewarding!

Customers at the Share Shop can leave a donation in the box if they are able, but are not required to do so.

The Coins for Missions offering, that we collect each week, now goes to the Share Shop to help with expenses.

Every second Saturday in May letter carriers in more than 10,000 cities and towns across America deliver much more than mail when they walk and drive along their postal routes. They also collect the goodness and compassion of their postal customers who participate in the Stamp Out Hunger National Food Drive – the largest one-day food drive in the nation and probably the world.

Once again, this year city and rural postal customers in the Lake Mills area will be given the opportunity to contribute food items to the LM Food Shelf. The Food Shelf serves over 35 households per week. Last year LM postal customers contributed over 1600 pounds of food. All postal customers need do is to place a sack of non-perishable food items next to their mailbox before their letter carrier delivers mail on Saturday May 11th. The carrier, along with help from the LM Boy Scouts, will do all the rest. The food is val taken back to a postal station, sorted, and then delivered to the LM Food Shelf. There it

is available for area families.

Food items that are always needed are: Baked or Pork n' beans, vegetables, beef stew, chili, spam, tuna, hamburger helper, peaches, pears, pasta noodles, rice, peanut butter, cold cereal and paper products. Of course, we will accept all donations. However, please check that food items have not reached their expiration date or have not been previously opened.


